As a NYC CERT member, your top priorities are to be safe and prepared. Whether you are deployed as a volunteer or out with the kids to collect some candy, here are some tips to help you and your loved ones have better situational awareness this Halloween:

- 1. 5:30 PM 9:30 PM is prime time for trick-or-treaters.
- 2. Stay alert. Keep distractions to a minimum as you walk or drive.
- 3. If you are on foot, wear reflective gear or reflective tape, and carry a light source (*glow lights work well*).
- 4. Use the buddy system or keep in contact with someone so you can be accounted for at all times.
- 5. Use the crosswalks to assure your safety as you cross streets.
- 6. If you drive, turn on your headlights before the sun sets to help spot trick-or-treaters from greater distances.
- Take extra time... slow down and look in all directions; especially in residential neighborhoods and at intersections (even when the traffic lights and signs are in your favor).
- Teach your favorite trick-or-treater to make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of any vehicle, and to keep an eye out for cars' reverse lights.
- 9. Encourage your favorite trick-or-treaters to follow the above safety tips.
- Encourage your favorite tick-or-treaters to wait for collected treats to be inspected by a parent/guardian before consuming them.






#### Mike Miller Safety Fair 2023




#### **Queens Division 4 Monthly Team Meeting**

#### Manhattan Division 5 Monthly Team Meeting





# **THINGS TO KNOW**



## How To Request NYC CERT

If approached to support an event in your community, the following steps must be taken:

- Event organizer submits an official request using the <u>NYC CERT External Request Form</u>.
- NYC CERT Leadership *should not* submit form on behalf of the event organizer.
- For events lead by a NYC CERT Division, volunteer leadership (Ready New York Liaison, if a preparedness event) should submit this <u>Event</u> <u>Request form</u>

NYC CERT program staff will review all requests. If approved, program staff will add the volunteer opportunity to the <u>NYC CERT Event Calendar</u>

with a registration link. If more details are required for approval, program staff will use the contact information provided in the request form to connect with the organizer.


