##### MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS.

(G. O. 585.)

By Alderman Wells—

Resolved, That Westchester avenue, between the easterly curb-line of Prospect avenue and the westerly curb-line of the Southern Boulevard, be regulated and graded upon the established lines and grades, under the direction of the Commissioners of the Department of Public Parks; and that the accompanying ordinance therefor be adopted.

##### REPORTS.

(G. O. 588.)

The Committee on Law Department, to whom was referred the resolution to amend sections 321 and 322 of article 35 of chapter 8 of the Revised Ordinances of 1880,

##### REPORT :

That said sections 321 and 322, together with the preceding section 320, were repealed by resolution of the Common Council of the year 1882, as appears in its proceedings of that year, at page 255. Your Committee agree with the expediency of their repeal; but are, nevertheless, of the opinion that the object is attainable for which they were ineffectually designed. That object was, among others, the removal of ice, snow, or frozen hail, and rain from the sidewalks in front of unoccupied houses, buildings, or lots of land in the City of New York. It is not desirable that this object should be abandoned. Your Committee, therefore, deeming it of use to act concurrently with the police, submitted the resolution referred to them, to the Commissioners of that Department, for information. In accordance with their opinion, that section 319 is impossible of execution, and mainly in agreement with them, as to the two new sections proposed in the place of those heretofore repealed, your Committee respectfully report to your Honorable Body the following resolutions and recommend their adoption :

Resolved, That section 319 of article 35 of chapter 8 of the Revised Ordinances of 1880, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Resolved, That in place of sections 321 and 322 of article 35 of chapter 8 of the Revised Ordinances of 1880, heretofore repealed, the following sections be and are hereby substituted :

Section 321. In case the owner or person having charge of any unoccupied house, lot, building or land, shall neglect to comply with any of the provisions, relative to him, of sections 317 and 318 of this article, any person being a resident of the judicial district of the city, within which each house, lot, building or land shall be situate, may make complaint in writing, under oath, before the justice of such district of the facts constituting such neglect; whereupon the said justice shall issue a summons in due form of law in the name of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty of the City of New York, to such owner or person having charge of said house, lot, building or land, and shall in due course of law proceed to hear and determine the matter charged against such owner or person having charge as aforesaid.

Section 322. The owner or person having charge of any such house, lot, building or land, shall, on proof of the offence alleged against him, be liable to a penalty of \$30 for each offence and the additional penalty for every days continuance of said offence, after the first day thereof, of \$10, the one-half of which said penalties shall go to the person on whose complaint the summons was issued, and the other one-half be paid to the credit of the Police Pension Fund, and the said justice is hereby required immediately, and without payment of fees, upon judgment entered, to file a transcript thereof with the Clerk of the County in the County Clerk's office, whose duty it shall be thereupon to receive and file the same in his office as of the date when received, and to docket the judgment of the same date and to keep an index thereof, without fees, which judgment thereupon shall be deemed a judgment of the Court of Common Pleas and accordingly enforced, and shall be of like effect as provided in section 1302 of chapter 410 of the Laws of 1882, being the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882, and shall be especially a lien on any such house, lot, building or land, in respect to which the owner or person having charge of the same shall be adjudged in default as above provided, to be removed and discharged in manner provided by law.

By Alderman Foley—

NEW YORK CITY, December 21, 1883.

To the Honorable the Board of Aldermen of the City of New York :

Permission is requested by John H. Martin, office 171 Broadway, room 24, City of New York, that he may be permitted to use portable steam-boilers in the streets and public parks of this city, for the purpose of generating steam; said steam to be used in cleaning the streets and sidewalks from ice and snow. By his process ice and snow can be quickly and economically removed without any delay or obstruction to travel or traffic, obviating entirely the use of axes, shovels, crowbars—now in common use. By his process, Broadway, from the Battery to Canal street, could be readily freed from snow and ice in a very few hours.

Which was referred to the Committee on Street Cleaning.

