Hon. SETH LOW, Mayor of New York:

Sir—I transmit herewith copy of opinion of the Corporation Counsel, in regard to additional work, exceeding in estimated cost the sum of \$1,000, which is required on the station house for the 75th Precinct, now under contract with Thomas G. Carlin, and in accordance with this opinion I respectfully request that you will ask the Board of Aldermen to pass a resolution—the draft of which is herewith inclosed—authorizing this work to be done by Thomas G. Carlin without competitive bids under public letting. If this resolution is passed a delay of many weeks will be avoided in the construction of this building, which is very greatly needed.

Four bids have been obtained for doing this work, and Thomas G. Carlin submitted the lowest of the four. They are submitted herewith.

Whereas, Contract was entered into with Thomas G. Carlin by the Police Commissioner for the Police Department of The City of New York, dated May 28, 1903, for the construction of a station house for the Seventy-fifth Precinct, for the sum and price of \$88,800, and it appearing from reports of the architect for the said building (R. Thomas Short) that it is necessary to perform additional work on account of the character of the ground where the foundations of said building are to be dug and built, and that four estimates for such work have been received by the Police Commissioner, the lowest being that of the said contractor, Thomas G. Carlin;

Resolved, That permission be and is hereby given to the Police Commissioner to accept the estimate of Thomas G. Carlin for extra work required in the construction of a station house for the Seventy-fifth Precinct, in a sum not to exceed \$3,700, and to award contract for the same without advertising for competing bids.

Hon. FRANCIS V. GREENE, Police Commissioner:

Sir—I am in receipt of a communication dated August 17, 1903, transmitting for my consideration and advice contract with Thomas G. Carlin, dated May 28, 1903, for the construction of a station house for the 75th Precinct, together with a copy of said contract and the correspondence in regard to the same.

From your letter and the correspondence enclosed therewith it appears that the architect for the erection of this building, at the request of your predecessor in office, and pursuant to an authorization by resolution of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, procured a City Surveyor to make an examination and soundings to ascertain the necessary character of the foundation for the station house, and that such Surveyor, presumably by an oversight or carelessness, failed to properly discover the actual existing conditions.

The plan or map, therefore, accompanying the contract, and to which the latter refers, was erroneously drawn and failed to indicate the real depth to which the character of the ground requires that the foundations be dug and built.

You further state that the additional work now thereby necessitated, exclusive of the waterproofing, may run as high as \$2,000, and that the cost of the latter may amount to as much as \$600.

In view of this state of facts, you request my opinion (1) whether the contractor, under the terms of the contract, can be required to perform this additional work without extra compensation, and (2) whether, if he cannot, the City has any recourse against the architect or the City Surveyor. You also ask my advice as to whether, in the event of this additional work being deemed a proper matter for a supplemental contract, you may award the same by treasury order, or must follow the method of public letting.

It is my opinion that the City, upon the facts presented by your letter and the correspondence therewith enclosed, cannot hold the architect in any way responsible for the additional work necessitated by the Surveyor's error.

The former acted simply as the agent of the City in securing the Surveyor's services, and is in no sense responsible for the latter's mistake.

In regard to the Surveyor's responsibility to the City, it is undoubtedly true that, if it could be proved that the latter was guilty of either bad faith or wilful negligence the City could hold him responsible for the damage suffered by it in consequence. But the facts presented by you fall far short of presenting evidence to justify such a conclusion, and in the absence of such evidence of wilful neglect or carelessness the City could expect nothing from a suit against the Surveyor.

The question as to the contractor's obligation, if any, to perform this additional work under the contract without extra compensation is one of more uncertainty.

Section 5 on page 26 of the specifications attached to the contract, under the heading "Mason Work," reads as follows:

"The contractor shall excavate to the depth shown on section for cellar, foundation walls, piers, areas, etc., or to such depth as may be found necessary to acquire suitable bearings for footings. It is presumed that a suitable foundation may be found at the depth marked."

And sections 15, 17 and 18 on page 24 of the contract fortify in some measure at any rate this language as against the contractor.

But it is my opinion, in view of the very material variance between the plan accompanying the contract and the actual existing conditions, and the very substantial additional cost necessitated thereby, that whether the City might or might not technically require this additional work to be done by the contractor without extra compensation it would be practically impossible in the absence of other evidence than that before me to sustain such action in the courts, even if its somewhat doubtful equity did not make it inadvisable for the best interests of the Department.

