AN ORDINANCE to amend the regulations of the Municipal Explosives Commission, the same being a chapter of the Code of Ordinances, relating to Garages.

Be It Ordained by the Board of Aldermen of The City of New York, as follows:

Section 1. Section 370a is hereby added to the regulations of the Municipal Explosives Commission, reading as follows:

Sec. 370a. No garage permit for the storing of motor vehicles containing volatile inflammable oil in their fuel tanks shall be issued for any building, shed or enclosure, unless that portion of such building, shed or enclosure in which such motor vehicles are stored is constructed of fire-resisting material; the provisions of this section to apply only to premises where no volatile inflammable oil is stored, and which are situated:

(a) Within 25 feet of the nearest wall of a building occupied as a tenement house, church, hotel, place of public amusement or assembly, school, wholesale drug store, premises where dry goods or other highly inflammable materials are manufactured or kept for sale, cleaning and dyeing establishments, or any premises where combustible fibres are stored.

(b) Within 50 feet of any premises where ammunition or fireworks are manufactured or stored; where inflammable or combustible mixtures, paints, varnishes, lacquers or matches are manufactured or stored in wholesale quantities; where nitro-cellulose products are used for further manufacture, or where inflammable motion picture films are manufactured or stored in quantities aggregating more than 10,000 feet.

(c) Within 100 feet of any premises where calcium carbide is manufactured or stored in quantities exceeding 120 pounds; or where gases under pressure are manufactured or stored in quantities greater than 250 cubic feet.

(d) Within 200 feet of a magazine for the storage of explosives, of the First, Second, Third or Fourth Class.

The provisions of this section may be modified by special permit issued by the Fire Commissioner, when in his judgment the strict enforcement thereof would work undue hardship.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

No. 278.

AN ORDINANCE to amend section 97 of the Building Code relating to dumb-waiter shafts.

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of The City of New York as follows: Section 97 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 97. Dumbwaiter Shafts.—All dumbwaiter shafts hereafter created in any building, except such as do not extend more than three stories above the cellar or basement in dwelling houses, shall be inclosed in suitable walls of brick or burnt-clay blocks, set in iron frames of proper strength, or fireproof blocks, strengthened with metal dowels, or such other fireproof material and form of construction as may be approved by the [Commissioner] Superintendent of Buildings having jurisdiction. Said walls or construction shall extend at least three feet above the roof and be covered with a skylight at least three-fourths the area of the shaft, made with metal

frames and glazed. All openings in the inclosure walls or constructions shall be provided with self-closing fireproof doors. When the shaft does not extend to the floor level of the lowest story, the bottom of the shaft shall be constructed of fireproof material.

In all existing buildings where the dumb-waiter shaft extends into the cellar or lowest story, it shall be inclosed in that story with walls of brick eight inches thick; all openings in said walls shall be provided with self-closing fireproof doors.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

"Resolved, That the resolution adopted by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment January 12, 1906, which reads as follows:

"Resolved, That for the purpose of defraying any minor or incidental expenses contingent to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, the Secretary may, by a requisition, draw upon the Comptroller for a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500)."

"The Secretary may in like manner renew the draft as often as may by him be deemed necessary, to the extent of twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500) during each year, from the appropriation set apart for the expenses of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, but no such renewal shall be made until the moneys paid upon the preceding draft shall be accounted for by the Secretary, by the transmittal of a voucher or vouchers, certified to by the heads of the Bureaus of the said Board, covering the expenditure of money paid thereon."

—be and the same is hereby amended by striking out therefrom the words 'to the extent of twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500),' and inserting in place thereof the words 'to the extent of five thousand dollars (\$5,000).'"

—be and the same is hereby further amended by striking therefrom the words and figures "five hundred dollars (\$500)," and inserting in place thereof the words and figures "one thousand dollars (\$1,000)."

No. 280.

AN ORDINANCE regulating fences, signs, billboards, roof signs, advertisements and other structures in The City of New York.

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of The City of New York as follows:

Section 1. All fence, billboard and sign structures erected upon the ground and all roof sign structures shall be erected entirely within the building line and be properly secured, supported and braced and shall be so constructed as not to be or become dangerous.

Section 2. Ground Sign Structures—(1) No ground fence, billboard or sign structure within the fire limits of The City of New York as now or hereafter constituted, shall be at any point over twelve feet above the adjoining ground, except that when the face of any such structure, excepting the ornamental moulding thereof, shall be constructed entirely of metal or of wood covered on all sides with sheet metal, such structure shall not be at any point over twenty-four feet above the adjoining ground.

(2) Any person, firm or corporation that shall occupy any vacant lot or premises with a billboard or other advertising ground structure or device, shall be subject to the same duties and responsibilities as the owner of such lot or premises with respect to keeping the same clean, sanitary, inoffensive and free and clear of all noxious substances in the vicinity of such billboard, structure or device; and with respect to the removal of snow from the sidewalk and curb in front thereof.

Section 3. Roof Sign Structures—(1) All roof sign structures shall be so constructed as to leave a clear space of at least seven feet between the roof level and the lowest part of such structure and at least five feet between the vertical supports thereof; such structures shall be set back at least six feet from the face of the front and rear walls and shall not interfere with any openings in the roof or with any fire escape. Such structures, excepting the ornamental surface moulding thereof, shall be constructed entirely of metal, including the uprights, supports and braces for same, and shall be required to bear a wind pressure of not less than thirty pounds to the square foot of area subject to wind pressure.

(2) No roof sign structure having a tight, closed or solid surface shall be at any point over thirty-one feet above the roof level. Roof sign structures not having a tight closed or solid surface may be erected upon fireproof buildings to a height not exceeding seventy-five feet above the roof level, and upon non-fireproof buildings to a height not exceeding fifty feet above the roof level, but the portions of such structures covered and exposed to wind pressure shall not exceed thirty-five per cent. of the total area.

Section 4. Signs on Walls of Buildings—(1) No sign shall be so erected as to cover the doors or windows of any building or otherwise prevent free ingress or egress to or from any window, door or fire escape on any building in The City of New York.