By the same—

Whereas, In positive violation of the ordinances of the city many of the surface railway companies are renewing the very reprehensible and dangerous practice of sprinkling salt in the streets, for the purpose of melting snow and ice; and

Whereas, This defiance of the corporate authorities evinces such a flagrant disregard of the rights of our citizens, and is so disastrous to their lives and property, that the most extreme measures are justifiable in order to put an effective stop to the evil; and

Whereas, The permission given to the several railroad companies by the resolution approved December 24, 1875, "to sprinkle clean sand, unmixed with salt or any other substance, upon the pavement, between the rails, when necessary in order to secure better and more secure footing for their horses, between the first day of November and the first day of April, upon receiving such permit from his Honor the Mayor," and a like permission given to the several stage companies, by resolution approved January 14, 1876, is taken undue advantage of and the stipulations therein contained wilfully violated, particularly by the several railroad companies, as it is clear from the present



condition of the streets that salt has been sprinkled therein; in fact that salt has been surreptitiously mixed and used with the sand thrown upon the streets by the several railroad companies; be it therefore

Resolved, That the resolution approved December 24, 1875, authorizing the several railroad companies to sprinkle clean sand, unimixed with salt, on the pavements of our streets, and the resolution approved January 14, 1876, giving a like privilege to the several proprietors of stages, be and they are hereby respectively annulled, rescinded and repealed; and be it further

Resolved, That section 316 of article XXXIV of chapter 8 of the Revised Ordinances of 1880, be and is hereby amended, by striking therefrom the last clause, which is as follows: "provided that permission to throw salt on switches and turn outs, or railway tracks be first obtained from his Honor the Mayor," and inserting in lieu thereof, the following: "and every person violating any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and a conviction thereof, before any Police Justice, shall subject every such person, or the officers of the company or corporation by whom he may be employed, or in whose service he may be acting, to the penalty therein prescribed, one-half of the penalty imposed to be paid and applied to the use of the person or persons who shall be complainant or complainants in each case, and who shall give such information as will secure the conviction of the offender or offenders."

Alderman Foley moved the adoption of the preamble and resolution.

Alderman Kirk moved that the paper be laid over.

Alderman Edward Duffy moved to refer to the Committee on Street Cleaning.

The President put the question whether the Board would agree with said motion.

Which was decided in the negative.

The President then put the question whether the Board would agree with the motion of Alderman Kirk.

Which was decided in the affirmative by the following vote, on a division called by Alderman E. Duffy, viz.:

Affirmative—Aldermen Cochrane, De Lacy, E. Duffy, Finck, Grant, Kirk, O'Connor, O'Neil, Rinckhoff, Sheehy, and Wells—11.

#### MESSAGES FROM HIS HONOR THE MAYOR.

The President laid before the Board the following message from his Honor the Mayor:

MAYOR'S OFFICE, NEW YORK, December 21, 1883.

To the Honorable the Board of Aldermen:

I return, without my approval, the resolution of the Board of Aldermen, adopted December 11, 1883, that a 12-inch water-main be laid across and through Seventeenth street, on the south side, or plaza, to connect with the mains on Fourth avenue on the east, and Broadway on the west, and that three double hydrants be erected on the Park walk facing the plaza connecting with the said Croton-main.

I would respectfully refer your Honorable Body to the various reports of the Commissioner of Public Works in which he sets forth the great necessity for economy in the use of water until the City can secure an increased supply. From the report of the Commissioner on this resolution, I learn that there is already a 6-inch water-pipe on the north side of Seventeenth street, between Broadway and Fourth avenue, and that the locality is well supplied with hydrants; therefore, while it would be a desirable thing to have the 12-inch main as contemplated in this resolution, the necessity for laying pipes in new localities in order to supply water for domestic and manufacturing purposes is so great that I am unwilling at present to approve any demand upon the water supply of the City which can possibly be avoided.

Resolved, That the Commissioner of Public Works be authorized and is hereby directed to have a 12-inch water-main laid across and through Seventeenth street, on the south side or plaza, to connect with the mains on Fourth avenue on the east and Broadway on the west, and that three double hydrants be erected on the park walk facing the plaza, connecting with the said Croton-main.

Which was laid over, ordered to be printed in the minutes and published in full in the CITY RECORD.

The President laid before the Board the following message from his Honor the Mayor:

MAYOR'S OFFICE, NEW YORK, December 21, 1883.

