N. TAYLOR PHILLIPS, Esq., Secretary, Commissioners of the Sinking Fund:

SIR—On May 29, 1905, this Department acquired title to property at St. George, in the Borough of Richmond, in connection with the establishment of the Municipal Ferry between the Boroughs of Manhattan and Richmond. Since then we are in receipt of a communication from the President of the Borough of Richmond relative to a request made by him to you for the transfer of certain portions of the property.

After an examination of the request, I beg to advise that there is no objection, so far as this Department is concerned, to the transfer of certain portions of the property to the Borough President, and for this purpose I hereby surrender and turn over to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund for assignment to the President of the Borough of

Richmond, the parcels described as follows, shown in yellow on the map transmitted herewith, and ask that the assignment of the property be made subject to the approval of any plan of improvement by this Department, in so far as lines and grades are concerned, in connection with regulating, grading and paving the areas:

1st. The parcel designated as No. 2 on the map, "beginning at the northeasterly corner of South and Jay streets, and running thence northerly and along the easterly line of Jay street 599.37 feet to the easterly prolongation of the northerly line of Dekalb street.

"Thence deflecting to the right through an angle of 90 degrees and running along the easterly prolongation of the northerly line of Dekalb street 50 feet to a line drawn parallel with and 50 feet easterly from the easterly line of Jay street.

"Thence deflecting to the right through an angle of 90 degrees, and running southerly along said parallel line 617.91 feet to the northerly line of South street.

"Thence westerly and along said northerly line of South street 53.33 feet to the point or place of beginning."

2d. Parcel designated as No. 3 on the map, "beginning at a point in the northerly line of South street distant 53.33 feet easterly from the northeasterly corner of South and Jay streets, measured along the northerly line of South street, and running thence northerly and along a line drawn parallel with and distant 50 feet easterly from the easterly line of Jay street 36.26 feet to a line drawn parallel with and distant 67 feet northerly from the centre line of South street.

"Thence easterly and along said parallel line 183.88 feet.

"Thence deflecting to the left through an angle of 43 degrees 48 minutes and 10 seconds, and running northeasterly 398.22 feet to the bulkhead line approved by the Secretary of War in 1889.

"Thence southerly and along said bulkhead line 61.78 feet to a line drawn parallel with and distant 50 feet southeasterly from the last mentioned course.

"Thence southwestwardly and along said parallel line 358.92 feet to the northerly line of South street.

"Thence westerly and along said northerly line of South street 208.05 feet to the point or place of beginning."

3d. Parcel designated as No. 4 on the map, "beginning at a point in the centre line of South street where the southerly prolongation of the easterly line of Jay street intersects the same, and running thence northerly along said easterly line of Jay street 35.20 feet to the northerly line of South street.

"Thence easterly and along the northerly line of South street 261.38 feet.

"Thence deflecting to the right through an angle of 136 degrees 11 minutes and 50 seconds, and running southwestwardly 47.68 feet to the centre line of South street.

"Thence deflecting to the right through an angle of 43 degrees 48 minutes and 10 seconds and running westerly along the centre line of South street 214.73 feet to the point or place of beginning."

The three parcels above described in detail are described in one lot as follows:

Beginning at a point in the centre line of South street where the southerly prolongation of the easterly line of Jay street intersects the same, and running thence northerly and along said easterly line of Jay street 634.57 feet to the easterly prolongation of the northerly line of Dekalb street.

Thence easterly and at right angles with the easterly line of Jay street 50 feet to a line drawn parallel with and distant 50 feet easterly from the easterly line of Jay street.

Thence southerly and along said parallel line 581.65 feet to a point in the line drawn parallel with and distant 67 feet northerly from the centre line of South street.

Thence easterly and along said parallel line 183.88 feet.

Thence deflecting to the left through an angle of 43 degrees 48 minutes and 10 seconds and running northeasterly 398.22 feet to the bulkhead line, approved by the Secretary of War in 1889.

Thence southerly and along said bulkhead line 61.78 feet to a point in a line drawn parallel with and 50 feet southeasterly from the last-mentioned course.

Thence southwestwardly and along said parallel line 406.60 feet to the centre line of South street.

Thence deflecting to the right through an angle of 43 degrees 48 minutes and 10 seconds and running westerly along the centre line of South street 214.73 feet to the point or place of beginning.

The Borough President in his request made to you on May 29, 1905, referred to the four parcels which he desired possession of. The parcel which he designates as No. 1, and which he desires for a widening of Jay street from the northerly line of Dekalb street to Richmond terrace, is not within the jurisdiction of this Department; it is outside of the lines of the plan for the improvement of the water-front at St. George, and though purchased in connection with the other St. George property, was paid for out of the funds for Park and Street Openings.

