

## HEARINGS.

## Elsmere Place, Opening, from Crotona Parkway to Daly Avenue.

Petition of Frederic J. Middlebrook, dated October 25, last, was read. An examination showed that Elsmere place was not shown on the final maps, from Crotona parkway to Daly avenue, and the petition was consequently denied.

## Elsmere Place, Opening, between Marmion Avenue and Southern Boulevard.

Laid over on motion of Councilman Murray.

## Barry Street, Regulating and Grading, from Lafayette Avenue to Longwood Avenue.

Petition of James Nugent and others, dated October 30, last, was read, and, on motion of Councilman Murray, it was

Resolved, That the Local Board, Twenty-first District, hereby recommends to the Board of Public Improvements that Barry street be regulated and graded, curbstones set, sidewalks flagged, crosswalks laid and fences erected where necessary, from Lafayette avenue to Longwood avenue, and that a copy of this resolution be transmitted forthwith to the said Board of Public Improvements.

Resolved, That the Local Board, Twenty-first District, hereby recommends to the Board of Public Improvements that a sewer and appurtenances be constructed in East One Hundred and Seventy-fifth street, from Southern Boulevard to the summit west of Marmion avenue, and in Crotona Park, North, from East One Hundred and Seventy-fifth street to summit west of Marmion avenue, and that a copy of this resolution be transmitted forthwith to the said Board of Public Improvements.

*Brook Avenue, Asphalt-block Paving, from the Intersection of Webster Avenue to Wendover Avenue.*

Petition of N. Guidero and others was read. A question was raised as to the number of signatures on the petition, and the matter was laid over until November 23 next.

Mr. JOHN H. MOONEY, Secretary, Board of Public Improvements:

SIR—In reply to the communication of Mr. Charles A. Mapes, City Surveyor, dated August 31, 1899, recommending that Hewitt place be made 60 feet wide, and submitting plans, showing the modifications necessary, I would say:

Hewitt place is shown on section 3 of the Final Maps and Profiles of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards of the Borough of The Bronx, filed in the Register's Office January 19, 1894.

There is a deficiency in the total distance of Leggett avenue and Craven street, from Prospect avenue to Southern Boulevard, which is apparent in the width of Hewitt place, i. e., 0.3 feet. The monument at the northwest corner of Hewitt place has been set the correct distance from Prospect avenue, and the monument at the northeast corner of Craven street and Hewitt place has been set at the correct distance from the Southern Boulevard, thereby throwing the deficiency into the width of Hewitt place.

The fixtures of the streets and avenues to the east of Hewitt place cannot be altered without doing material damage to all improvements on them. Both monuments at the east and west corners of Hewitt place have been used to lay out lots and buildings, it is therefore evident that to distribute the error is impracticable. This leaves only two ways open to correct the error:

1. To make the lines of Hewitt place convergent.  
2. To put the error into the block to the east of Hewitt place, making the block distance 199.7 feet instead of 200 feet.

Should the width of Hewitt place be changed it would necessitate a new proceeding for the opening of Hewitt place and the filing of a map showing a change of street system; but in the case of changing the block distance only a change of street system must be filed.

There being no houses on the east side of Hewitt place nor any building on the northeast corner of Craven street and Hewitt place, and in consideration of the above statement, I recommend that Hewitt place be made 60 feet wide at its intersection with Leggett avenue, and that the block distance to the east on Craven street be changed, and recommend the approval of a map or plan, showing the proposed changes, and have prepared the accompanying map or plan, and technical description, for the consideration of the Board of Public Improvements, and for a public hearing.

DEAR SIR—The accompanying map shows a correct survey of Hewitt place in its relation with Prospect avenue and Dawson street, in the Borough of The Bronx, and owing to a slight error I would suggest that the block distance on the north side of Crane (or One Hundred and Fifty-sixth) street, between Dawson street and Hewitt place, be shortened in accordance with map herewith inclosed, in order that Hewitt place may remain sixty feet wide as shown on maps now on file in your Department.

