BUDGET FOR 1901.

[PRESSURED AS REQUIRED BY SECTION 226 OF THE GREATER NEW YORK CHARTER.]

Resolved. That, pursuant to the provisions of section 226 of the Greater New York Charter, the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, by the administrative vote of all the members thereof, makes the the Budget of The City of New York for the year one thousand nine hundred and one, being: First, the amounts estimated to be required to pay the expenses of conducting the public business of said city for the said year; secondly, the amounts estimated to be required to pay the State taxes and charges and expenses of the counties of New York, Kings, Queens and Richmond, for the said year, and, thirdly, the amount audited pursuant to the provisions of chapter 525 of the Laws of 1897, and which, according to the provisions of said act, is to be raised by faxation levied upon the taxable property in the Thirty-second Ward of the Borough of Brocklyn, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of ninety-eight million one hundred thousand four hundred and thirteen dollars and borty-three cents (\$98,100,413,43).