The parcels designated as Nos. 2, 3 and 4 on the map do not agree with those asked for. In Parcel 3, the Borough President asked for a strip 100 feet in width. Such an assignment would seriously interfere with the execution of the new plan of improvement as proposed by this Department. It is very necessary that an approach from the ferry terminal to the present bulkhead at the foot of South street be constructed and widened, as well as an approach from South street itself to the bulkhead. If a 50-foot strip from South street to the bulkhead line is constructed by the Borough President, it is the purpose of this Department to extend this approach with a uniform gradient from the bulkhead line to the main ferry platform, as shown by yellow cross hatching on the map.

Again, this Department proposes to utilize for wharfage purposes the triangular space adjacent to the bulkhead, shown in red cross hatching on the map, and to construct an approach thereto from the main ferry platform 50 feet wide, as shown in blue cross hatching on the map. A street approach to this triangular area can be amply afforded by means of the area hatched in green on the map, which area formerly lay within the United States Lighthouse Reservation and which has, by act of Congress, been ceded to The City of New York.

This Department is committed to building an approach from South street to the bulkhead, and from the ferry platform to the bulkhead, as well as an approach from Jay street to the ferry platform. These are amply provided for by the areas shown in green, red and blue cross hatching and in solid yellow and yellow hatching. This could not be done if an area 100 feet in width, as asked for by the Borough President in his description of Parcel No. 3, were surrendered. A 50-foot approach will be ample and sufficient for team traffic when it is taken into consideration that an independent trolley and independent approaches for the steam railroad traffic will be provided.

The Commissioner of the Department of Docks and Ferries in a communication under date of August 30, 1905, states that on May 29, 1905, the City for his Department acquired title to property at St. George, in the Borough of Richmond, for the purpose of establishing a municipal ferry between that borough and the Borough of Manhattan; that subsequently thereto the President of the Borough of Richmond requested a transfer of certain portions of the property acquired for ferry purposes, namely, that portion shown on the map hereto annexed marked "Parcel 2," which is intended to be used for the widening of Jay street, and that portion shown on said map designated "Parcels 3 and 4," intended to be used for the widening of South street and as an approach to the ferry.

The said parcels being part of the general street improvements intended by the President of the Borough of Richmond and heretofore approved by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, and in said communication describes the various parcels by metes and bounds, which in said communication he turns over to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund for the purpose of having said premises assigned to the President of the Borough of Richmond, in accordance with the provision of section 205 of the Greater New York Charter.

I would respectfully recommend that a resolution be adopted accepting the property described in the communication from the Commissioner of the Department of

Docks, and assigning the same to the President of the Borough of Richmond for street and highway purposes.

Said assignment is made subject to the approval of any plan of improvement by the Department of Docks and Ferries in so far as lands and grades are concerned in connection with regulating, grading and paving the areas.

To the Executive Committee:

The Committee on Buildings respectfully reports that the City Superintendent has recommended the leasing of certain premises at No. 417 East Eighty-fifth street, Borough of Manhattan, as a kindergarten annex to Public School 77; that the Deputy Superintendent of School Buildings for the Borough states that the rental is reasonable, and that the Departments of Health and Buildings certify that the sanitary and structural conditions are satisfactory.

SIR—The Board of Education, at a meeting held July 31, 1905, adopted the following resolution:

"Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund be and they are hereby requested to authorize a lease of the entire basement of the premises No. 417 East Eighty-fifth street, Borough of Manhattan, as an annex to Public School 77, for a period of one year from August 15, 1905, with the privilege of renewal for an additional year at an annual rental of \$600; the lessor to furnish light, heat and janitor service, to pay the water taxes, to construct an exit to the yard of No. 415 East Eighty-fifth street, and to make all repairs to the exterior building. Owner, Mrs. Frances Gold (widow), No. 417 East Eighty-fifth street, Manhattan."

I have examined the premises mentioned above and have the honor to report as follows:

As will be seen by the papers attached hereto, these premises have been examined and approved for school purposes by the Health and Building Departments.

The building in question is a three-story and high basement brownstone dwelling, 12 feet 6 inches by 40 feet, with a one-story brick extension 12 feet 6 inches by 50 feet.