I therefore advise you that the work in question may properly be contracted for by supplemental contract, but that as the latter clearly calls for an expenditure exceeding the amount of \$1,000, you must either let the supplemental contract after public advertisement as provided in section 419 of the Charter, or secure an appropriate resolution from the Board of Aldermen to enable you to award it without competitive bids and a public letting.

The Committee on Finance respectfully reports that the Committee on Buildings has requested through its Chairman in a letter hereto annexed, that provision be made for the renting of additional school premises, owing to the large increase in attendance, by requesting the Board of Estimate and Apportionment and the Board of Aldermen to issue Special Revenue Bonds to the extent of \$25,000 for the purpose.

The Committee on Finance concurs in the request of the Committee on Buildings, and submits for adoption the following resolution:

Resolved, That the Board of Estimate and Apportionment and the Board of Aldermen be and they hereby are respectfully requested to authorize the Comptroller to issue Special Revenue Bonds to the extent of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), the proceeds thereof to be deemed appropriated to the Department of Education and applied exclusively to the renting of additional school premises made necessary by the large increase in the school population.

Hon. CHARLES V. FORNES, President, Board of Aldermen, City Hall, Borough of Manhattan:

Sir—The new fire alarm telegraph system in the Borough of Richmond, which has been in process of construction since the beginning of the year, will be completed and ready to go into operation by October 20, 1903. To place it in commission and maintain it from that date until the end of the present year it is estimated that the sum of \$3,000 will be necessary to provide for the payment of the salaries of one Chief Operator, six Telegraph Operators, three Linemen and two Batterymen, and for incidental expenses, such as horse hire, care fares, telephone rentals and the repairing of damage that may be caused by storms.

In the estimate of 1904, the original of which was submitted to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment on August 19, 1903, and a duplicate to your honorable on the same date, the sum of \$23,700 has been asked for the purpose of making provision for the expenses of the system for the coming year, and the request now made is with the view of having sufficient funds placed at the disposal of the Department to meet the necessities of the case for the period of more than two months, which must elapse before the appropriation for 1904 will become available.

I have therefore the honor to request that, pursuant to the provisions of subdivision 8 of section 188 of the Greater New York Charter, your honorable body request the Board of Estimate and Apportionment to authorize the Comptroller to issue Special Revenue Bonds to the amount of \$3,000 to meet the expense of providing an adequate working force for the operation of the fire alarm telegraph system in the Borough of Richmond from October 20, 1903, until December 31, 1903, and for necessary incidental expenditures connected therewith.

I inclose draft of resolution designed to accomplish the object in contemplation, and in view of the urgency of the matter the prompt action of your Honorable Board will be greatly appreciated.

Sir—Your attention is called to the provisions of chapter 413, Laws of 1897, which require the Loan Commissioners in each county to exhibit to the Board of Supervisors thereof at its annual meeting all mortgages in their charge, together with their books of accounts, minutes and vouchers, so that such board may ascertain whether the moneys committed to the charge of such Commissioners are still outstanding as satisfactory loans and whether the money collected either as principal, interest or rent on property owned by the State has been duly accounted for and disposed of by them according to law, and which further require such board at its annual meeting to examine all such mortgages, books of accounts, minutes and vouchers and to give to such Commissioners such directions as to taking additional security from the borrowers as it shall deem proper and necessary. Such statute further requires such board to certify to the Comptroller as to the sufficiency of the securities for the money loaned and as to whether or not the moneys collected by such Commissioners on account of the principal or interest of such mortgages and the rent on property owned by the State has been duly accounted for and disposed of by them according to law and as to what directions it has given to such Commissioners as to taking additional security. Compliance with these provisions is respectfully requested.

Hon. EDWARD M. GROUT, Comptroller:

Sir—I have received your letter of September 25, 1903, relating to a resolution of the Board of Aldermen adopted July 31, 1903, which purports to give permission to the Columbia Iron Works and Malleable Iron Company to lay a railroad track on Atlantic avenue, in the Borough of Brooklyn. Accompanying your letter are the following papers: Report of Eugene E. McLean, Engineer of the Department of Finance; a copy of the resolution of the Board of Aldermen referred to and a draft of resolutions which the Engineer's report recommends shall be submitted to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for its action.