To the Honorable the Board of Aldermen:

I return, without my approval, the resolution of the Board of Aldermen, adopted December 11, 1883, permitting John B. Haskins to regulate, set curb and gutter stones, and flag the sidewalk a space four feet in width through the centre thereof, in front of his property, on New avenue, between Eighth and Ninth avenues, commencing at the southwest corner of One Hundred and Forty-fifth street and running southerly one hundred feet.

And also that permission is hereby given to the executors of the estate of George H. Peck to regulate, set curb and gutter stones, and flag the sidewalk a space four feet in width through the centre thereof, in front of said estate property, on New avenue, immediately opposite the property of John B. Haskins, on the north side of said avenue, and running northerly one hundred feet.

There is no objection, so far as I am aware, to the work contemplated in this resolution; inasmuch, however, as there are two "New avenues" between Eighth and Ninth avenues, it would seem to me only proper to make the terms of the resolution so specific that no mistake could occur.

And, also, that permission be and the same is hereby given to the executors of the estate of George H. Peck to regulate, set curb and gutter stones, and flag the sidewalk a space four feet in width through the centre thereof, in front of said estate's property on New avenue, immediately opposite the property of John B. Haskins, on the north side of said avenue, and running northerly 100 feet, the work to be done at his own expense, under the direction of the Commissioner of Public Works.

Which was laid over, ordered to be printed in the minutes and published in full in the CITY RECORD.

The President laid before the Board the following message from his Honor the Mayor:

MAYOR'S OFFICE, NEW YORK, December 21, 1883.

To the Honorable the Board of Aldermen:

I return, without my approval, the resolution of the Board of Aldermen, adopted December 11, 1883, that lamp-posts be erected and street-lamps lighted in Ninety-seventh and Ninety-eighth streets, between Second and Third avenues, under the direction of the Commissioner of Public Works.

I am informed that Ninety-seventh street, from Second to Third avenue, has been lighted since the 15th of May, 1883, so that the resolution so far as it relates to this street is a duplication. A resolution to light Ninety-eighth street, between the Second and Third avenues, would meet my approval.

I return, without my approval, the resolution of the Board of Aldermen, adopted December 21, 1883, that One Hundred and Third street, from Ninth avenue to the Riverside Drive, be regulated, graded, curbed, and flagged a space four feet wide, where not already done.

I am informed that the work of regulating and grading One Hundred and Third street, between Tenth avenue and Riverside Drive, is already under contract. As this resolution covers that part of the street again, it would seem to be inaccurately drawn.

To the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund:

GENTLEMEN—The applications of the officers of the Eighth and Twelfth Regiments, N. G. S. N. Y., for new armories and drill-rooms, referred to me at the last meeting of the Board, have been duly considered, and I respectfully submit the following

### REPORT:

The applications presented by the officers of these regiments are in conformity with the provisions of sections 60 and 62 of the Military Code of the State, and are accompanied with the proper certificates, approvals and recommendations as prescribed therein.

Section 62 of the Military Code provides for the expense of "erecting, altering, repairing enlarging or renting armories, purchasing lands for the erection of armories, etc."

This section also makes a special provision for the City of New York, in regard to the "expense," and the raising of the money required, as follows:

"In the City and County of New York said Board (designated in section 60) shall make its recommendations to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, which, in case of approval, shall specify the sum to be appropriated for such purposes, rental, repairing, erection or alteration, which

sum shall be inserted by the Comptroller in his Departmental Estimate; and the Board of Estimate and Apportionment is hereby authorized and directed to include such sum in the Final Estimate for the tax levy for the next ensuing year."

The Board designated to make recommendations for the purchase of lands for sites, and the erection of buildings for armories, consists of Brigadier-General Philip S. Briggs, Inspector-General, S. N. Y.; J. Nelson Tappan, Chamberlain, and Hon. John Reilly, President, Board of Aldermen.