The front basement room, about 12 feet by 15 feet, is badly lighted, having only the light through the glass of the front door. Back of this room there is a space of about 12 feet by 25 feet, which is cut up into closets, etc., and is too dark for school use, but will serve as cloak rooms, etc. There is one toilet in the basement, and another may be constructed under the front stairway if necessary.

The brick extension, 12 feet 6 inches by 50 feet, has two rear windows and four skylights, and is well lighted and suitable for use as a kindergarten room. The room is unplastered, however, only plain brick walls and plain wooden beams overhead. It will therefore require plastering or otherwise fixing up before it can well be used for school purposes.

Mrs. Gold, the owner, has already had the doorway cut from this room into the yard of No. 415 East Eighty-fifth street, as a means of escape in case of fire.

The City is not yet in possession, and as it will take some time to fix up these rooms the rent should begin from the date of occupation instead of August 15. The rent asked by Mrs. Gold, \$600 a year, to include heat, light, water and janitor service and outside repairs, while full value, is not, in my opinion, excessive.

I would therefore respectfully recommend that a resolution be adopted by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund approving of a lease by the Board of Education of the basement floor of No. 417 East Eighty-fifth street, Manhattan, as a kindergarten annex to Public School 77, for one year from date of occupation, at a rental of \$600 a year, payable quarterly, with the right of renewal for another year at the same price; the owner to furnish heat, light, water and janitor service and to make all outside repairs. Lessor, Mrs. Frances Gold.

Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund be and they are hereby requested to authorize a lease of the premises at No. 61 Poplar street, Borough of Brooklyn, occupied as an annex to Public School 8, on a month to month basis from September 1, 1905, at a rental at the rate of \$300 per annum, said lease to be terminable on a thirty days' notice from either party, the other terms and conditions to remain the same as in the lease heretofore existing.

The Committee on Finance respectfully reports that the Board of Education has the financial ability to enter into the lease mentioned in the foregoing resolution.

SIR—The Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, at a meeting held on the 7th day of June, 1905, acting under a request of the Commissioner of the Department of Police, authorized the renewal of a lease of the premises on the corner of New Dorp lane and Eighth street, in the Borough of Richmond, for the use of the Police Department for a period of three years from September 1, 1905, upon the same terms and conditions as was contained in the then present existing lease, the premises being used by the Eightieth Sub-Precinct.

On August 28, or three days prior to the expiration of the lease, the owners of the property refused to renew the lease unless they received \$1,500 per annum. Evidently the Police Department had an interview with the owner, for on September 1 the Police Department was notified by the owner that he would renew the lease for a term of three years at an annual rental of \$1,350. In other words, the delay on the part of the owner to notify the Police Department that he would not again renew the lease on the same terms and conditions as was contained in the said lease until the then present existing lease had expired, made the City a hold-over tenant in the first instance, liable for a year's rent, or the owner could have evicted the City. As there are no available sites in the vicinity for departmental purposes, the City would have to remove its station to another locality.

If the Police Department could acquire a site in the vicinity, the cost of removal of furniture and fixtures and establishing a new headquarters would in money more than amount to the total increase in rental value.

I am therefore of the opinion and would recommend that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund amend their resolution of June 7, 1905, by authorizing a lease of the premises for a period of three years at an annual rental of \$1,350, and that the Police Commissioner be requested to obtain a site for the purpose of erecting thereon a police precinct station-house and stable, so that by the time this lease expires the City will not be at the mercy of another increase in rental value, which it seems to me is not warranted by real estate values.

At times witnesses are excluded from the court room and, having no room available, we are compelled to have them stand in the corridor, crowding the same; and at times the witnesses go out of the building, thereby interfering with the work of the Court.

The floor space available for the applicants is about 10 feet by 6 feet, and we are compelled to crowd as many as fifty people at one time in that space.

The increase in the business of the County Court certainly demands much more room than we now have, and inasmuch as Room 27 was taken away from us a few years ago to make room for the Supreme Court, and the small room given us at that time was recognized as a temporary makeshift, I believe that you will see our request to have Room 20 assigned to us is a reasonable one.

MUNICIPAL CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.

Municipal Civil Service Commission,
No. 61 Elm street,
New York, September 8, 1905.

A meeting of the Civil Service Commission of The City of New York was held on Friday, September 8, 1905, at 10 a. m., at the Commission's office, No. 61 Elm street. All the Commissioners were present.

The minutes of the meetings held August 29 and September 6 were approved.

The Committee on Transfers recommended that the transfer of Mrs. Mary J. Martin from the position of Bath Attendant in the office of the President of the Borough of Brooklyn to a similar position in the office of the President of the Borough of Manhattan, be approved. The recommendation of the Committee on Transfers was adopted.