You request me to examine these resolutions and communicate with you regarding them.

In my opinion the resolution of the Board of Aldermen, above referred to, has no validity and therefore no proceedings can properly be taken by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment in relation to it.

My reasons are these:

1. The Charter of The City of New York requires that the grant of a right to use the streets for the purposes of laying railroad tracks therein shall be made by ordinance.

2. It does not appear that the provisions of sections 30, 39 and 40 of the Charter which apply to the granting of such rights have been complied with.

I desire to call attention to another matter which arises in this connection. By section 45 of the Charter a grant of the right to construct and operate railways in the streets can be granted only to corporations thereunto duly authorized. Whether a grant of the right described in the resolution in question can be made to a manufacturing corporation, which I assume the Columbia Iron Works and Malleable Iron Company to be, is open to doubt. No such difficulty, however, would be presented if the application for the desired franchise were made by the Long Island Railroad Company, with whose tracks the proposed railway is to be connected, as appears by the resolution of the Board of Aldermen.

I return you the papers enclosed in your letter.

Resolved, That permission be and the same is hereby given to the Columbia Machine Works and Malleable Iron Company to connect its premises on the northeast corner of Atlantic avenue and Chestnut street, in the Twenty-sixth Ward, in the Borough of Brooklyn, by a switch, as shown upon the accompanying diagram, with the tracks of the Long Island Railroad Company in Atlantic avenue, so that cars for carrying freight may be loaded and unloaded upon the premises of the said Columbia Machine Works and Malleable Iron Company without causing interference with traffic or pedestrians in the carriageway or on the sidewalks of Atlantic avenue at the point named; the said switch to be laid only in front of the premises owned by the Columbia Machine Works and Malleable Iron Company, to be of a pattern approved by the President of the Borough of Brooklyn, and to be laid and maintained flush with the surface of the street, provided the said Columbia Machine Works and Malleable Iron Company shall pay to The City of New York as compensation for the privilege such amount as may be determined as an equivalent therefor by the Board of Aldermen.

Estimate and Apportionment; all the work of laying the switch, paving between the rails of the same, and the two feet outside thereof, to be done at the expense of the said Columbia Machine Works and Malleable Iron Company, under the direction of the President of the Borough of Brooklyn; such permission to continue only during the pleasure of the Board of Aldermen.

The Committee on Finance of the Board of Trustees of the College of The City of New York, pursuant to the action of said Board, on September 21, 1903, hereby reports that there will be required for the payment of the salaries of the President, professors and officers of the said college, for the obtaining and furnishing of scientific apparatus, books for the students and other necessary supplies, for repairing and altering the college buildings, and for the support, maintenance and general expenses of said college, during the year 1904, the sum of three hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars (\$325,000), in accordance with the accompanying schedule.

The reasons for asking for an amount in excess of that allowed for the year 1903 are many. Vacant professorships will have to be filled, and, owing to the increasing number of candidates for admission, a large number of new tutors and instructors will be required. Text-books and new apparatus have to be purchased, and owing to the condition of the college buildings, many minor repairs have to be made to fit the buildings for occupancy until the new buildings are completed.

In view of the facts stated above, the Board of Estimate and Apportionment and the Board of Aldermen are earnestly petitioned to appropriate the amount mentioned herein.

Be it Ordained, by the Board of Aldermen of The City of New York as follows:

Section 1. Each and every railroad company operating cars on the surface of any of the streets, avenues or public places of The City of New York, whose motive power is electricity, shall equip each and every car so operated with a safety fender or safeguard attached to the front platform of said car or cars, which shall extend from the platform of said car or cars to within not more than three inches from the tracks, and to be made and modeled in such a manner that it will be impossible for any person or persons to pass under the fender or the platform of said car or cars and come in contact with the wheels of said car. The said front platform of said car to be construed as the platform occupied by the motorman, no matter in what direction the said car may be going.

Sec. 2. For each and every violation of the provisions of this ordinance there shall be recoverable against the company so offending a penalty of fifty dollars in an action brought in the name of The City of New York.

Sec. 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the former municipal and public corporations consolidated into The City of New York inconsistent or conflicting herewith are hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after the date of approval thereof by his Honor the Mayor.