(2) No sign shall be erected upon the front, rear or side wall of any building so as to project above either the roof cornice or parapet wall or above the roof level where there is no cornice or parapet wall; except that a sign erected at a right angle to the building wall, the horizontal width of which sign parallel to such wall does not exceed two feet may be erected to a height not exceeding two feet above the roof cornice or parapet wall or above the roof level where there is no cornice or parapet wall. A sign attached to a corner and parallel to the vertical line of such corner, shall be deemed erected at a right angle to the building wall.

(3) No electric sign as defined in the Electric Sign Ordinance approved July 24th, 1912, the horizontal width of which sign parallel to the building wall shall exceed two feet, and no part of or appendage to any such sign shall project more than three feet beyond the building line.

Section 5. Unlawful Structures—Upon the adoption of this ordinance the fire department of The City of New York shall notify by registered mail the owner or lessees of any sign structure attached at other than a right angle to the wall of the building and extending outside the building line and projecting above the roof cornice or parapet wall or above the roof level where there is no cornice or parapet wall, and of any sign structure which shall be so erected as to prevent free ingress and egress to and from any door, window or fire escape of any building, to remove or alter such structures so as to comply with this ordinance. If such order is not complied with within sixty days, The City of New York shall remove such structure at the expense of such owner or lessee.

Section 6. Permits—(1) No ground-sign or roof-sign structure shall be erected unless plans and specifications, showing the dimensions, material and details of construction, accompanied by the written consent of the owner or owners, lessee or lessees of the property upon which it is to be erected, shall have been filed with the Superintendent of Buildings having jurisdiction, nor until a permit for its erection shall have been obtained from such Superintendent of Buildings. In the case of a sign structure illuminated by electricity, a certificate must also be procured from the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, certifying that the electric wiring and electric appliances of the proposed sign are in conformity with the rules and regulations of that department.

(2) Before any permit shall be issued under this ordinance, a permit fee shall be paid to the Bureau of Buildings as follows: For ground structures, \$2; for roof structures having a tight, closed or solid surface, \$5; for roof structures not having a tight, closed or solid surface, \$10. Every structure for which a permit is issued shall be inspected at least once in each calendar year by the Bureau of Buildings.

Section 7. Registration and Identification—Every ground-sign and roof-sign structure, existing or hereafter erected, shall be registered with the Bureau of Buildings of the Borough in which such structure is situated by the person, firm or corporation maintaining the same, and shall have displayed upon the front thereof the name and address of such person, firm or corporation, and the serial number of the permit issued for such structure. The Bureau of Buildings may issue permits in several series so as to distinguish between existing structures and new structures

erected in conformity with this ordinance, or between various classes of structures, and may prescribe suitable regulations not inconsistent herewith concerning the form and contents of the applications for various classes of permits. Permits shall be issued for existing structures not conforming to the requirements of this ordinance, provided such structures are erected in conformity with the legal requirements in effect when they were erected, but no fees shall be charged for permits or registration for such existing structures.

Section 8. Unsafe Structures—Should any fence, sign, bill board or roof-sign structure be or become insecure or in danger of falling or otherwise unsafe, in the opinion of the Bureau of Buildings, the owner thereof or the person maintaining the same shall upon notice from said bureau, immediately in case of immediate danger and in any case within ten days, secure the same under the supervision of and in the manner to be approved by said Bureau in conformity with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 9. Alteration of Existing Sign Structures—No existing fence, sign, bill-board or roof-sign structure shall be enlarged, rebuilt, structurally altered or relocated unless or until it shall comply with the provisions of this ordinance. This shall not apply to the relettering or rewiring of illuminated signs.

Section 10. Exceptions—(1) No part of this ordinance shall apply to walls constructed wholly or principally of stone, marble, brick, terra cotta, concrete or other like material composing a masonry or monolithic wall, back yard fences on the ground in the interior of a court, picket fence and ornamental metal fences.

(2) No part of this ordinance except section 4 shall apply to signs, showbills and other boards permitted by and erected in compliance with section 260 of the General Ordinances of The City of New York or to electric signs permitted by and erected in compliance with the provisions of the Electric Sign Ordinance approved July 24th, 1912.

Section 11. Penalty and Abatement—(1) No fence, sign, billboard or roof-sign structure shall be erected in The City of New York except as in this ordinance provided under a penalty of \$100 for each offense. No such structure shall be maintained in The City of New York contrary to the provisions of this ordinance under a penalty of \$10 for each day or part of a day the same shall be so maintained.

(2) In addition, any fence, sign, billboard or roof-sign structure erected or maintained in violation of this ordinance shall be subject, upon notice, to abatement by the Bureau of Buildings having jurisdiction.

Section 12. Except as expressly hereinbefore provided in section 5 hereof, this ordinance shall have no retroactive effect.

Section 13. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

No. 283.

AN ORDINANCE repealing sections 310, 311, 312, 313 and 314, relating to public carts and cartmen, and substituting a new ordinance in lieu thereof.

Be It Ordained by the Board of Aldermen of The City of New York as follows:

That sections 310, 311, 312, 313 and 314 of the Code of Ordinances be and the same hereby are repealed and the following ordinance substituted in lieu thereof:

Section 310. This shall be known as the Public Cart Ordinance, and shall apply to vehicles and persons as enumerated herein.

Every vehicle, of whatever construction, drawn by animal power or propelled by any motor power, kept for hire or used to carry merchandise, household or office furniture, or other bulky articles within The City of New York for pay, shall be deemed a Public Cart, and the owner thereof shall be deemed a Public Cartman.

The Commissioner of Licenses is hereby empowered to appoint such Inspectors as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this ordinance and such Inspectors shall be paid such compensation as shall be fixed by law.

Public carts shall be divided into two classes, i. e., motor driven public carts and horse drawn public carts.

Horse drawn public carts shall be divided into two classes:

Class A—To include all public carts drawn by one horse and having an inside floor space of at least 40 square feet.

Class B—To include all public carts drawn by two or more horses and having an inside floor surface of at least 70 square feet.

Motor driven public carts shall be divided into two classes:

Class F—To include all motor driven public carts having an inside floor surface of at least 70 square feet.

Class G—To include all motor driven public carts having an inside floor surface of at least 90 square feet.

In all of the above four measurements, a variation of not more than 5 per cent. will be accepted.

