## How Oysters are Helping New York City Combat Flooding and Sea Level Rise





Hurricanes Sandy and Ida have challenged New York's resilience to disasters and climate change, particularly in the realm of flooding. Since 2000, <u>tidal flooding has increased by 200%</u> in certain areas. This concern has pushed policy makers to find short-term and long-term solutions to mitigate climate-induced flooding. One nonprofit organization, the Billion Oyster Project, has partnered with several other organizations and restaurants to restore New York's eroded

harbor using recycled oyster shells.


Rising global temperatures have been shown to correlate with sea level rise. The Atlantic coast is particularly vulnerable to this worrisome trend due to the density of people living in urban, coastal plains. In fact, more than half of New York's residents live in coastal communities. Communities previously not impacted by flooding are now vulnerable. Sea level rise also impacts the natural ecosystem of New York City. Wetlands act as natural sponges and barriers to reduce the impact of flooding, however they are being destroyed by urbanization and development. The combination of sea level rise and loss of wetlands increase New York City's vulnerability to climate induced flooding.




**CERT Orientation with the Far Rockaway Arverne Nonprofit Coalition (FRANC)**

#### Bayside St. Patrick's Day Parade