The Thirty-second Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Maurice avenue, from Newtown creek to Jay avenue; the southerly side of Jay avenue, from Maurice avenue to Clermont avenue; the westerly side of Clermont avenue, from Jay avenue to Grand street; the westerly side of Fresh Pond road, from Grand street to Mount Olivet avenue; the northerly side of Mount Olivet avenue, from Fresh Pond road to Flushing avenue; the westerly side of Flushing avenue, from Mount Olivet avenue to the centre line Bushwick Branch Long Island Railroad track; the northerly side Bushwick Branch Long Island Railroad track, from Flushing avenue to Metropolitan avenue; the northerly side of Metropolitan avenue, from the Bushwick Branch Long Island Railroad track to Newtown creek, and Newtown creek.

The Thirty-third Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Metropolitan avenue, from Newtown creek to Jay avenue; the southerly side of Jay avenue, from Maurice avenue to Clermont avenue; the westerly side of Clermont avenue, from Jay avenue to Grand street; the westerly side of Fresh Pond road, from Grand street to Mount Olivet avenue; the southerly side of Mount Olivet avenue, from Fresh Pond road to Flushing avenue; the westerly side of Flushing avenue, from Mount Olivet avenue to the centre line Bushwick Branch Long Island Railroad track; the northerly side Bushwick Branch Long Island Railroad track, from Flushing avenue to Metropolitan avenue; the northerly side of Metropolitan avenue, from the Bushwick Branch Long Island Railroad track to Newtown creek, and Newtown creek.

The Thirty-fourth Election District is bounded by and within the westerly side of Fairview avenue, from Gates avenue to the southerly side of Linden Hill Cemetery; thence westerly to the easterly side of Woodward avenue, at a point midway between Stockholm street and DeKalb avenue; thence southerly on the easterly side of Woodward avenue to Harmon street; the south side of Harmon street to the line dividing the former City of Brooklyn and the Town of Newtown, and above mentioned line from Harmon street to Gates avenue; thence to Fairview avenue.

The Thirty-fifth Election District is bounded by and within the easterly side of Fairview avenue, from Gates avenue to the southerly side of Linden Hill Cemetery, to William street; thence easterly in a direct line through the Baker estate from William street to Mount Olivet avenue; the southerly side of Mount Olivet avenue from line through Baker estate to Fresh Pond road; the westerly side of Fresh Pond road from Mount Olivet avenue to Gates avenue (or Magnolia street); the northerly side of Gates avenue (or Magnolia street) from Fresh Pond road to Fairview avenue.

The Thirty-sixth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Mount Olivet avenue, from Fresh Pond road to the line of property of Mount Olivet Cemetery; the southerly side of said line, from Mount Olivet avenue to Juniper avenue; the southerly side of Johnson avenue, from Juniper avenue to Dry Harbor road; the easterly side of Dry Harbor road, from Johnson avenue to Trotting Course lane; the westerly side of Trotting Course lane, from Johnson avenue to Metropolitan avenue; the northerly side of Metropolitan avenue, from Trotting Course lane to Fresh Pond road, and the easterly side of Fresh Pond road, from Metropolitan avenue to Mount Olivet avenue.

The Thirty-seventh Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Metropolitan avenue, from the westerly line of Old Lutheran Cemetery to Grove avenue (Union turnpike), the southerly side of Grove avenue (Union turnpike), from Metropolitan avenue to the former division line of the towns of Jamaica and Newtown; the easterly side of said division line to the former division line of

The Thirty-eighth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Metropolitan avenue, from Fresh Pond road to the westerly boundary of Lutheran Cemetery; the westerly side of the line of Lutheran Cemetery south to the house of Rossinan, from Metropolitan avenue to Myrtle avenue; the westerly side of the highway leading to Cypress Hills Cemetery, from Myrtle avenue to Cooper avenue; the northerly side of Cooper avenue, from the highway leading to Cypress Hills Cemetery to Fresh Pond road; the westerly side of Fresh Pond road, from Cooper avenue to the line of the former City of Brooklyn and the Town of Newtown; westerly and northerly along said line, from Fresh Pond road to Cooper avenue; the southerly side of Cooper avenue, from the former division line of the City of Brooklyn and the Town of Newtown to Cypress avenue; the easterly side of Cypress avenue, from Cooper avenue to the Manhattan Beach Branch of the Long Island Railroad; the southerly side of the Manhattan Beach Branch of the Long Island Railroad, from Cypress avenue to Fresh Pond road, and the easterly side of Fresh Pond road, from the Manhattan Beach Branch of the Long Island Railroad to Metropolitan avenue.