The following annual license fees shall be paid:

All public carts in Class A shall pay a fee of.....	\$2 00
All public carts in Class B shall pay a fee of.....	2 00
All public carts in Class F shall pay a fee of.....	5 00
All public carts in Class G shall pay a fee of.....	5 00

Such license fees shall be in lieu of and not in addition to any fees heretofore established, and except as above provided, no charge shall be made.

Application for licenses for public carts shall be made by the owner upon blank forms furnished by the Department of Licenses and such application shall contain the full name and address of the owner and such other information in regard to the vehicle and its owner as the Commissioner of Licenses may deem advisable. Upon the payment of the license fee herein provided, said vehicle shall be licensed by delivering to the owner a form of license blank approved by the Commissioner of Licenses, together with a plate to be affixed to a conspicuous and indispensable part of such Public Cart, on which plate shall be clearly set forth the official number of the public cart with the words "Public Cart," and the design or color of this plate shall be changed at the beginning of each license year, which shall be August first of each year.

The Department of Licenses shall keep a register of the name and address of each person owning or operating a public cart under this ordinance, together with the license number of the same, description and necessary dimensions of such vehicle, and such record shall be open to the inspection of the public at reasonable times and shall be a public record, and extracts from it may be certified to by the Commissioner of Licenses of his Deputy, duly authorized for use as evidence.

Section 311. The amount to be charged for loading, transporting, or transmitting and unloading of merchandise, household or office furniture, or other bulky articles, made by a public cartman, may be agreed upon in advance and such contract or agreement shall control and regulate the employment. In every case where such agreement is entered into, it shall be the duty of the public cartman to furnish the person with whom he contracts a written memorandum, to be signed by both parties or their responsible and authorized representatives, setting forth clearly the terms of the contract. This memorandum shall be upon blanks to be approved by the Department of Licenses.

The legal rates for transporting merchandise, household or office furniture, or other bulky articles (other than pianos), including the loading and unloading thereof, unless otherwise agreed upon as set forth in the foregoing paragraph, shall be as follows, said charges to commence from the time of arrival of vehicle or vehicles at the place from which articles are to be transported, and to end when articles are delivered;

Where a vehicle drawn by one horse, and having an inside floor surface of at least forty square feet (including the driver thereof), is used, \$1.25 per hour, said vehicle to be propelled at not less than three miles an hour.

Where a vehicle drawn by two or more horses, and having an inside floor surface of at least seventy square feet (including the driver thereof), is used, \$1.50 per hour, said vehicle to be propelled at not less than three miles an hour.

Where a motor-driven vehicle, having an inside floor surface of at least seventy square feet (including the driver thereof), is used, \$1.75 per hour, said vehicle to be propelled at not less than eight miles an hour.

Where a motor-driven vehicle, having an inside floor surface of at least ninety square feet (including the driver thereof), is used, \$2.50 per hour, said vehicle to be propelled at not less than eight miles an hour.

For the services of each man in addition to the operator or driver, 50 cents per hour.

The number of men to be engaged on any one job or operation is not to exceed four, including the driver, except when especially agreed upon by the person hiring the public cart.

In case any vehicle, while engaged in the transportation of merchandise, household or office furniture, or other bulky articles, should break down or become disabled through any cause, no charge shall be made for the period of such disability.

Where a piano is transported in the same public cart as other articles of household or office furniture, and is part of the same operation or job, an additional charge of not exceeding \$1.50 may be made for transporting it.

Where a piano is transported as a separate operation or job and the distance travelled is three miles or less, the charge therefor shall not exceed \$3, including labor and use of vehicle therefor; for each additional mile or part thereof, 50 cents.

For transporting pianos either up or down one or more flights of stairs, 50 cents for each flight.

For transporting pianos up or down, by means of elevator, \$1 additional.

Where the handling of a piano involves the use of a hoist, tackle and rigging at either or both ends of the operator or job, a charge or not more than \$5 additional will be permitted.

Section 312. All disputes as to the rate or amount of compensation shall be adjusted by the police officer in charge of the police station nearest to the place where such dispute is had. On failure to abide by the decision, the said load or a part thereof sufficient to secure charges shall be taken to a convenient storage warehouse and a notice, in writing, with a brief statement of particulars, shall be sent at once by the public cartman to the Department of Licenses.

A notice, in writing, with a brief statement of particulars, shall be sent at once by the public cartman to the Bureau of Licenses.

No. 285.

AN ORDINANCE in relation to vacations for employees of The City of New York. *Be it Ordained by the Board of Aldermen of The City of New York, as follows:*

Section I. The executive heads of the various departments and bureaus thereof of the city of New York, including the Department of Education, shall grant to every employee of The City of New York, for whom provision is made for continuous or yearly service, a vacation of not less than two calendar weeks in each year; provided, however, that if an employee described in this section has been less than one year in the City service, it shall be within the discretion of the executive head of the department or bureau where he is employed to grant the vacation provided by this section.

Section II. Such vacation, except as provided by Section III hereof, may be extended for such period of time as the duties, length of service, and other qualifications of any employee may warrant.

Section III. A vacation shall be granted during the months of June, July, August and September to each per diem employee who has been in the City service for at least one year prior to each June 1st, and during said year has actually worked for a period of at least 150 days in the aggregate, and who shall waive all claims to any rights or privileges under Chapter 121, Laws of 1913. Said vacation shall consist of one day for each 25 days that said employee has actually worked during the said year. This section shall not apply to per diem employees who are engaged to furnish professional or expert services at a per diem rate.

Section IV. The heads of the various departments and bureaus may fix the time when said vacations shall be given, except that per diem employees shall only be given vacations during the months of June, July, August and September.

