BUILD NYC RESOURCE CORPORATION

PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Build NYC Resource Corporation (the "Corporation") is a not-for-profit local development corporation organized under Sections 402 and 1411 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law of the State of New York. In accordance with the aforesaid law, and pursuant to its certificate of incorporation, the Corporation has the power to issue non-recourse revenue bonds and to make the proceeds of those bonds available for projects that promote community and economic development in The City of New York (the "City"), and to thereby create jobs in the non-profit and for-profit sectors of the City's economy. The Corporation has been requested to issue such bonds for the financings listed below in the approximate dollar amounts respectively indicated. Approximately \$16,646,000 tax-exempt revenue bond transaction for the benefit of Beth Abraham Health Services (the "Organization"), a New York not-for-profit corporation exempt from federal taxation pursuant to $\overline{Section}\ 501(c)(3)$ of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, as borrower. Proceeds of the bonds, together with other funds of the Organization, will be used by the Organization to: (1) refund the outstanding New York City Industrial Development Agency ("NYCIDA") Civic Facility Revenue Bonds, Series 2003 (2003 Beth Abraham Health Services Project), Series A-2 issued in the original principal amount of \$8,260,000 (the "Series A-2 Bonds"), its Civic Facility Revenue Bonds (2003 Beth Abraham Health Services Project), Series B-2 issued in the original aggregate principal amount of \$6,320,000 (the "Series B-2 Bonds") and its Civic Facility Revenue Bonds (2003 Beth Abraham Health Services Project), Series C-2 issued in the original aggregate principal amount of \$1,535,000 (the "Series C-2 Bonds", collectively with the Series A-2 Bonds and the Series B-2 Bonds, the "2003 Bonds") the proceeds of which were used to: (i) refinance and finance the renovation and equipping of an approximately 342,530 square foot facility located on an approximately 78,000 square foot parcel of land located at 612 Allerton Avenue, Bronx, New York 10467; (ii) refinance and finance the renovation and equipping of an approximately 8,385 square foot building on an approximately 8,306 square foot parcel of land located at 1821-1825 Cornaga Avenue, Far Rockaway, New York 11691, (iii) fund a debt service reserve fund, and (iv) pay certain costs of issuance, and (2) pay for certain costs for the bonds. Approximately 90 percent of the 2003 Bonds were allocable to the Allerton Avenue facility and approximately 10 percent of the 2003 Bonds were allocable to the Cornaga Avenue facility. All of the properties described herein are owned or leased by the Organization to further its capacity to provide healthcare, social services and housing for the elderly, chronically ill and those in need of rehabilitation services. The financial assistance proposed to be conferred by the Corporation will consist of such tax-exempt financing and exemption from City and State mortgage recording taxes.

Approximately \$9,500,000 tax-exempt revenue bond transaction for the benefit of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of New York City, Inc. ("BBBS"), a New York not-for-profit corporation exempt from federal taxation pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, as borrower. Proceeds from the bonds, together with other funds of BBBS, will be used by BBBS to (i) finance the acquisition of an approximately 25,717 square foot commercial condominium unit (the "Facility") located within an approximately 575,000 square foot building located at 40 Rector Street, New York, New York 10006 and (ii) pay certain costs incidental and related to the bonds. The Facility is to be owned and operated by BBBS and used for the purpose of community-based and workplace mentoring programs to provide children facing adversity with adult volunteer mentors, and for a training center for BBBS to train other not-for-profit organizations in mentoring best practices. The financial assistance proposed to be conferred by the Corporation will be such tax-exempt bond financing and an exemption from City and State mortgage recording

The City Record (CR) is published each business day and includes notices of proposed New York City procurement actions, contract awards, and other procurement-related information. Solicitation notices for most procurements valued at or above \$100,000 for information technology and for construction and construction related services, above \$50,000 for other services, and above \$25,000 for other goods are published for at least one day. Other types of procurements, such as sole source, require notice in The City Record for five consecutive days. Unless otherwise specified, the agencies and offices listed are open for business Monday through Friday from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., except on legal holidays.

NOTICE TO ALL NEW YORK CITY CONTRACTORS

The New York State Constitution ensures that all laborers, workers or mechanics employed by a contractor or subcontractor doing public work are to be paid the same wage rate that prevails in the trade where the public work is being done. Additionally, New York State Labor Law §§ 220 and 230 provide that a contractor or subcontractor doing public work in construction or building service must pay its employees no less than the prevailing wage. Section 6-109 (the Living Wage Law) of the New York City Administrative Code also provides for a "living wage", as well as prevailing wage, to be paid to workers employed by City contractors in certain occupations. HOW TO READ CR PROCUREMENT NOTICES

Procurement notices in the CR are arranged by alphabetically listed Agencies, and within Agency, by Division if any. The notices for each Agency (or Division) are further divided into three subsections: Solicitations, Awards; and Lists & Miscellaneous notices. Each of these subsections separately lists notices pertaining to Goods, Services, or Construction.

Notices of Public Hearings on Contract Awards appear at the end of the Procurement Section.

At the end of each Agency (or Division) listing is a paragraph giving the specific address to contact to secure, examine and/or to submit bid or proposal documents, forms, plans, specifications, and other information, as well as where bids will be publicly opened and read. This address should be used for the purpose specified unless a different one is given in the individual notice. In that event, the directions in the individual notice should be followed.