The Fortieth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Myrtle avenue, from the division line of the former City of Brooklyn and the Town of Newtown to the centre line of the Manhattan Beach Branch of the Long Island Railroad; the westerly side of the Manhattan Beach Branch of the Long Island Railroad, from Myrtle avenue to Cypress avenue; the westerly side of Cypress avenue, from the Manhattan Beach Branch of the Long Island Railroad to Cooper avenue; the northerly side of Cooper avenue, from Cypress avenue to the former division line of the City of Brooklyn and the Town of Newtown, and the easterly side of said line, from Cooper avenue to Myrtle avenue.

The Second Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Eighteenth street, from Whitestone avenue (Fourth avenue) to Thirteenth avenue; the easterly side of Thirteenth avenue, from Eighteenth street to Thirtieth street; the southerly side of Thirtieth street, from Thirteenth avenue to Little Bay; Little Bay, Long Island Sound, Little Neck Bay to stream running through the lands of J. W. Harway; thence westerly along said stream to the westerly side of Bell avenue; the westerly side of Bell avenue, from said stream to Little Bayside road; the northerly side of Little Bayside road, from Bell avenue to Whitestone road; the easterly side of Whitestone road, from Bayside road to Willett's Point road; the westerly side of Willett's Point road, from Sixteenth avenue to First street; the northerly side of First street, from Fourteenth avenue to Whitestone avenue, and the easterly side of Whitestone avenue, from First street to Eighteenth street.

The Third Election District is bounded by and within East river, Powell's Cove, the westerly side of the Boulevard, from Powell's Cove to Third avenue; the southerly side of Third avenue, from the Boulevard to Whitestone avenue (Fourth avenue); the westerly side of Whitestone avenue (Fourth avenue), from Third avenue to Seventh avenue; the northerly side of Seventh avenue, from Whitestone avenue (Fourth avenue) to Twenty-first street; the easterly side of Twenty-first street, from Seventh avenue to Sixth avenue; the northerly side of Sixth avenue, from Twenty-first street to Fifteenth street; the easterly side of Fifteenth street, from Sixth avenue to Fifth avenue; the northerly side of Fifth avenue, from Fifteenth street to Twelfth street; the easterly side of Twelfth street, from Fifth avenue to First avenue; the southerly side of First avenue, from Twelfth street to Thirteenth street; the easterly side of Thirteenth street, from First avenue to Avenue C; the easterly side of College avenue, from Avenue C to East river.

The Fourth Election District is bounded by and within East river, the westerly side of College avenue, from East river to the centre line of Thirteenth street and Avenue C; the westerly side of Thirteenth street, from Avenue C to First avenue; the northerly side of First avenue, from Thirteenth street to Twelfth street; the westerly side of Twelfth street, from First avenue to Fifth avenue; the northerly side of Fifth avenue, from Twelfth street to Flushing Bay, and Flushing Bay.

The Fifth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Fifth avenue, from Flushing Bay to Fifteenth street; the westerly side of Fifteenth street, from Fifth avenue to Sixth avenue; the southerly side of Sixth avenue, from Fifteenth street to Twenty-first street; the westerly side of Twenty-first street, from Sixth avenue to Seventh avenue; southerly side of Seventh avenue, from Twenty-first street to Twenty-third street; the westerly side of Twenty-third street, from Seventh avenue to creek; centre line of creek, from Twenty-third street to Flushing Bay, and Flushing Bay.

The Sixth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Seventh avenue, from Twenty-third street to Whitestone avenue; the westerly side of Whitestone avenue, Fourth avenue, from Seventh avenue to First street; the southerly side of First street, from Whitestone avenue to Willett's Point road; the easterly side of Willett's Point road, from First street to Whitestone road; the westerly side of Whitestone road, from Willett's Point road to Broadway; the northerly side of Broadway, from Whitestone road to Flushing Creek; the centre line of said creek, from Broadway to Twenty-third street, and the easterly side of Twenty-third street, from Flushing Creek to Seventh avenue.