These gentlemen state that it is "the opinion of the Board that the present accommodations of the Eighth and Twelfth Regiments are inadequate and unfit for the purposes for which they are used," and recommend that sums shall be specified by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund to be used in erecting suitable armories, in accordance with the provisions of the Military Code. They also state that it is "the unanimous opinion of the Board that an eligible site can be purchased and a building erected to meet the needs of the organizations mentioned in Colonel Cruger's application for a sum, not to exceed \$350,000," which would provide a building large enough for the use of the Twelfth Regiment, that might be so arranged as to accommodate in addition, one battery and the division and brigade headquarters.

With regard to the Eighth Regiment Armory, it is recommended by the Board that fifteen lots, the property of the city, now unoccupied, situated at the northeast corner of Lexington avenue and Sixty-seventh street, be appropriated as a site, and that \$175,000 be specified for the erection of the building.

But if the proposed site is not appropriated for the purpose, the Board recommend that a site be purchased above Seventieth street, east of Fourth avenue, to consist of sixteen lots, on which an armory can be built, and that \$300,000 be specified for the site and building.

Whether the expense of purchasing these sites and erecting these armories should be provided for by appropriations to be included in the tax levy, as prescribed by the Military Code, is a question to be carefully considered by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund before approving these applications.

It is to be borne in mind that while these are the only requests as yet presented for this purpose, it is not unlikely that similar provision will be asked for by other regiments which are now occupying temporary quarters in locations not adapted to their future usefulness.

At present the city does not own a single armory built for the purpose, except the old State Arsenal at the corner of White and Elm streets, which has been abandoned for military purposes and is now rented out by the city for business purposes.

The Sixty-ninth Regiment is quartered in the upper part of Tompkins Market, and the Eleventh in the upper part of Essex Market.

The Seventh Regiment occupies a handsome and spacious armory, built by private subscriptions, on the block of land between the Fourth and Lexington avenues and Sixty-sixth and Sixty-seventh streets. The land belongs to the city and was leased to the Regiment at a nominal rental in 1879, under the authority of a special act of the Legislature "for and during the period that said Regiment shall exist and act as a military organization, and desire to occupy said armory for its lawful purposes."

All the other City regiments and batteries are quartered in buildings belonging to private persons, of whom they are hired.

The following list shows the location and the annual rental paid for each armory, amounting, in 1883, to \$78,750:

In view of the present condition of the insufficient provision for the accommodation of a number of the regiments of the National Guard in this city, making it necessary to hire buildings for armories, it would seem to be a consideration of wise economy on the part of the city, whether, as soon as practicable, it should not free itself from the necessity of the payment of these high rentals, besides the large expenditures required for fitting up and repairing these temporary quarters, by adopting some general plan to provide armories which shall be adequate to meet the future needs of the city for efficient military protection.

To this end I would respectfully recommend that an application be made to the next Legislature for the passage of an act authorizing the issue of bonds, within certain limits, to provide the means for the purchase of sites and the erection of suitable armories and drill-rooms, for the use of the National Guard in this city, subject to the discretion and control of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund.

A resolution is herewith submitted, requesting the Counsel to the Corporation to prepare such an act for the consideration and approval of this Board.

Report accepted and, on motion, the resolution was adopted.

The Mayor called up for consideration the communication of Committee of Merchants and Underwriters on "Water Supply of New York."

James H. Dunham, William S. Dunn and Charles S. Smith, Esqrs., addressed the Board on behalf of the merchants.

George T. Hope, Esq., and others addressed the Board on behalf of the underwriters.

The Mayor stated that no association or company had made an official application, communication to this Board on the subject.

The Recorder desired to know who composed or represented the company.

William S. Andrews, Esq., who appeared as Counsel for the Company, stated that the company would be represented at as early a meeting of the Commissioners as they would designate.

On motion of the Chairman of the Finance Committee of the Board of Aldermen, it was

Resolved, That the subject be laid on the table, until the names of the incorporators of the company be given, and maps and plans filed.

The consideration of the application of the "Fulton Market Fishmongers' Association" was laid over to the next meeting.