A communication was presented from the Chief Examiner, with reference to the appeal of Mr. Robert E. Dooley, candidate for promotion to the rank of Inspector in the Police Department, stating that the same did not come within the provisions of Civil Service Rule IX., there having been no error made by the Examiners in rating the candidate's papers. The appeal was denied.

A communication was presented from the Chief Examiner, dated August 28, with reference to the appeal of Isaac Siegmeister, No. 212 Stone avenue, Brooklyn, for a re-rating of his examination for the position of Examiner of Sewer Claims, stating that the same did not come within the provisions of Civil Service Rule IX., for the reason that no error was made by the Examiners in rating the candidate's papers. The appeal was denied.

A communication was presented from the Chief Examiner, dated September 1, requesting instructions from the Commission as to whether or not the examination papers of Patrick J. Frisby and Frederick Voelker, candidates in the recent examination for Patrolman, should be rated, it being his opinion, after comparing the memory test papers of the two candidates, that one of them copied from the other. After a careful consideration of the matter, it appearing that there was no evidence that the candidates had communicated with each other, the Commissioners decided to give them the benefit of the doubt, and ordered the Chief Examiner to rate their papers.

The Secretary was instructed to proceed with an open competitive examination for the position of Keeper, it appearing that there were but five names upon the eligible list for that position.

On motion, it was

Resolved, That paragraph 12 of Rule VII., providing that "no person who has entered any examination for appointment to a competitive position and failed therein or who has withdrawn therefrom, shall be admitted within nine months from the date of such examination to a new examination for the same position," be and the same is hereby waived so far as it applies to the coming examination for Keeper of Menagerie.

The Secretary presented a communication from the Acting Corporation Counsel, under date of August 29, 1905, in answer to the Commission's request for information as to whether or not it had authority to limit a promotion examination in a City Department to those employed in the next lower grade in a particular bureau or subdivision of such department. The communication from the Acting Corporation Counsel concluded as follows:

"I advise that it is a matter of discretion vested in your Board to limit the applicants for a promotion examination in a department to a particular group holding positions immediately below the vacant place."

The communication was ordered filed.

A communication was presented, from the Acting Corporation Counsel, dated August 29, in answer to the request of the Commission for information on the following questions:

First—Whether the Commission had authority to limit the non-competitive examination of Volunteer Firemen in the locality to be absorbed by the Fire Department to those men who are between the ages of twenty-one and thirty years.

Second—Whether the eligible list made up as a result of such non-competitive examination is to take precedence over the present general eligible list for Firemen in the Fire Department.

In answer to the first question, the Acting Corporation Counsel stated as follows:

"I find that one section of the Charter, as amended, calls upon you to hold a non-competitive examination for those volunteer firemen in active service where the paid Fire Department is extended; secondly, I find a further provision that no one shall be appointed a member of the regular Fire Department who is not between the age of twenty-one and thirty years, except that a person may be over thirty years of age when he is actually appointed if he was only thirty years old when his name was placed on the eligible list."

"I have examined the act passed May 11, 1904, amending section 722 of the Charter and fail to find any such clear intent as would lead me to advise you that the Legislature desired to exempt the volunteer firemen to be appointed after this non-competitive examination from the limitations with regard to age contained in the act which became a law May 4, 1904, and which last mentioned act amended section 734 of the Charter."

"A final reason exists which precludes a construction in favor of the volunteer firemen, and that is: that the amendment to section 722 only gives them certain rights up to the actual certification for appointment. Section 739, as amended, then is to be considered as to the appointment and interposes the age limit and other restrictions on actual employment in violation of its terms."

"I therefore advise that the limitations contained in section 739 of the Charter as amended, apply to the volunteer firemen to be appointed from the list made up from the non-competitive examination called for by section 722 of the Charter as amended."

The Acting Corporation Counsel stated, in answer to the second question, as follows:

"I find that chapter 700 of the Laws of 1904, amending section 722 of the Charter, provides in part as follows:

"Whenever hereafter the paid fire department shall be extended into any part of the territory of the city of New York, as hereby constituted, in which now or hereafter there shall exist a volunteer fire department, such members of said volunteer fire department in said locality as may be in active service, shall, upon their passing a non-competitive examination for fitness, the conditions of which shall first be approved by the fire commissioner as prescribed by the municipal civil service commission rules, notice of which examination shall have been previously given by publication in the official papers of the borough in which the extension is proposed, be placed at the head of any eligible list certified for appointment and be preferred for appointment as firemen in the said department."