The Seventh Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Broadway, from Flushing Creek to Main street; the westerly side of Main street, from Broadway to Amity street; the northerly side of Amity street, from Main street to Flushing Creek, and Flushing Creek.

The Eighth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Broadway, from Main street to Parsons avenue; the westerly side of Parsons avenue, from Broadway to Amity street; the northerly side of Amity street, from Parsons avenue to Main street, and the easterly side of Main street, from Amity street to Broadway.

The Ninth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Amity street, from Main street to Parsons avenue; the easterly side of Parsons avenue, from Amity street to Broadway; the southerly side of Broadway, from Parsons avenue to Sanford avenue; the northerly side of Sanford avenue, from Broadway to Jamaica avenue; the easterly side of Jamaica avenue, from Sanford avenue to Main street, and the easterly side of Main street, from Jamaica avenue to Amity street.

The Tenth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Amity street, from Flushing Creek to Main street; the westerly side of Main street, from Amity street to Jamaica avenue, the westerly side of Jamaica avenue, from Main street to Hillside avenue; the northerly side of Hillside avenue, from Jamaica avenue to Flushing Creek; thence westerly and northerly along centre line of said creek to Amity street.

The Eleventh Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Hillside avenue, from Flushing Creek to Jamaica avenue; the easterly side of Jamaica avenue, from Hillside avenue to Sanford avenue; the southerly side of Sandford ave-

nue, from Jamaica avenue to Broadway; the southerly side of Broadway, from Sandford avenue to Cemetery lane; the westerly side of Cemetery lane, from Broadway to Fresh Meadow road; the westerly side of Fresh Meadow road, from Cemetery lane to a line dividing the former Towns of Flushing and Jamaica; thence along said town line, from Fresh Meadow road to Flushing Creek; thence northerly and easterly along centre line of said creek to Hillside avenue.

The Twelfth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Broadway, from Cemetery lane to Whitestone road; the easterly side of Whitestone road, from Broadway to Little Bayside road; the southerly side of Little Bayside road, from Whitestone road to Bell avenue; the easterly side of Bell avenue, from Little Bayside road to stream running through land of J. W. Harway; thence easterly along said stream to Little Neck Bay; Little Neck Bay, from above mentioned stream to Little Neck Creek; along centre line of Little Neck Creek, from Little Neck Bay to Alley road; the westerly side of Alley road, from Little Neck Creek to Rocky Hill road; the northerly side of Rocky Hill road, from Alley road to the line dividing the former towns of Flushing and Jamaica; from Rocky Hill road to Fresh Meadow road; the easterly side of Fresh Meadow road, from said town line to Cemetery lane, and the easterly side of Cemetery lane, from Fresh Meadow road to Broadway.

The Thirteenth Election District is bounded by and within Little Neck bay, the line dividing the former towns of Flushing and North Hempstead, the northerly side of Jericho turnpike, from said town line to a line dividing the former towns of Flushing and Jamaica; thence along said line to Rocky Hill road; the northerly side of Rocky Hill road to Alley road; the easterly side of Alley road, from Rocky Hill road to Little Neck Creek, and the centre line of said creek, from Alley road to Little Neck bay.

The Fourteenth Election District is bounded by and within the line dividing the former towns of Newtown and Jamaica, from the former city line of Brooklyn to Woodhaven avenue; the westerly side of Woodhaven avenue from the dividing lines between the former towns of Newtown and Jamaica to Atlantic avenue; the northerly side of Atlantic avenue from Woodhaven avenue to the former city line of Brooklyn, and along said line from Atlantic avenue to the line dividing the former towns of Newtown and Jamaica.

The Fifteenth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Atlantic avenue, from the former city line of Brooklyn to Morris avenue; the westerly side of Morris avenue, from Atlantic avenue to Liberty avenue; the southerly side of Liberty avenue, from Morris avenue to centre line of the New York, Woodhaven and Rockaway branch of the Long Island Railroad, the westerly side of the New York, Woodhaven and Rockaway branch of the Long Island Railroad, from Liberty avenue to Hawtree creek; the centre line of Hawtree creek, from the New York, Woodhaven and Rockaway branch Long Island Railroad to Jamaica bay; Jamaica bay, Spring creek and a line dividing the former City of Brooklyn and Town of Jamaica, from Spring creek to Atlantic avenue.