The shortening of the block can easily be accomplished, because of the fact that a lane runs diagonally across the block affected, as shown on said map, and this is the only way the discrepancy in your maps can be wiped out.

Mr. L. S. Van Zandt, of No. 2683 Creston avenue; Mr. George Armstrong, agent, No. 2771 Bainbridge avenue, and Mr. Amos Woodruff, of Kirkside avenue near Kingsbridge road, called on President and urged the above work, and it was recommended to the Board of Public Improvements.

Petition of Alonzo Carr and others, dated September 16, 1899, was resubmitted to the Local Board, Twenty-first District.

Hon. LOUIS F. HAFEN, President, and Chairman Board of Local Improvements, Borough of The Bronx:

DEAR SIR—As a Supreme Court injunction order absolute, granted in the action of Burnett et al. against The City of New York et al., is in full force, whereby everybody is restrained from interfering with the navigation of the "Mott Haven Canal," as it now exists, and an appeal from the order of June 13, 1899, appointing commissioners to acquire title, etc., for the opening and extending of "Canal Place," so called, involving the validity of said "appointment," is now pending in the Appellate Division, First Department (copies of which papers are herewith served upon you), it would seem wise and safer, as well as eminently proper, to postpone, if not abandon, any steps, or even recommendations, looking to the closing of the "Mott Haven Canal," by opening a "first-class" pocket street, as contemplated, over and along a portion of said public waterway.

Permit me in this connection to call your attention to the fact that the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court, this Department, has recently upheld and affirmed an order of said Court, at Special Term, declaring in contempt and inflicting punishment upon certain members of the Municipal Assembly for reckless disregard of a similar order of the Court to the one in the Burnett case, above named.

The Rev. Joseph Reynolds, of No. 378 Alexander avenue, urged the recommendation of the petition as one in the interest of the health of the community and as a benefit otherwise. He was questioned by Councilman Murray as to the odors arising from the canal and as to who the complainants were. The Rev. Mr. Reynolds referred Mr. Murray to the Secretary of the Mott Haven Improvement Association.

Councilman Wm. C. Beecher urged the granting of the petition. Councilman Hottenroth thought, that in view of the fact that an appeal had been taken from the order of the court appointing the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment for acquiring title to Canal place, that it would perhaps be well to delay action.

President Haffen remarked that no order of a court had been served upon him or any member of the Board, and that consequently the Board was free to take action. He said that he was of the opinion that the matter should be disposed of as far as the Local Board was concerned.

Councilman Hottenroth said he favored the petition but he wished to act in a manner that would not be indiscreet. Mr. L. A. Marks, speaking for the petition, said that 350 persons and 30 out of 31 physicians had signed in favor of the abolition of the nuisance of the canal, and that the reason the one physician did not declare himself in favor of closing it at this point was because the nuisance as it existed was good for his business.

Among others who favored the petition were: S. H. Burgoyne, Matthew Anderson and Albert E. Davis.

Alderman McGrath announced that a large property-owner had urged upon him the abatement of the nuisance. He added that he wished to be placed on record in favor of recommending the petition at once.

Councilman Murray expressed the opinion that while it was true that no order had been served upon any member of the Board, enjoining him from taking action, that it was a matter of notoriety that legal proceedings were pending with a view of preventing the canal from being filled in. He said he believed the matter should be laid over.

President Haffen stated that he wished to be recorded as emphatically in favor of the petition, as in his mind there had been delay enough.

Finally Councilman Hottenroth said he would agree to the regular form of resolution with an amendment consisting of the following words: "provided title has vested and the work can be legally done."