"I am of the opinion that this amending act contemplated that gradual extension of the Fire Department to cover the localities previously protected by the volunteer organizations, and that when the necessity arose for the appointment of quite a number of new men in the particular locality where the service was extended, that the former volunteers should be preferred. The valuable exemption given to volunteers from competition in the regular open examination for positions in the Fire Department must be strictly construed against them, and I fail to find any intent in the act so strong as to warrant my advising you that the eligible list made up as a result of this non-competitive examination should have precedence in all the different boroughs over the present regular eligible list."

"I therefore advise that the eligible list made up of this non-competitive examination should only have precedence over the regular eligible list for firemen in the particular locality where the service of the paid department is extended."

After carefully considering the advice of the Acting Corporation Counsel, the Secretary was instructed to arrange a special examination for the volunteer firemen in the Boroughs of Queens and Richmond under the following conditions:

Such examination to be limited to active members of volunteer fire companies in the Boroughs of Queens and Richmond; application to be made on a special blank, obtainable at the office of the Commission; no candidate to be placed upon the eligible list who is under the age of twenty-one years or over the age of thirty years; successful candidates to be placed on preferred eligible lists for appointment to positions in the boroughs in which they have served as volunteer firemen; all candidates to pass a physical examination carrying a weight of 50 per cent., and a mental examination carrying a weight of 50 per cent.; all candidates being required to receive 70 per cent. in each branch of the examination.

A communication was presented from the Deputy and Acting Fire Commissioner, dated August 30, requesting an examination for promotion to the rank of Foreman in the Fire Department, in order that existing vacancies might be filled. The request was granted, and the Secretary was instructed to proceed with the examination.

A communication was presented from the President of the Borough of Queens, dated August 24, requesting approval of a leave of absence, without pay, until September 30, 1905, granted Irving M. Clark, Transitman and Computer. It appearing from the certificate furnished that the said leave of absence was granted because of illness, the same was approved.

A communication was presented from the Assistant Secretary of the Board of Education, dated September 1, requesting approval of a leave of absence without pay, for six weeks, from July 31, 1905, granted Edward J. Dunn, Clerk. It appearing from the certificate furnished that said leave of absence was granted on account of illness, the same was approved.

A communication was presented from the Acting President of the Borough of Brooklyn, dated August 21, requesting amendment of the classification of positions in the Exempt Class in his department by adding thereto the title "Consulting Engineer." The President was requested to obtain additional information in regard to the request.

A communication was presented from the Acting Chairman of the Committee on Buildings, Department of Education, requesting the Commission to hold examinations for the following positions:

Architectural Draughtsman.
Electrical Draughtsman.
Heating and Ventilating Draughtsman.
Sanitary Draughtsman.

—and submitting a schedule of the requirements of the various positions which they desired to fill. It appearing that there was an eligible list in the office of the Commission for the position of Structural Steel Draughtsman, containing twenty-two names, the Secretary was instructed to communicate with the Chairman of the Committee on Buildings, and inquire how many persons it was the intention of his committee to appoint, and whether it would not be possible to obtain the services of such persons from the list for Structural Steel Draughtsman.

A communication was presented from the Acting President of the Borough of Richmond, dated August 24, requesting approval of a leave of absence without pay, from September 14, 1905, to July 16, 1906, granted Sherman M. Turrill, Transitman, in order that he might resume his duties as an instructor in civil engineering in Lehigh University. The request was denied, and the Secretary was instructed to communicate with Acting President Tribus, and inform him that, under the Civil Service rules, a leave of absence without pay for more than thirty days could only be allowed in cases of sickness.

A communication was presented from the Superintendent of Buildings, Borough of Brooklyn, requesting approval of the reassignment to duty of Alexander Pallas, Inspector of Plumbing, who had been absent for more than thirty days owing to illness, and transmitting a doctor's certificate. The reassignment was approved.

A communication was presented from the Commissioner of Public Works, Brooklyn, dated August 30, in answer to the request of the Commission for further information regarding the duties performed by James DuBois, Foreman Dockbuilder, whose employment had been complained of by the Civil Service Reform Association. The communication was ordered filed.

A communication was presented from the Commissioner of Street Cleaning, dated August 31, transmitting a report made by the District Superintendent in charge of the Borough of Brooklyn, with reference to "the quality of the labor which is recommended by the Civil Service Commission to the Commissioner of Street Cleaning." The letter was referred to the President for a reply.

