Presidents' Day Service Update

Sanitation Workers Will be Working on Presidents' Day, Monday, February 15, A Holiday Normally Observed by the Department

While Presidents' Day, Monday, February 15, has historically been observed as a holiday for the Department, due to the recent snowfalls and previous collection delays, Sanitation Workers will be working that day, and trash and recycling collection will occur as any ongoing snow operations allow.

Residents who normally have Monday collection should put their trash and recycling at the curb Sunday evening for collection, however delays should be anticipated as the Department works to collect the backlog of material.

About the New York City Department of Sanitation

The Department of Sanitation (DSNY) keeps New York City healthy, safe and clean by collecting, recycling and disposing of waste, cleaning streets and vacant lots, and clearing snow and ice. The Department operates 59 district garages and manages a fleet of more than 2,000 rear-loading collection trucks, 450 mechanical brooms and 705 salt spreaders. The Department clears litter, snow and ice from approximately 6,500 miles of City streets and removes debris from vacant lots as well as abandoned vehicles from City streets.