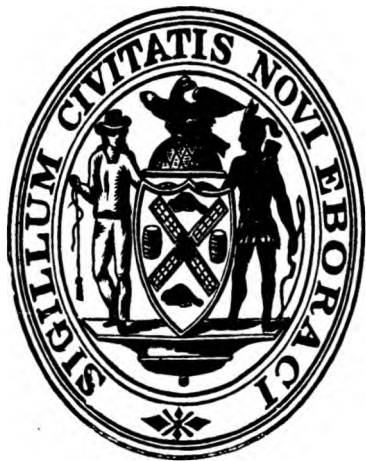

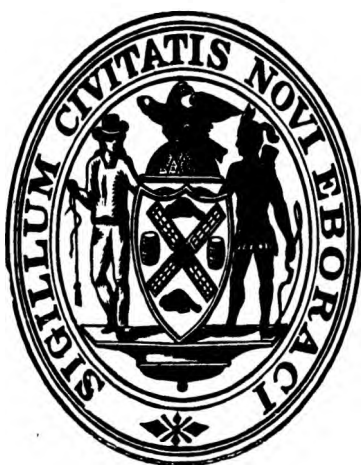

FRANCHISE MATTERS.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT at the meeting of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment held on June 5, 1914, the following resolutions were adopted:

Whereas, The Yonkers Electric Light and Power Company, the Westchester Lighting Company, the New York Edison Company, and the United Electric Light and Power Company have, under date of May 28, 1913, made joint application to this Board for the grant of the right, privilege and franchise to construct, maintain and operate ducts, conduits, poles and towers and the necessary fixtures attached thereto, upon a route along the Catskill Aqueduct lands between The City of New York and the boundary line between the Counties of Westchester and Putnam, and to place wires therein or thereon for the purpose of supplying electrical power; and

Whereas, Sections 72, 73 and 74 of the Greater New York Charter, as amended by Chapters 629 and 630 of the Laws of 1905, and Chapter 467 of the Laws of 1914, provide for the manner and procedure of making such grants; and

Whereas, In pursuance of such laws, this Board adopted a resolution on June 9, 1913, fixing the date for public hearing thereon as July 10, 1913, at which citizens were entitled to appear and be heard, and publication was had for at least two (2) days in the "New York Press" and "The Sun," newspapers designated by the Mayor, and in the City Record for ten (10) days immediately prior to the date of hearing, and the public hearing was duly held on such day; and

Whereas, This Board has made inquiry as to the money value of the franchise or right applied for and proposed to be granted to The Yonkers Electric Light and Power Company, Westchester Lighting Company, The New York Edison Company and The United Electric Light and Power Company, and the adequacy of the compensation proposed to be paid therefor, now, therefore, it is

Resolved, That the following form of the resolution for the grant of the franchise or right applied for by The Yonkers Electric Light and Power Company, Westchester Lighting Company, The New York Edison Company and The United Electric Light and Power Company, containing the form of proposed contract for the grant of such franchise or right, be hereby introduced

and entered in the minutes of this Board, as follows, to wit:

Resolved, That the Board of Estimate and Apportionment hereby grants to The Yonkers Electric Light and Power Company, Westchester Lighting Company, The New York Edison Company and The United Electric Light and Power Company the franchise or right fully set out and described in the following form of proposed contract for the grant thereof, embodying all the terms and conditions, including the provisions as to rates and charges upon and subject to the terms and conditions in said proposed form of contract contained, and that the Mayor of The City of New York be and he hereby is authorized to execute and deliver such contract in the name and on behalf of The City of New York, as follows, to wit:

PROPOSED FORM OF CONTRACT.

THIS CONTRACT, made this day of 1914, by and between The City of New York (hereinafter called the City), party of the first part, by the Mayor of said City, acting for and in the name of said City, under and in pursuance of the authority of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of said City (hereinafter called the Board), and The Yonkers Electric Light and Power Company (hereinafter called the Yonkers Company), the Westchester Lighting Company (hereinafter called the Westchester Company), The New York Edison Company (hereinafter called the Edison Company), and The United Electric Light and Power Company (hereinafter called the United Company), parties of the second part (which companies when referred to collectively are hereinafter called the grantees), witnesses:

Whereas, it is essential that high tension electric power be available at all times for the purpose of unwatering the pressure tunnels of the Catskill Aqueduct, constructed pursuant to Chapter 724 of the Laws of 1905 and acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto (hereinafter referred to as the Catskill Aqueduct); the points where power for this purpose is required being:

(a) At or near Croton Lake;

(b) At Shaft No. 21 of the City Aqueduct, situated at or near the intersection of Clinton and South Streets, in the Borough of Manhattan, and

(c) At Shaft No. 11 of the City Aqueduct, situated in Morningside Park, between 120th and 121st Streets, if the same were extended, in the Borough of Manhattan; and

Whereas, Low tension electrical current will be necessary for the operation of the gates and other plant and machinery at the Kensico and Hill View gate houses, at the various siphon chambers and elsewhere and for the lighting of bridges, gate-houses, offices and other buildings and adjacent grounds along the line of the Catskill Aqueduct; and

Whereas, The United Company, the Yonkers Company and the Westchester Company are each engaged in the manufacture and distribution of electric current within certain areas along the Catskill Aqueduct; and

Whereas, The Edison Company is engaged in the manufacture and distribution of electric current for general commercial purposes within the Boroughs of Manhattan and The Bronx, and owns the stock of The Yonkers Company, and is affiliated with The United and the Westchester Companies, and is willing to join with said Companies in guaranteeing that such electric service shall be furnished to the City; and

Whereas, The Edison, United, Yonkers and Westchester Companies have joined in a petition to the Board in which each severally requests that the Board grant to each Company the right or franchise within the territory in which it operates to construct, maintain and use ducts, conduits, poles and towers with the necessary fixtures attached thereto, and to install and maintain therein or thereon wires, cables or other conductors upon and along the lands required for Catskill Aqueduct purposes and other lands acquired for water supply purposes by The City of New York from the Battery, in the Borough of Manhattan, to the boundary line between the Counties of Westchester and Putnam for the purpose of conveying and transmitting electricity and supplying and distributing the same for light, heat and power and for general commercial purposes, and proposes to furnish the City with both high and low tension current for the purposes hereinabove noted without cost to the City, as payment for said proposed grant:

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties hereto do hereby covenant and agree as follows:

SECTION 1. The City hereby grants, subject to the conditions and provisions hereinafter set forth, the right and privilege to construct, maintain and use such ducts, conduits, poles and towers with the necessary fixtures attached thereto, as are necessary for the operation of one line only of poles and towers, and install and maintain therein or thereon wires, cables or other conductors upon a route hereinafter described over the Catskill Aqueduct lands and other lands acquired for water supply purposes, between the northerly boundary line of the City and the boundary line between the Counties of Westchester and Putnam, acquired or purchased by the City, pursuant to Chapter 724 of the Laws of 1905, Chapter 490 of the Laws of 1883 and Chapter 256 of the Laws of 1834 and the acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, as follows, but subject to the limitations hereinafter contained:

(a) To the Yonkers Company, along so much of said lands as lies within the City of Yonkers;

(b) To the Westchester Company, along so much of said land as lies within the County of Westchester, outside the City of Yonkers;—the said wires, cables or other conductors to be used by the grantees for the purpose of transmitting electricity and supplying and distributing the same for light, heat and power for general commercial purposes, except as herein elsewhere limited, but for no other purpose whatsoever.