A communication was presented from the Secretary of the Borough of Brooklyn, dated August 19, requesting approval of a leave of absence without pay, from July 21 to August 31, 1905, granted Bernard G. Barton, Topographical Draughtsman. It appearing from the doctor's certificate furnished that said leave of absence was granted on account of illness, the same was approved.

A communication was presented from the Secretary of the Department of Health, dated August 14, requesting approval of a leave of absence without pay from August 1, 1905, to January 31, 1906, granted Haven B. Bayles, M. D., Medical Inspector. It appearing from the doctor's certificate furnished that said leave of absence was granted because of illness, the same was approved.

A communication was presented from the Secretary of the Department of Public Charities, dated August 25, requesting permission to make a temporary appointment to the position of Architectural Draughtsman, at a salary of \$1,000 per annum, pending the establishment of a new eligible list for that position. The Secretary stated that there were a number of names on the existing eligible list for the position of Architectural Draughtsman, but that no person whose name appeared on the same was willing to accept an appointment in the Department of Public Charities, on account of the small salary offered. The letter was referred to the President, with the request that he obtain additional information regarding the proposed appointment.

The reports of the following Boards of Examiners for positions in the Non-Competitive Class were approved on the recommendation of the Chief Examiner.

Bellevue and Allied Hospitals, July 20, 21, 30, 30.
Brooklyn Disciplinary Training School, August 10.

On motion, it was

Resolved, That the salary of Elias B. Brindley, a Clerk in the office of the Commission, be and the same is hereby fixed at the rate of \$900 per annum, to take effect immediately.

A communication was presented from Mr. Richard O'Connor, No. 309 West One Hundred and Fourteenth street, City, candidate for promotion to the rank of Sergeant in the Police Department, requesting that he be given credit in said examination for a "Commendation" awarded him for meritorious services performed in connection with the "Slocum" disaster. The matter was referred to the Chief Examiner for a report.

A communication was presented from Mr. Gustavus L. Gabriel, a Bookkeeper in the Department of Finance, requesting to be informed as to his eligibility for an increase in salary without examination. The matter was referred to the President for consideration.

A communication was presented from Mr. Claude F. Curtis, a fifth grade Clerk in the office of the Commission, requesting an examination for promotion to the seventh grade, under the office title "Assistant Labor Clerk." The matter was referred to the President with power.

The resignations of the following-named persons from the position of Monitor in the Civil Service Commission were accepted:

B. A. Knoring, No. 1644 Madison avenue.

A communication was presented from Frederick M. Albers, M. D., No. 223 Madison street, Brooklyn, dated September 2, requesting reinstatement in the position of Monitor in the Civil Service Commission.

The request was denied.

The request of William I. Haring, No. 147 Morningside avenue, New York City, under date of August 26, that his name be restored to the eligible list for Janitor-Engineer, was denied, he having failed to respond to a notice of appointment sent him by the Board of Education on February 4, 1905.

A communication was presented from William P. Cunningham, No. 8 East Eighty-fifth street, dated August 29, requesting that he be granted a special test in arithmetic, he having failed to complete his arithmetic paper in the examination for Deputy Inspector of Weights and Measures, owing to the fact that he left the examination room before said paper was finished. The request was denied for lack of power.

A communication was presented from Samuel Geduld, No. 25 Clinton street, dated August 29, requesting that the papers submitted by him in the examination for promotion to Leveler in the Borough of Richmond be rated. The Secretary stated that Mr. Geduld competed in the examination on May 12, 1905, but that his papers were not rated for the reason that he had been but five months in the grade of Rodman at the time of the examination. It appearing that he had been the necessary six months in the grade at the time of the promulgation of the eligible list, his request was granted.

A communication was presented from John E. Smithers, No. 367 Walton avenue, The Bronx, dated August 28, requesting that he be certified as eligible for promotion to the fourth grade of Clerkship without further examination. The Secretary stated

that Mr. Smithers took an examination for promotion to the third grade of Clerkship and was promoted as a result of same to a salary of \$1,050 per annum on December 1, 1903. It appearing that Mr. Smithers was receiving the compensation for which he qualified by examination for promotion to the third grade, the Secretary was instructed to inform him that he could not be promoted to the fourth grade without further examination.

A communication was presented from "A Citizen and Taxpayer," stating that Ellen McGowan, who is now in charge of the comfort station at Greenpoint and Manhattan avenues, Brooklyn, is holding her position illegally, as she never passed a Civil Service examination for same, but was impersonated in the examination by her sister, Ann McGowan. The Secretary was instructed to forward a copy of the communication to the head of the department in which Miss McGowan is employed and ask that he investigate the matter immediately and report the result to the Commission.