The Sixteenth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Atlantic avenue, from Morris avenue to the centre line of the New York, Woodhaven and Rockaway branch, Long Island Railroad; the westerly side of New York, Woodhaven and Rockaway branch, Long Island Railroad, from Atlantic avenue to Belmont avenue; the northerly side of Belmont avenue, from New York, Woodhaven and Rockaway branch, Long Island Railroad to Van Wicklin avenue; the westerly side of Van Wicklin avenue, from Belmont avenue to Liberty avenue; the northerly side of Liberty avenue, from Van Wicklin avenue to Morris avenue, and the easterly side of Morris avenue, from Liberty avenue to Atlantic avenue.

The Seventeenth Election District is bounded by and within the line dividing the former towns of Newtown and Jamaica, from Woodhaven avenue to Myrtle avenue; the southerly side of Myrtle avenue, from said town line to Welling street; the westerly side of Welling street, from Myrtle avenue to Jamaica avenue; the southerly side of Jamaica avenue, from Welling street to Briggs avenue; the westerly side of Briggs avenue, from Jamaica avenue to Atlantic avenue; the northerly side of Atlantic avenue, from Briggs avenue to Woodhaven avenue, and the easterly side of Woodhaven avenue, from Atlantic avenue to the line dividing the former towns of Newtown and Jamaica.

The Eighteenth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Atlantic avenue from centre line of the New York and Rockaway branch Long Island Railroad to Greenwood avenue; the westerly side of Greenwood avenue, from Atlantic avenue to Liberty avenue; the southerly side of Liberty avenue, from Greenwood avenue to Van Wyck avenue; the westerly side of Van Wyck avenue, from Liberty avenue to Bergen Landing road; the westerly side of Bergen Landing road, from Van Wyck avenue to Jamaica Bay; a line running southerly from Bergen Landing road to Beach channel; thence westerly along Beach channel to a line opposite Hawtree creek; thence westerly along said line to the centre line of Hawtree creek from Jamaica Bay to New York and Rockaway branch Long Island Railroad; the easterly side New York and Rockaway branch Long Island Railroad, from Hawtree creek to Liberty avenue; the northerly side of Liberty avenue, from the New York and Rockaway branch Long Island Railroad to Van Wicklin avenue; the easterly side of Van Wicklin avenue, from Liberty avenue to Belmont avenue; the southerly side of Belmont avenue, from Van Wicklin avenue to centre line New York and Rockaway branch Long Island Railroad; the easterly side of New York and Rockaway branch Long Island Railroad, from Belmont avenue to Atlantic avenue.

The Twentieth Election District is bounded by and within the line dividing the former Towns of Newtown and Jamaica, from Myrtle avenue to Newtown road; the westerly side of Newtown road, from said line to Van Wyck avenue; the westerly side of Van Wyck avenue, from Newtown road to Atlantic avenue; the northerly side of Atlantic avenue, from Van Wyck avenue to Briggs avenue; the easterly side of Briggs avenue, from Atlantic avenue to Jamaica avenue; the northerly side of Jamaica avenue, from Briggs avenue to Welling street; the easterly side of Welling street, from Jamaica avenue to Myrtle avenue, and the northerly side of Myrtle avenue, from Welling street to the line dividing the former Towns of Newtown and Jamaica.

The Twenty-first Election District is bounded by and within a line dividing the former Towns of Flushing and Jamaica, from the former town line of Newtown to Union avenue; the westerly side of Union avenue, from former lines dividing former Towns of Flushing and Jamaica to Fulton street; the northerly side of Fulton street, from Union avenue to Beaver street; the westerly side of Beaver street, from Fulton street to Atlantic avenue; the northerly side of Atlantic avenue, from Beaver street to Van Wyck avenue; the easterly side of Van Wyck avenue, from Atlantic avenue to Newtown road; the easterly side of Newtown road, from Van Wyck avenue to the town lines dividing the former Towns of Newtown and Jamaica; thence along said town line, from Newtown road to the line dividing the former Towns of Flushing and Jamaica.