#### UBLIC NOTICE.

FOR THE INFORMATION OF THE PUBLIC, and especially of those using the Wharf Property of the City of New York, the following extracts from the rules and regulations established for the guidance of the Dock Masters appointed by the Board governing this Department, and to be observed by them in the performance of their duties, are hereby promulgated and published:

Resolved, For the proper supervision of the waterfront of the city, the care of the wharf property located thereon placed in the charge of this Department, the rendering of necessary facilities for the prompt berthing of vessels in transit, and the collection of the wharfage accruing therefrom, that the water-front of the City of New York be and hereby is arranged and divided into nine districts, and that for each of the said districts there shall be appointed, designated, or assigned, from time to time, at the pleasure of the Board, a suitable and competent person to be known and entitled as "Dock Master," who shall perform such duties and render such services in relation to the supervision, regulation, and occupation of the wharf property and water-front in their respective districts, as the laws of the United States and of the State of New York, the ordinances of the City of New York, and the by-laws of this Board, and its rules, or orders, shall or may require, prescribe, or direct.

The several districts so made and created, and the Dock Masters assigned thereto, are as follows, to wit:

District No. 1.—Embracing all that portion of the East river, extending from Castle Garden, on the Battery, to and including Pier 21, East river.

Charles H. Thompson, Dock Master; office, 33 Counties Slip.

District No. 2.—All that portion of the North river extending from Castle Garden, to and including Pier old 42, North river.

George W. Wamaker, Dock Master; office, foot of Duane street, N. R.

District No. 3.—From east side Pier 21, East river, to and including Pier 55, East river.

Edward Abbel, Dock Master; office, 262 South street.

District No. 4.—From north side Pier, old 42, North river, to and including pier at foot of West Twenty-third street, North river.

John M. Smith, Dock Master; office, Pier, new 43, N. R.

District No. 5.—From north side Pier 55, East river, to north side of Thirty-fourth street, East river.

Bernard Kenney, Dock Master; office, foot of East Sixteenth street, E. R.

District No. 6.—From north side Pier at Twenty-third street, North river, to and including Pier at foot Fifty-ninth street, North river.

Edward Gilon, Dock Master; office, Pier, new 57, N. R.

District No. 7.—From north side of Thirty-fourth street, East river, to south side of Ninety-second street, East river.

Robert Hall, Dockmaster; office, 646 First avenue.

District No. 8.—From north side of Pier at Fifty-ninth street, North river, to Yonkers and Spuyten Duyvil Creek, from North river to Kingsbridge.

Theodore S. Croft, Dockmaster; office, foot of West Seventy-ninth street, N. R.

District No. 9.—From south side Ninety-second street, East river, to and including Bronx river, and also Harlem river, from East river to Kingsbridge.

John Callan, Dockmaster; office, foot of East One Hundred and Fourth street, Harlem river.

Resolved, That until otherwise ordered by this Board the following rules and instructions are issued for the guidance and observance of the several Dock Masters of the Department:

\* \* \* \* \*

Each Dock Master shall promptly designate and assign in the order in which application is made, suitable and convenient berths, so far as practicable, within the limits of his district, for the use of such vessel and water craft as may require the same for the reception or discharge of passengers, merchandise, etc., therefrom or for the necessary repair or the safety of any vessel or water craft.

It shall be the duty of each Dock Master to require and enforce the due observance of and compliance with such of the national and State laws, city ordinances, and the rules, regulations and orders of the Department of Docks as appertain to the use, care and custody of the wharf property of and about the City of New York, promptly reporting to the Board all violations and evasions of such laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and orders.

\* \* \* \* \*

Each Dock Master is expressly prohibited, under penalty of immediate dismissal from his position, from receiving or demanding, directly or indirectly, any fee, gratuity, compensation, or article of value of any nature or kind, for the assignment of a berth to a vessel at any pier, slip, or wharf property whatsoever, or for the performance of or the omission to perform any of the duties required of or pertaining to the position of Dock Master of this Department.

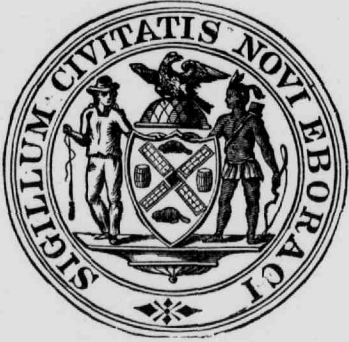