Thereupon, on motion of Alderman McGrath, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That, on petition of Alonzo Carr and about fifty others, duly advertised, and resubmitted the 16th day of November, 1899, the Local Board, Twenty-first District, hereby recommends to the Board of Public Improvements that Canal place be regulated and graded, curbstones set, sidewalks flagged a space four feet wide, crosswalks laid and fences erected where necessary, between the north line of One Hundred and Thirty-eighth street and the south line of One Hundred and Forty-fourth street, Borough of The Bronx, provided title has vested and the work can be legally done, and that a copy of this resolution be transmitted forthwith to the said Board of Public Improvements.

Alderman Geiger, to whom this matter was referred, reported that the property-owners, as far as he ascertained, were not in favor of constructing the bridge in question or of having anything done at the point unless the railroad company agree to bear the cost, and he submitted the following, which was adopted:

Resolved, That the Local Board, Twenty-first District, does not recommend the construction of the proposed bridge across the New York and Harlem Railroad Company's tracks at Two Hundred and Tenth street, or any bridge unless the City authorities are satisfied that the entire cost thereof shall be borne by said New York and Harlem Railroad Company.

Laid over for Executive Session.

Rockwood street, acquiring title, from Walton avenue to the Grand Boulevard and Concourse. Public place, bounded by One Hundred and Eighty-third street, Crescent avenue, Arthur avenue, etc.

Broadway, Sewer.

Mr. O. G. Angle appeared on behalf of the North Side Board of Trade urging delay, as an alternative proposition had been made which he claimed should receive consideration. Mr. Charles B. Meyer, as one of the interested property-owners, advocated the construction of the sewer as recommended by the Local Board on April 21, 1898. The fact was announced that a hearing would be had on the same subject before the Commissioner of Sewers on the 17th instant, and it was decided to allow the matter to be decided by him so far as the question presented to the Local Board was concerned.

*Public Dock lying between Third Avenue and Lincoln Avenue, and from the South Side of the Land for the Proposed Southern Boulevard Approach to the New Third Avenue Bridge to the Bulkhead Line of the Harlem River.*

President Haffen informed the Board that at a meeting of the Board of Public Improvements, held on the 15th instant, the following preamble and resolution were adopted. This preamble and resolution were endorsed by the Local Board and the Secretary was directed to so inform the Board of Public Improvements, the Department of Docks and Ferries, and the Mayor.

Whereas, There are no public docks in the Twenty-third Ward, Borough of The Bronx, New York City, and

Whereas, The Department of Docks and Ferries has been requested by the Local Boards, Borough of The Bronx, to initiate proceedings and acquire title for public dock purposes to the lands lying between Third Avenue and Lincoln Avenue, and from the south side of the land for the proposed Southern Boulevard approach to the new Third Avenue bridge to the bulkhead line of the Harlem River in the Twenty-third Ward, Borough of The Bronx, New York City.

That, in pursuance of sections 413 and 422 of the Greater New York Charter, the following resolution of the Board of Public Improvements, adopted by that Board on the 7th day of June, 1899, be and the same hereby is approved, and the public work or improvement therein provided for is hereby authorized, and it is hereby determined that the cost and expense thereof shall be borne and paid as therein provided; namely,

Resolved, by the Board of Public Improvements, That, in pursuance of sections 413 and 422 of the Greater New York Charter, the regulating and grading of Fifty-seventh street, from Eleventh avenue to Twelfth avenue, in the Borough of Manhattan, and the setting and resetting of curbstones and the flagging and reflagging of sidewalks, where necessary, under the direction of the Commissioner of Highways, be and the same hereby is authorized and approved, there having been presented to said Board an estimate in writing, in such detail as the said Board has directed, of the cost of the proposed work or improvement, and a statement of the assessed value, according to the last preceding tax-roll, of the real estate included within the probable area of assessment, the estimated cost of said work being five thousand dollars. The said assessed value of the real estate included within the probable area of assessment is two hundred and ten thousand dollars.

And the said Board does hereby determine that no portion of the cost and expense thereof shall be borne and paid by The City of New York, but the whole of such cost and expense shall be assessed upon the property deemed to be benefited thereby.
