BUREAU OF HIGHWAYS.

Contracts amounting to \$516,581.50, chargeable to appropriations, corporate stock and the Street Improvement Fund, were entered into by this bureau during the quarter. Contracts charged to budget appropriations were for paving blocks of various kinds, flagging, paving pitch, sand, gravel, lumber and road oil, used in the care and maintenance of highways. Those chargeable to other funds were for paving and repaving streets.

There were prepared 48 assessment lists for original improvements authorized and completed, of which 20, aggregating in value \$190,684.36, were sent to the Board of Assessors. Twenty profiles were also transmitted to the Board of Assessors. Twenty-five plans for new work were made, of which number 12 were for paving; there were also prepared 22 miscellaneous maps, tables and diagrams, and 58 sets of specifications.

Of reports for original improvements initiated in the Local Board upon petition of property owners, 78 were made, giving the estimated quantities of material required, estimated cost, and the assessed valuation of the real estate within the probable area of assessment according to the last preceding tax roll. Of this number 33 were for paving, 10 for regulating, grading and paving combined.

Assigning House Numbers—Assigned, 1,630; inspected, 127; notices served, 147; complaints of duplicates settled, 5; maps prepared (change of numbers), 1; streets served with paving notices, 25.

Repairs to Defective Pavements—Granite on concrete, 1,942 square yards; granite on sand, 5,111 square yards; Belgian block, 335 square yards; cobblestone, 258 square yards; wood block, 70 square yards; asphalt block, 174 square yards.

Restoring cuts made by corporations, plumbers, etc.—Granite on concrete, 1,073 square yards; granite on sand, 2,475 square yards; Belgian block, 214 square yards; cobblestone, 85 square yards; Medina, 114 square yards; asphalt block, 211 square yards; 6-inch concrete foundation, 2,968 square yards.

Sidewalk repairs—Bluestone walks, 51,877 square feet; cement walk, 1,521 square feet; brick walk, 155 square feet; bluestone curb, 64 lineal feet; bridging, 257 square feet.

Shaping up and repairing dirt and unimproved roadways—Macadam repairs, 866 square yards; macadam cleaned, 1,500 square yards; dirt roadways repaired (hand), 27,973 square yards; dirt roadways repaired (machine), 1,600 square yards; ash sidewalks, 18,943 square yards; sand removed, West 23d Street, Coney Island, 446 cubic yards.

In addition, there was considerable miscellaneous work, consisting of bridge repairs, drainage, miscellaneous trucking, repairing tools and equipment, filling wash-outs, removing incumbrances, etc.

Municipal Asphalt Plant.

The total plant product was: 1,266 boxes of wearing surface mixture, 11,900.40 cubic feet; 478 boxes of binder mixture, 4,660.5 cubic feet.

Work performed by gangs: 2,344.2 square yards asphalt laid; 4,413.3 cubic feet wearing surface mixture laid; 1,642.9 cubic feet binder surface; plant repairs, inspections, etc.

Chemical Testing Laboratories.

Hydraulic cements, 85 samples; asphalt surface mixtures, 11 samples; miscellaneous samples, 94.

Division of Incumbrances.

The total number of complaints received from all sources during the quarter was 632, divided as follows: Bureau of Complaints, 6; mail, 58; office, 73; inspectors, 398; police, 59; citizens, 38.

Incumbrances removed by the bureau: Signs, 66; boulders, 150; trees, etc., 148; posts, poles, etc., 19; miscellaneous (loads of earth dumped), 565; dangerous excavations made safe, 6; produce (bags), 16; incumbrances seized, 6; redemptions, 3.

Permits to the number of 1,405 were issued for: Building material on streets, 215; crosswalks, 284; vaults (new), 11; vaults (repairs), 38; cement walks, 17; driveways, 40; specials, 800.

The total number of permits to the various corporations to make openings in streets amounted to 2,585. Of this number 1,419 were granted to the Gas Company to lay mains and make repairs to gas services; 741 to the Edison Electric Illuminating Company to lay conduits, make repairs, etc.; 187 to the railroad companies, and 238 were miscellaneous permits. Also, 2,500 permits were issued to the various corporations for stringing wires, placing electric lights in signs, drawing cables, etc.

