NEW YORK CITY COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (NYC CERT) PROGRAM WELCOMES 33 NEW MEMBERS

New graduates are joining more than 1,200 volunteers to help their communities during emergencies

January 20, 2022 – The New York City Emergency Management Department welcomed 33 new Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) volunteers to its program during a virtual graduation ceremony on Tuesday, January 11. The NYC CERT basic training cycle includes 10 sessions that focus on disaster preparedness and emergency response, equipping volunteers with skills in basic fire safety, search and rescue, traffic management, and first aid and triage. New York City Emergency Management offered the training program with instructors from the New York City Fire Department (FDNY) and New York City Police Department (NYPD) Auxiliary Unit. New York City Emergency Management Acting Commissioner Christina Farrell was on-hand to deliver remarks at the ceremony. This marks the 19-year anniversary of the NYC CERT program.



Health & Safety Protocol

Update: All NYC CERT members MUST provide proof of vaccination (as per below protocol) or receive approval for an accommodation prior participating in any in-person CERT-related activity, including deployment.

Beginning **Tuesday, February 1, 2022**, volunteers who have not submitted appropriate documentation to meet the vaccine mandate and have not applied for a medical or religious reasonable accommodation through NYCEM will be placed as inactive and unscheduled from volunteer shifts until they are in compliance.

- To submit vaccination records, please e-mail an approved proof of vaccination to: CERTVaxVerification@oem.nyc.gov.
- To request a reasonable accommodation for either religious or medical please follow the steps <u>HERE</u>