A communication was presented from "A Citizen" protesting against the assignment of uniformed Firemen to inspect blasting operations in The City of New York, on the ground that he took an examination for a position in the Bureau of Combustibles and qualified for same, but was never appointed. The matter was referred to Commissioner Talley for investigation.

A communication was presented, signed "Veritas," alleging that James Cooney, a Watchman in the employ of the Fire Department, was being impersonated by a man named John Maher. The Secretary was instructed to refer the matter to Examiner Byrne for investigation.

A communication was presented, signed "One Who Knows," protesting against the dual employment of Miss Caroline Crumling in the positions of Summer School Teacher and Playground Attendant. It appearing that the work of the summer School Teachers was ended at the time the complaint reached the Commission, the letter was ordered filed.

A communication was presented from Morris L. Rosenwasser, No. 72 Avenue D, New York City, dated September 5, making the following sworn statement: That he was a candidate in the examination for Inspector of Licenses, and that he was successful in passing the examination with a standing of No. 26 on the eligible list; that recently he called at the office of the Commission to ascertain his status on the said list and was shown a letter, purporting to have been signed by him, declining appointment as Inspector of Licenses at the present time, owing to ill health; and stating that such letter was a forgery, as it was never written by him, nor had he authorized any other person to write such a communication; that, on the contrary, he was ready and willing to take the appointment whenever it was offered to him. The Secretary stated that Mr. Rosenwasser's name was certified to the Commissioner of Licenses as eligible for appointment to the position of Inspector of Licenses on May 25, 1905; that one of the three persons certified, other than Mr. Rosenwasser, was appointed by Commissioner Keating, and, upon receipt of a letter purporting to be sent by Morris L. Rosenwasser, his name was passed over when a new certification was asked for on June 16, 1905, the next three names on the eligible list being certified, and William Lustgarten of No. 314 Broome street, Manhattan, being appointed to the vacancy. On motion, the Secretary was instructed to communicate with the Commissioner of Licenses and inform him of the facts surrounding the certification and appointment of William Lustgarten to the position of Inspector of Licenses in his department, and to state that, as such certification and appointment were illegal, the appointment must be revoked immediately; and the Secretary was further instructed to make a new certification from the list for Inspector of Licenses containing the name of Mr. Morris L. Rosenwasser, giving the candidate the consideration to which he was legally entitled.

On motion, it was

Resolved, That the eligible list resulting from the examination for the position of Patrolman, held on June 1 and June 28, 1905, having been completed on August 24, 1905, the same is hereby announced by the Municipal Civil Service Commission as of that date, and the Secretary is hereby instructed to certify from same in answer to requisitions from the Police Commissioner for eligibles for appointment to the position of Patrolman in the Police Department.

The Commission then adjourned subject to the call of the President.

AN ORDINANCE granting to the Commonwealth Telephone Company the right and franchise to construct, operate and maintain in, upon and along the streets, highways and public places of The City of New York and the several boroughs thereof, wires, cables and other appliances proper and necessary for the purpose of carrying on a general telephone and telegraph business.

Be it Ordained by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of The City of New York as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Estimate and Apportionment of The City of New York hereby grants to the Commonwealth Telephone Company the right, franchise and privilege of constructing, operating and maintaining its wires, cables or other electrical conductors, together with the poles, fixtures and other appliances proper and necessary in the telephone business, in said City, through, over, under and along any and all of the streets, avenues, squares, parks and other public places within the limits of The City of New York, for the purpose of conducting a general telephone and telegraph business and for no other purpose; subject, nevertheless, to all the express terms and conditions hereinafter particularly set forth.

Sec. 2. The franchise hereby granted shall exist and continue for a term of twenty-five years from the date of this ordinance; subject, nevertheless, to a renewal and extension thereof for such further period as may be lawful and authorized by this Board upon a valuation thereof and of the lines and property then owned by the grantee or its successor, such value to be established either by arbitrators or to be mutually selected and agreed upon by and between the said grantee or its successor and the municipal authorities of The City of New York, then authorized by law to regulate, grant and determine public franchises, or, in the event of failure or inability to fix and establish such a valuation by arbitration, then same to be fixed either by judicial proceeding or in such manner as may be otherwise provided and established by law. For the purpose of fixing and establishing the valuation of the property and franchises contemplated by this ordinance, together with any extension thereof, within the said City of New York, and also for the purpose of determining the amount of earnings of the grantee hereunder and of fixing the proportion thereof payable to the said City of New York, the books, papers and corporate records of the said grantee shall at all times be open to the full inspection and examination of the Comptroller of The City of New York and of his subordinates thereunto specifically authorized.