The Bureau of Highways collected during the quarter from plumbers and public service corporations for permits to open pavements, \$33,299.62; from public service corporations for repaving in railroad areas, \$65,623.66; for vault permits, \$1,070; for redemption of incumbrances, \$112.69; and special security deposits for the removal of building materials, etc., from the streets, \$2,200, making a grand total of \$102,305.97.

BUREAU OF SEWERS.

On December 31, 1913, there were 968,359 miles of sewers in the borough, and during the quarter there were built 28,600.43 linear feet of all sizes of sewers, or an equivalent of 5,417 miles, which makes the total mileage of sewers at the end of the quarter 973,776. The sizes of the different sewers constructed are as follows:

Vitrified pipe sewers, 8 inch to 30 inch (23,746.79 linear feet), 4,497 miles. Brick sewers, 30 inches to 186 inches (3,599.99 linear feet), 0.682 miles. Reinforced concrete sewers, 30 inches to 186 inches (1,253.65 linear feet), 0.238 mile. Total (28,600.43 linear feet), 5,417 miles.

Thirty-nine reports were made, 19 of which were for sewers to precede paving at a cost of \$51,300, the balance being for sewers petitioned for in the regular course, the estimated cost being \$346,850. These reports cover a total of 13.5 miles of sewers.

Assessment lists were prepared and forwarded to the Board of Assessors for 60 contracts, amounting to \$281,716.81, and 74 contracts, amounting to \$859,562.78, were completed and accepted up to the close of the quarter, but had not been sent to the Board of Assessors.

Division of Maintenance and Repairs.

Permits issued to make new connections, 504; permits issued for repairs to connections, 246; basins repaired, 259; manholes repaired, 217; lateral sewers examined, 1,339,660 linear feet; lateral sewers cleaned, 817,480 linear feet; large brick sewers cleaned, 4,105 linear feet; deposit removed from sewers, 1,003 cubic yards; lateral sewers repaired, 388 linear feet.

TOPOGRAPHICAL BUREAU.

The work done by this bureau during the quarter was as follows: 660,500 feet precise and approximate chaining; 582,500 feet approximate chaining; 78,000 feet precise chaining; 740 precise angles measured; 2,048 feet profiles for regulating, grading, etc. (original improvement of streets); 9,102 feet damage surveys; 34,737 feet line and grade stakes set (original improvement of streets); 192,800 feet precise line work; 54 monument points set; 6 monuments referenced; 50 monuments reset; 4 monument covers set; 31 cement walks cut to render monuments accessible.

A number of maps were completed and transmitted to this office affecting changes of the established elevation of streets, reduction in the width of streets, widening, locating and laying out, closing and discontinuing, etc., all requiring action by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment.

In addition, there was furnished considerable information in the preparation of statements of facts for submission to the Corporation Counsel for determination as to whether same were sufficient to authorize the City to commence public improvements without the need of condemnation proceedings.

BUREAU OF BUILDINGS.

Violations reported: Plastering, 7; defective plumbing and drainage, 225; defective construction and materials, 289; elevators, 20; erecting and altering without permit, 128; unsafe buildings, 47.

Notices Issued: Removal of violations, 649; removal of unsafe buildings, 47; repairing passenger elevators, 20.

Twenty-six complaints were received, and, upon investigation, remedied.

Passenger elevators to the number of 1,090 were inspected, of which 20 were found not in compliance with the law.