The said Catskill Aqueduct Lands upon which the said Companies are hereby authorized to construct such transmission line are partially described in certain deeds to the city and the remainder is shown, as hereinafter more specifically set forth upon Sections Nos. 1, 2, 9, 10, 11 and 13 to 16, inclusive, of the Southern Aqueduct Department and Section No. 1 of the Northern Aqueduct Department of "Maps of Real Estate to be Acquired by the City of New York Under the Provisions of Chapter 724 of the Laws of 1905, as amended," which maps are on file in the office of the County Clerk of the County of Westchester and in the office of the Board of Water Supply of the City of New York. Other lands upon which the said companies are hereby authorized to construct such transmission line—that is, for a distance of approximately 2,100 feet, be the same more or less, including the crossing of Croton Lake, are shown upon maps filed in the office of the County Clerk of the County of Westchester and hereinafter more specifically described.

The routes upon which said transmission line is hereby authorized with certain limitations with respect thereto is more particularly described as follows:

Along and across the lands acquired for the Hill View Reservoir, shown on Sections Nos. 1 and 2 of said real estate maps of the Southern Aqueduct Department.

Also beginning at the corner of Grove and Orient Streets, in the City of Yonkers; thence upon lands of the Catskill Aqueduct, as shown upon Section No. 16 of said real estate maps of

the Southern Aqueduct Department to parcel No. 1151 and around said parcel in accordance with a certain deed dated October 7, 1911, from James Gordon Bennett to The City of New York, and a certain agreement also dated October 7, 1911, between James Gordon Bennett and the City of New York, both the said deed and the said agreement being recorded in the office of the Register of the County of Westchester, which are on file with the Board of Water Supply, to the Aqueduct lands at Parcel No. 1144 of said maps of said section No. 16; thence continuing upon said Aqueduct lands shown upon said maps of said section No. 16, Southern Aqueduct Department, to parcel No. 1135 thereof, at the line of Tuckahoe Road; thence across said parcel No. 1135, under the conditions stipulated in the report of the Commissioners of Appraisal on said section No. 16, said report having been confirmed by the Supreme Court on September 30, 1911, to parcel No. 1134 of said section No. 16; thence continuing upon said Aqueduct lands, as shown upon the maps of said Section No. 16 to lands shown on said maps of Section No. 15, Southern Aqueduct Department; thence upon lands of the Catskill Aqueduct, as shown upon maps of said Section No. 15 to Parcel No. 1013 thereof at the line of the property of the Kensico Cemetery; thence across said Parcel No. 1013, in conformity with a resolution of the Board of Water Supply, adopted June 20, 1911, to Parcel No. 1012 of said Section No. 15 at the line of the property of the New York Central and Hudson River Railroad Company, lessee of the New York and Harlem Railroad Company; thence across said Parcel No. 1012, in accordance with a certain agreement between said Railroad Companies and the Board of Water Supply, dated January 5, 1911, which agreement is recorded in the office of the Register of the County of Westchester and is on file with the Board of Water Supply, to Parcel No. 1010 of said Section No. 15; thence continuing upon said Aqueduct Lands, as shown upon said maps of said Section No. 15, to lands acquired for the Kensico Reservoir, being shown on Sections Nos. 9, 10 and 11 of said real estate maps of the Southern Aqueduct Department; thence along such Kensico Reservoir Lands to the southerly end of the Aqueduct Lands shown on Section No. 14 of said real estate maps of the Southern Aqueduct Department; thence upon said Aqueduct Lands shown upon maps of said Section No. 14 to parcel No. 998 thereof; thence over said parcel No. 998 under such conditions as may be stipulated in such report of the Commissioners of Appraisal on said Section No. 14, and as may be confirmed by the Supreme Court, to parcel No. 997 of said Section No. 14; thence continuing upon said Aqueduct Lands, as shown upon the maps of the said Section No. 14 to Parcel No. 971 thereof at the line of the property of the New York Central and Hudson River Railroad Company, lessee of the New York and Harlem Railroad Company; thence across said Parcel No. 971, in accordance with a certain agreement between the said Railroad Companies and the Board of Water Supply, dated January 5, 1911, which agreement is recorded in the office of the Register of the County of Westchester and is on file with the Board of Water Supply, to Parcel No. 969 of said Section No. 14; thence continuing upon said Aqueduct Lands to Parcel No. 968 of said Section No. 14; thence making a detour from said Aqueduct Lands along a right of way acquired by the City not shown upon maps of said Section No. 14 but described in a certain deed from the Briarcliff Realty Company to the City of New York, dated January 5, 1911, which deed is recorded in the office of the Register of the County of Westchester and is on file with the Board of Water Supply, and along said detour or right of way to the point where said right of way again joins such Aqueduct Lands, at Parcel No. 967 of said maps of said Section No. 14; thence continuing upon said Aqueduct Lands as shown upon said maps of said Section No. 14, Southern Aqueduct Department, to the northerly end thereof and the southerly end of lands shown on maps of Section No. 13, Southern Aqueduct Department; thence continuing upon said Aqueduct Lands, as shown upon maps of said Section No. 13, to Parcel No. 958 thereof; thence making a detour from said Aqueduct Lands along a right of way acquired by the City, not shown upon maps of said Section No. 13, but described in a certain deed from Elisha P. Cronkite and wife to the City of New York, dated June 9, 1910, which is recorded in the office of the Register of the County of Westchester and is on file with the Board of Water Supply, and along said detour or right of way to the point where said right of way again joins such Aqueduct Lands at Parcel No. 957 of said maps of said Section No. 13; thence continuing upon said Aqueduct Lands, shown upon said maps of said Section No. 13, Southern Aqueduct Department, to Parcel No. 952 thereof, at the line of the property of the New York Central and Hudson River Railroad Company, lessee of the New York and Putnam Railroad Company; thence across said Parcel No. 952, in accordance with a certain agreement between the said Railroad Companies and the Board of Water Supply, dated January 25, 1911, which agreement is recorded in the office of the Register of the County of Westchester and is on file with the Board of Water Supply, to Parcel No. 951 of said Section No. 13; thence continuing upon said Aqueduct Lands, as shown upon said maps of said Section No. 13 to the northerly side of Parcel No. 925 of said Section No. 13, at the line of the lands of the City of New York acquired for water supply purposes, and shown upon sheets Nos. 11 and 12 of a map entitled: "City of New York, Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity. Atlas showing lands in Westchester County used for water supply purposes, 1914," which maps are signed by the Chief Engineer of the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity and are filed in the office of said Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity; thence upon lands shown upon said Sheets Nos. 11 and 12, to the southerly side of Parcel No. 924 of said Section No. 13; thence continuing upon said Aqueduct Lands, as shown upon said maps of said Section No. 13, Southern Aqueduct Department, to the northerly end thereof and the southerly end of lands shown on maps of Section No. 1, Northern Aqueduct Department; thence continuing upon said Aqueduct Lands, as shown on Maps of said Section No. 1, Northern Aqueduct Department to the boundary line between the Counties of Westchester and Putnam.

