JAMES E. MORRISON, Esq., Secretary of the Mayor:

SIR—I duly received your communication of the 2d instant, inclosing a warrant and accompanying voucher for \$125, in favor of J. B. Purroy, for serving summons and complaints in one hundred cases, at \$1.25 each, for the Department of Health. You state that the Mayor desires to be informed what the legal fees are for “service of summons and complaint,” in view of the provisions of chapter 569, Laws of 1864, chapter 484, Laws of 1862, chapter 692, Laws of 1866, and chapter 820 of the Laws of 1869, and such other provisions of law as may be applicable to the matter.

The fees of marshals for serving summons and complaint in actions commenced in the District Courts of this city appear to be regulated by section 15 of chapter 484 of the Laws of 1862, as amended by section 3 of chapter 569 of the Laws of 1864; and such fees are as follows:

For serving a summons on one defendant, one dollar.

For every additional defendant actually served, fifty cents.

For a copy of every summons delivered on request, or served, fifteen cents.

For every mile, going only, more than one mile, in serving a summons, to be computed from the place of abode of the defendant, or where he shall be found, to the place where the same is returnable, six cents.

Chapter 602 of the Laws of 1866 and chapter 820 of the Laws of 1869, referred to in your letter, do not appear to have any application to the fees of marshals in this city. The papers transmitted with your letter are herewith returned.