There were filed 504 plans for new construction affecting 921 buildings, the estimated cost of which was \$8,865,085. Fifty of these plans were for 169 one-family brick buildings, at an estimated cost of less than \$20,000 each, total, \$645,400; 52 were for 130 two-family brick buildings, each to cost not less than \$20,000, total, \$574,000; 97 were for 119 tenements, each to cost over \$20,000, total, \$4,272,500; 16 were for 48 tenements, each to cost less than \$20,000, total, \$374,900; 8 were for brick stores, to cost less than \$15,000, total, \$15,800; 34 were for 69 two-family brick houses with stores, total cost, \$387,400; 4 were for 4 office buildings, total cost, \$98,500; 14 were for factories and workshops, total cost, \$857,400; 2 were for churches, total cost, \$111,000; 3 were for public buildings, total cost, \$370,300; 12 were for places of amusement, hotels, lodging houses, etc., total cost, \$250,300; 28 were for brick stables and garages, total cost, \$107,550; 16 were for miscellaneous brick buildings, such as ash stations, etc., total cost, \$58,575; 81 were for 146 one-family frame buildings, total cost, \$376,800; 28 were for 74 two-family frame dwellings, total cost, \$171,000; 4 were for 11 frame tenements, total cost, \$72,700; 3 were for frame two-family buildings with stores, total cost, \$5,900; 2 were for frame factories and workshops, total cost, \$2,500; 51 were for 63 frame structures of a miscellaneous nature, total cost, \$111,660.

New buildings in progress during the quarter, 107; alterations in progress, 1,367; new buildings commenced, 569; new buildings completed, 566; alterations commenced, 741; alterations completed, 518.

DIVISION OF SUBSTRUCTURES.

Surveys have been completed in Myrtle ave., between Washington and Bedford aves.; in Flushing ave., between Washington and Bedford aves.; in Taaffe place, between Flushing and Willoughby aves., and parts of intersecting streets, in all three miles.

Investigations of substructures were in progress in the area bounded by Metropolitan ave., Driggs ave., Division and Kent aves. These surveys and investigations were made in connection with the selection of the definite location for the water mains for the proposed extension of the high pressure fire service by the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity.

Requests for subsurface information were made and furnished to the International Cork Co., the New York Dock Co., the Public Service Commission, the Bureau of Franchises, Bureau of Sewers, Flatbush Water Co., New York Telephone Co., Edison Co., Austin Ludlam, City Surveyor, and H. G. Dangler, architect.

Additional information was asked by the Boroughs of Queens and Richmond concerning the work of our substructure division, and every courtesy was extended to the representatives of these boroughs.

Added to the map files of this Division were 135 maps including final contract drawings from the Public Service Commission (Sewer Division), dead gas mains and services of the Flatbush Gas Co. laid prior to the paving of streets, a complete set of maps showing the reconstructed cable conduit of the Postal Telegraph Cable Co., maps from the New York Telephone Co., Water Co., Brooklyn Rapid Transit Co., Fire Department and final maps on franchise grants completed during the quarter.

Applications for permits to open street surfaces to make changes, repairs and new installations numbering 2,628, were referred by the various public service corporations for approval.

BUREAU OF PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND OFFICES.

Supplies amounting to \$16,003.18 were purchased on open market orders, and six contracts were entered into at a cost of \$73,588.66.

There was received during this period from the public baths and comfort stations \$4,450.42, which was credited to the General Fund.



Amendments to Sanitary Code.

AT A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF Health of the Department of Health, held November 24, 1914, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That Section 182 of the Sanitary Code be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 182. No opium, morphine, chloral, or cannabis indica, or any other substance giving a physiological reaction similar to that of opium; or any salts, alkaloids, or derivatives, of any of the said drugs or substances; or any preparation, compound, or mixture, containing any of the said drugs or substances or their salts, alkaloids, or derivatives; shall be sold at retail or given away in the City of New York except upon the written prescription of a duly licensed physician, veterinarian, or dentist.

The foregoing provisions shall not, however, apply to preparations, compounds, or mixtures, containing any of the aforesaid drugs or substances or their salts, alkaloids, or derivatives, prepared for external use only, in the form of liniments, ointments, oleates, or plasters.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH BUILDINGS, ETC., WILL BE SOLD FOR REMOVAL FROM CITY PROPERTY.

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 shall be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless, as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The amount shall be as specified in the proposals or instructions to bidders and shall not be in excess of 5 per cent.