Sec. 2. The grant of this privilege is subject to the following conditions, which shall be complied with by the grantees.

First—The said right to construct, maintain and operate said transmission line shall be held and enjoyed by the grantees from the date upon which this contract is signed by the Mayor until January 1, 1938, with the privilege of renewal of said contract for the further period of twenty-five (25) years, upon a fair revaluation of such right and privilege.

If the grantees shall determine to exercise the privilege of renewal they shall make application to the Board, or any authority which shall be authorized by law to act for the City in place of the Board. Such application shall be made at any time not earlier than two (2) years and not later than one (1) year before the expiration of the original term of this contract. The determination of the revaluation shall be sufficient if agreed to in writing by the grantees and the Board.

If the grantees and the Board shall not reach such agreement on or before the day one (1)

year before the expiration of the original term of this contract, then the annual rate of compensation for such succeeding twenty-five (25) years shall be reasonable, and either the City (by the Board) or the grantees shall be bound upon request of the other to enter into a written agreement with each other fixing the rate of such compensation at such amount as shall be reasonable, and if the parties shall not forthwith agree upon what is reasonable, then the parties shall enter into a written agreement fixing such annual rate and at such amount as shall be determined by three disinterested freeholders selected in the following manner:

One disinterested freeholder shall be chosen by the Board; one disinterested freeholder shall be chosen by the grantees; these two shall choose a third disinterested freeholder, and the three so chosen shall act as appraisers and shall make the revaluation aforesaid. Such appraisers shall be chosen at least six (6) months prior to the expiration of this original contract, and their report shall be filed with the Board within three (3) months after they are chosen. They shall act as appraisers and not as arbitrators. They may base their judgment upon their own experience and upon such information as they may obtain by inquiries and investigations, without the presence of either party. They shall have the right to examine any of the books of the grantees and their officers under oath. The valuations so ascertained, fixed and determined shall be conclusive upon both parties, but no annual compensation shall, in any event, be less than that required for the last year of the original term of this contract. If in any case the annual compensation shall not be fixed prior to the termination of the original term of this contract, then the annual compensation theretofore prevailing shall continue until the new rate shall be determined, and the grantees shall then make up to the City the amount of any excess of the annual compensation then determined over the previous annual compensation. The compensation and expenses of the said appraisers shall be borne jointly by the City and the grantees, each paying one-half thereof.

Second—As compensation for the privilege hereby granted the grantees jointly and severally agree to install equipment and furnish electrical current to the City without charge to it, as follows:

(a) Install, reserve and maintain for the exclusive use of the City, as an integral part of the generating and distributing systems of the grantees, generating machinery, sub-station apparatus, cables, switches and controlling apparatus up to the switchboards in the structures of the drainage chambers now or to be hereafter provided by the Board of Water Supply of the City for the unwatering of the pressure tunnels of the Catskill Aqueduct; said drainage chambers situated or to be situated

- (1) At or near Croton Lake at the shaft known as the Croton Lake Drainage Shaft;
- (2) At or near the intersection of Clinton and South Streets at the shaft known as No. 21 of the City Aqueduct; and
- (3) In Morningside Park between West 120th and West 121st Streets, if the same were extended, at the shaft known as No. 11 of the City Aqueduct.

—sufficient in capacity to deliver 850 kilowatts of three-phase alternating current having a frequency of sixty (60) cycles per second at a pressure of 2200 volts at each of the shafts Nos. 11 and 21 and 850 kilowatts of three-phase alternating current having a frequency of sixty (60) cycles per second at a pressure of 40,000 volts at the Croton Lake Drainage Shaft.

(b) Furnish when called upon by the Board of Water Supply or its authorized representatives electrical energy up to the capacity of 850 kilowatts of three-phase alternating current having a frequency of sixty (60) cycles per second at a pressure of 2200 volts at each of the shafts Nos. 11 and 21 and up to the capacity of 850 kilowatts of three-phase alternating current having a frequency of sixty (60) cycles per second at a pressure of 40,000 volts at the Croton Lake Drainage Shaft.

(c) Install and maintain for the use of the City wires, cables or other conductors and controlling apparatus up to the switchboards in the buildings or other structures owned by the City and used in the operation of the Catskill Aqueduct; that is to say, gate-houses, offices, bridges and all other buildings and chambers used in the operation and maintenance of the aqueduct and aqueduct lands of the city which may be situated north of Battery Park in the Borough of Manhattan and south of the boundary line between the Counties of Westchester and Putnam.

(d) Furnish whenever required two-phase or three-phase alternating current having a frequency of sixty (60) cycles per second, at a pressure of 110 or more volts, sufficient for operating all motors and other apparatus as may be required for the maintenance and operation of the aqueduct.

(e) Furnish whenever required single-phase alternating current having a frequency of sixty (60) cycles per second, at a pressure of 110 or more volts, or direct current at a pressure of 120 or more volts, sufficient for lighting all said buildings, bridges and grounds as may be necessary, and for any and all other purposes as may be required in connection with the maintenance and operation of the aqueduct and appurtenant works and structures.