Upon the expiration of the franchise hereby granted or of any extension thereof which may be hereafter made, The City of New York shall have the right to acquire for itself all the plant and property of the grantee or its successor in the streets, avenues, highways and public places of The City of New York, upon just compensation, to be established as hereinbefore specified.

Sec. 3. The rates for telephone service within the said City of New York which may be lawfully charged and collected by the said grantee or its successor are hereby fixed as follows; subject only to modification by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of The City of New York, but no change in the said rates shall be made within the period of five years from the date of this ordinance:

First—For telephone service contracted or paid for by the message and for toll service between the boroughs of said City:

For a call not exceeding five minutes in duration by connections wholly within any single borough of said City, not exceeding five cents.

For a call not exceeding five minutes in duration by connections between any two boroughs of said City, the boundaries of which are contiguous, not exceeding ten cents.

For a call not exceeding five minutes in duration by connections between any two boroughs of said City, the boundaries of which are not contiguous, not exceeding fifteen cents.

For the purpose of defining said boundaries between boroughs of said City all waterways intervening between boroughs shall be regarded as though the same did not exist.

Second—For telephone service contracted or paid for without limit as to number of messages per annum:

For business places within the Borough of Manhattan, not exceeding \$90 per annum.

For business places within the boroughs of Brooklyn and The Bronx, not exceeding \$75 per annum.

For business places within the boroughs of Queens and Richmond, not exceeding \$60 per annum.

For residences within the Borough of Manhattan, not exceeding \$30 per annum.

For residences within the boroughs of Brooklyn and The Bronx, not exceeding \$40 per annum.

For residences within the boroughs of Queens and Richmond, not exceeding \$30 per annum.

Sec. 4. In consideration of the grant of this franchise, the grantee or its successor shall render service and make payments to the said City of New York as follows:

First—It shall furnish for the exclusive use of said City and of the officers thereof, upon municipal business, free telephone stations connected with its exchanges as follows: In the Borough of Manhattan 300; in the Borough of Brooklyn 200; in the Borough of The Bronx 100; in the Borough of Queens 100; in the Borough of Richmond 50; service at each and all of said stations to be without charge to The City of New York for communications and connections wholly within a single borough of said City; service by con-

nections between stations in different boroughs to be at 50 per cent. of the rates hereinbefore fixed for toll connections between the said boroughs.

Second—The said grantee or its successor shall pay to The City of New York annually, at such date as may be fixed by this Board, a sum equal to 4 per cent. of its gross earnings for business within The City of New York for the first five years of said ordinance; 5 per cent. of its gross earnings for business within The City of New York for the second five years of said ordinance; 6 per cent. of its gross earnings for business within The City of New York for the remaining fifteen years of said ordinance.

Sec. 5. The said grantee shall construct, operate and maintain its telephone plant within The City of New York, in all respects in accordance with the rules and regulations now or hereafter to be adopted by the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity or by other duly authorized municipal authorities of The City of New York having jurisdiction in such matters; and this grant and franchise may not be transferred or assigned, except by and with the consent of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of the said City.

Sec. 6. Before this grant and franchise shall take effect the said telephone company shall duly execute under its corporate seal a contract and agreement with the said City of New York whereby by the said company shall obligate itself and its successor or successors to all the terms and conditions in respect of rates, service, payments to the City and otherwise hereinbefore set forth, which contract shall be approved by and filed with the Comptroller of The City of New York within ten days from the date of this ordinance.

Sec. 7. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

The percentage required is 75 per cent. on the technical paper and 70 per cent. on all.

Candidates who pass this examination successfully will be eligible for appointment to the lowest grade.

A second examination of candidates for the two upper grades will be held on October 17. At this examination a special paper will be set for each grade on which candidates will be required to obtain 75 per cent.

Candidates should not apply for this position unless they are ready to accept employment in any part of the State where their services may be needed. Certification will not be made from resulting eligible lists to any other Department, except, if necessary, to the Aqueduct Commission.

It is probable that within the next six months about 20 appointments will be made to the highest grade, about 30 to the next and about 50 to the lowest.

The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

Each bid or estimate shall be accompanied by the consent, in writing, of two householders or freeholders in The City of New York, or of a guaranty or surety company duly authorized by law to act as surety, and shall contain the matters set forth in the blank forms mentioned below.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless, as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money to the amount of five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.

For particulars as to the quantity and quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.