The Twenty-second Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Atlantic avenue, from Van Wyck avenue to Prospect street; the westerly side of Prospect street, from Atlantic avenue to South street; the northerly side of South street, from Prospect street to Rockaway road; the westerly side of Rockaway road, from South street to Three Mile Mill road; the westerly side of Three Mile Mill road, from Rockaway road to Cornell's creek; the centre line of Cornell's creek, from Three Mile Mill road to Jamaica Bay; Jamaica Bay, from Cornell's creek to Bergen Landing road; the easterly side of Bergen Landing road, from Jamaica Bay to Van Wyck avenue, and the easterly side of Van Wyck avenue, from Bergen Landing road to Atlantic avenue.

The Twenty-third Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Fulton street, from Beaver street to New York avenue; the westerly side of New York avenue, from Fulton street to Locust avenue; the northerly side of Locust avenue, from New York avenue to Rockaway road; the easterly side of Rockaway road, from Locust avenue to South street; the southerly side of South street, from Rockaway road to Prospect street; the easterly side of Prospect street, from South street to Atlantic avenue; the northerly side of Atlantic avenue, from Prospect street to Beaver street, and the easterly side of Beaver street, from Atlantic avenue to Fulton street.

the former towns of Flushing and Jamaica, from Union avenue to Lincoln avenue; the westerly side of Lincoln avenue, from said town line to Fulton street; the northwesterly side of Fulton street, from Lincoln avenue to Union avenue, and the easterly side of Union avenue, from Hempstead and Jamaica Plank road to the line dividing the former towns of Flushing and Jamaica.

The Twenty-sixth Election District is bounded by and within the line dividing the former towns of Flushing and Jamaica from Lincoln avenue to a line dividing the property of C. Vanderveer and J. S. Bergen; thence southerly along said dividing line, from line dividing the former towns of Flushing and Jamaica to Hempstead and Jamaica Plank road; thence southerly along a line dividing the Delemaeter property and G. Haubitzer's farm, from Hempstead and Jamaica Plank road to Hollis avenue (old country road); thence southerly along a line running through Ditmis and Remsen property, from Hollis avenue (old country road) to Central avenue; the northerly side of Central avenue, from above mentioned line to Merrick road; the easterly side of Merrick road, from Central avenue to Jamaica Village line; the easterly side of Jamaica Village line, from Merrick road to Hamilton avenue; the easterly side of Hamilton avenue, from Jamaica Village line to Lincoln avenue, and the easterly side of Lincoln avenue, from Hamilton avenue to the line dividing the former towns of Flushing and Jamaica.

Appeal No. 200. On presentation of report and on motion, appeal was approved.

Appeal No. 201 of 1903. New Building 649 of 1903, southeast corner of Twenty-ninth street and Broadway, Manhattan, Messrs. Clinton & Russell, architects and appellants.

That it is unlawful to erect pent houses as shown on plans, on buildings not conforming with the law regarding buildings constructed under 150 feet, or 12 stories high.

The provisions of the Building Code do not apply to a pent house erected on and covering a portion of the roof of a building constructed strictly in compliance with the law.

To allow the construction of a pent house covering a portion of the roof on the 12-story building, without having the same considered as a complete extra story, the building being fireproof.

The building itself covers a lesser percentage of the lot than the Building Code allows, in order to obtain a greater amount of light and ventilation than is required by law, and therefore the area of the roof is less than the area could be made. The area covered by the pent house, not including the space that is lawfully allowed to be enclosed for the enclosure of tanks, is 40 per cent. of the roof, or 35 per cent. of the roof that would be actually lawful.

The height of this building is 150 feet to the highest point of the main roof beams; but this building is built better than the Building Code requires, in that all the floor surfaces throughout the entire building are of cement or tile, etc., and no wood flooring is anywhere used throughout the entire building. The construction of the pent house will be as follows:

Wherever brick walls surrounding the pent house can be carried up, they will be so carried up to their proper height. The other enclosure walls of the pent house will be of iron construction, filled in with hollow terra cotta tile, laid up in cement and covered with sheet metal on the outside.

(1) The floor will be made of cement.

(2) All sash doors, frames and trim will be covered with metal.

(3) Proper skylights will be provided and glazed with wire glass.

A stand pipe will extend into the pent house, with hose connection.

The entire pent house will be constructed absolutely fireproof.

Four elevators will run up to level of main roofs.

The location of this pent house is back from the street lines, and the high man-

sard roof which rises above the main roof entirely conceals this pent house from view from the streets.

On motion, approved.