Any and all payments to be made or service to be rendered by the terms of this contract to the City by the grantees shall not be considered in any manner in the nature of a tax, but such payments shall be made and such service rendered in addition to any and all taxes of whatsoever kind or description, now or hereafter required to be paid by any ordinance of the City, or resolution of the Board, or any law of the State of New York.

Third—Nothing in this contract shall be deemed to affect in any way the right of the City to grant to any individual or other corporation a similar right or privilege upon the same or other terms and conditions, to operate upon a route upon all or any part of lands acquired for aqueduct purposes.

Fourth—The service hereby required to be rendered as payment for the rights hereby granted shall continue throughout the whole term of this contract (whether original or renewal), and no assignment, lease or sublease of the rights or privileges hereby granted (whether original or renewal), or of any part thereof, or of any part thereof, shall be valid or effectual for any purpose unless the said assignment, lease or sublease shall contain a covenant on the part of the assignee or lessee that the same is subject to all the conditions of this contract; and that the assignee or lessee assumes and will be bound by all of said conditions, and especially said conditions as to service to be rendered as payment for the rights hereby granted, anything in any statute or in the charter of such assignee or lessee to the contrary notwithstanding, and that the said assignee or lessee waives any more favorable conditions created by such statute or its charter, and that it will not claim by reason thereof or otherwise exemption from liability to perform each and all of the conditions of this contract.

Fifth—The consent hereby granted shall not be assigned, nor shall the title thereto, or right, interest or property therein, pass to or vest in any other person or corporation whatsoever, either by the acts of any of the grantees, or by

operation of law, whether under the provisions of the statutes relating to the consolidation or merger of corporations or otherwise, without the consent of the City, acting by the Board, evidenced by an instrument under seal, anything herein contained to the contrary thereof in any wise notwithstanding, and the granting, giving or waiving of any one or more of such consents shall not render unnecessary any subsequent consent or consents.

Sixth—Should the grantees at any time fail to supply the service herein required as payment for the privilege herein granted in an efficient manner satisfactory to the Board of Water Supply, then the right herein granted shall cease and determine, and all sums paid or deposited with the City shall be and become the property of the City.

Seventh—It is understood by the parties hereto that the right herein granted is subject to any and every limitation imposed by law upon the use of the aqueduct lands outside of the present limits of the City or by any and every condition upon which such lands were purchased or acquired. It is understood also that no rights of any kind whatsoever are herein granted to or in any of the aqueduct lands lying within the present limits of the City.

Eighth—The transmission line hereby authorized shall be used only for the transmission of electrical current to and within the Counties of Westchester and Putnam of the State of New York, and shall not be used as a portion of or in connection with a transmission line extending into any other portion of the State of New York nor into any portion of any other state; provided that the Board may by resolution authorize the use of such transmission line for the transmission of electrical current from, to and within districts outside of said Counties of Westchester and Putnam, but the Board may, upon the adoption of such resolution, require such compensation for the additional right and prescribe such terms and conditions to govern the same as in its discretion it may deem proper.

Ninth—The grantees shall immediately begin the construction of ducts, conduits, poles and towers and the installation therein or thereon of wires, cables or other conductors and complete so much of such construction and installation as shall be necessary to furnish the service herein required and stand ready to supply the current herein required for the purposes of the Board of Water Supply, and the City of New York on or before October 1, 1914; otherwise this right shall cease and determine; provided that the time for completion of such construction and installation and the commencement of current supply, as required, may be extended by the Board, but the total extension of time shall not exceed twelve months; and provided further that when the completion of the construction or installation or the delivery of current shall be prevented by legal proceedings in any court or by works of public improvement or from other causes not within the control of the grantees, then such time may be extended for the period of such prevention, but no delay shall be allowed for unless the court proceedings shall be diligently prosecuted by the grantees and provided further that in no case shall such delay be deemed to begin until the grantees shall have given written notice to the Board of any such court proceedings or other occasion of delay and shall have delivered to the Board copies of any injunction or other orders and the papers upon which the same shall have been granted, and unless upon the request of the Board the grantees shall in writing consent that the Board, either in its own name as a party or in the name of the City as a party, may intervene in any such proceedings.

Tenth—Upon the termination of this original contract, or if the same be renewed, then at the termination of the said renewal term, or upon the termination of the rights hereby granted for any cause, the conduits, poles, towers, fixtures, wires, cables and equipment of the grantees constructed pursuant to this contract shall become the property of the City without cost, and the same may be used or disposed of by the City for any purpose whatsoever, or the same may be leased to any company or individual.

If, however, at the termination of this contract as above, the Board shall so order by resolution, the grantees shall, upon thirty (30) days' notice from the Board, remove any part or all of such conduits, poles, towers, fixtures, wires, cables and equipments constructed pursuant to this contract and the aqueduct lands shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to the Board of Water Supply at the sole cost and expense of the grantees.

Eleventh—The grantees shall comply with all laws, ordinances or rules of the local authorities having jurisdiction over the construction, maintenance or operation of the transmission line herein authorized.

Twelfth—The position of said transmission line upon said aqueduct lands shall be such as shall coincide with that designated and fixed by the Board of Water Supply. Before any work of construction or installation herein authorized shall be commenced, the grantees shall submit to the Board of Water Supply plans and specifications which shall show and specify in detail the character of the structure or structures proposed by the grantees and the location of the same upon City land. Said plans and specifications must be approved by the Board of Water Supply before such work shall be commenced. The work of construction and installation shall be under the supervision of the Board of Water Supply, and any rules or directions given by said Board shall be complied with by the grantees. If in the opinion of the Board of Water Supply it shall become necessary to change at any time during the term of this contract the location or the character of the construction or installation of said transmission line for the protection of life or property, or if in the opinion of said Board it shall become necessary for the City to use during said term any part or all of the lands upon which the structures herein authorized shall be situated for any of the purposes for which said lands were acquired, then the grantees shall make at their own expense such changes in the character of the construction or installation or changes in the position of such structures on said Aqueduct Lands as directed by the Board of Water Supply.

Thirteenth—All structures and appurtenances erected hereunder shall be kept in good and safe repair and in accordance with the instructions given by the Board of Water Supply.

Fourteenth—In case of any violation or breach or failure to comply with any of the provisions herein contained, this contract may be forfeited by a suit brought by the Corporation Counsel, on notice of ten (10) days to the grantees, or at the option of the Board by resolution of said Board, which said resolution may contain a provision to the effect that the ducts, conduits, poles, towers, wires, cables, conductors, fixtures and all structures, constructed or in use by virtue of this contract shall thereupon become the property of the City without proceedings at law or in equity. Provided, however, that such action by the Board shall not be taken until the Board shall give notice to the grantees to appear before it on a certain day not less than ten (10) days after the date of such notice, to show cause why such resolution declaring the contract forfeited should not be adopted. In case the grantees fail to appear, action may be taken by the Board forthwith.

Fifteenth—This grant is upon the express condition that the grantees, within thirty (30) days

after the signing of this contract, by the Mayor, and before anything is done in exercise of the rights conferred hereby, shall deposit with the Comptroller of the City the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), either in money or securities, to be approved by him, which fund shall be security for the performance by the grantees of all of the terms and conditions of this contract and compliance with all orders of the Board, or the Board of Water Supply, acting under the powers herein reserved, especially those which relate to the furnishing of service herein required for the privilege hereby granted, and the maintenance of the property in good and safe condition throughout the whole term of this contract; and in case of default in the performance by the grantees of such terms and conditions, or compliance with such orders or either or any of them, the City shall have the right to cause the work to be done and the materials to be furnished for the performance thereof after due notice, and shall collect the reasonable cost thereof from the said fund without legal proceedings; or after default in the payment of the annual charges, shall collect the same, with interest, from the said fund after ten (10) days' notice to the Company; or in case of failure to observe the said terms and conditions of this contract and orders of the Board or Board of Water Supply, acting hereunder, the grantees shall pay a penalty of fifty dollars (\$50) per day for each day of violation.

The procedure for the imposition and collection of the penalties in this contract shall be as follows:

The Board, on complaint made, shall give notice to the grantees, directing their Presidents, or any one of them, or other officers to appear before the Board on a certain day not less than ten (10) days after the date of such notice, to show cause why the grantees should not be penalized in accordance with the foregoing provisions. If the grantees fail to make an appearance, or, after a hearing, appear in the judgment of the Board to be in fault, said Board shall forthwith impose the prescribed penalty, or where the amount of the penalty is not prescribed herein, such amount as appears to the Board to be just, and without legal procedure direct the Comptroller to withdraw the amount of such penalty from the security fund deposited with him. In case of any drafts made upon the security fund the grantees shall, upon ten (10) days' notice in writing, pay to the City a sum sufficient to restore said security fund to the original amount of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), and in default thereof this contract shall be cancelled and annulled at the option of the Board, acting in behalf of the City. No action or proceeding or right under the provisions of this contract shall affect any other legal rights, remedies or causes of action belonging to the City.

Sixteenth—The grantees shall assume all liability to persons or property by reason of the construction or operation of the transmission line and its appurtenances authorized by this contract, and it is a condition of this contract that the City shall assume no liability whatsoever to either persons or property on account of the same, and the grantees hereby agree to repay to the City any damage which the City shall be compelled to pay by reason of any acts or default of the grantees. The grantees shall pay all taxes on all property constructed or maintained pursuant to this contract and shall reimburse the City for all taxes upon said property which the City may be required to pay and shall reimburse the City, its officers and agents for any and all costs or expenses whatsoever of every name and nature to which the City may be put by reason of the construction, operation or maintenance of the transmission line and its appurtenances and shall save the City, its officers and agents harmless therefrom.

Seventeenth—If at any time the powers of the Board or of the Board of Water Supply, or any other of the authorities herein mentioned or intended to be mentioned, shall be transferred by law to any other board, authority, officer or officers, then and in such case such other board, authority, officer or officers shall have all the powers, rights and duties herein reserved to or prescribed for the Board or the Board of Water Supply or other authorities, officer or officers.

Sec. 3. Nothing in this contract contained shall be construed as reviving or validating any lapsed or invalid franchise heretofore granted to any of the grantees herein or to their predecessors, or as enlarging or adding to the powers or privileges contained in said grants of franchises or as waiving any forfeiture thereto.

Sec. 4. Each of the parties of the second part, jointly and severally, promises, covenants and agrees on its part and behalf to conform to and abide by and perform all the terms, conditions and requirements in this contract fixed and contained.

Sec. 5. This contract shall not become operative unless and until the grantees shall procure and cause to be executed an agreement which shall be proved in proper form for record and duly delivered to the Board, by which the Northern Westchester Lighting Company and the Peekskill Lighting and Railroad Company shall agree with each other, with the Westchester Company and with the City to furnish, whenever called upon by either the Westchester Company or the City, such service as may be required by the Westchester Company in order to supply to the City the electrical current necessary to fulfill the terms of this contract, and by which the said Northern Westchester Lighting Company and the said Peekskill Lighting and Railroad Company shall further agree with each other, with the Westchester Company and with the City to permit the Westchester Company to use so much of their facilities as shall be necessary to carry out the provisions of this contract. Upon the failure of either or any of said Companies to furnish such service or to permit the use of said facilities for any reason at any time hereafter, the rights hereby granted shall cease and determine and this contract shall be null and void and of no effect.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the party of the first part, by its Mayor, thereunto duly authorized by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of said City, has caused the corporate name of said City to be hereunto signed and the corporate seal of said City to be hereunto affixed; and each of the parties of the second part, by its officers, thereunto duly authorized, has caused its corporate name to be hereunto signed and its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed, the day and year first above written.

NOTICE TO BIDDERS AT SALES OF OLD BUILDINGS, ETC.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH BUILDINGS, ETC., WILL BE SOLD FOR REMOVAL FROM CITY PROPERTY.

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 shall be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. The placing therein or permitting the occupancy of any such building by any tenant free, for rent or otherwise, excepting the necessary watchmen or the workmen engaged in the actual demolition thereof, shall of itself be a breach of the above conditions of sale.

The sale will be as of the condition of the property on date of delivery thereof to the purchaser. The City of New York will not be responsible for any change or loss which may occur in the condition of the buildings, or their appurtenances between the time of the sale thereof and the time of delivering possession to the purchaser, after being properly vacated of all tenants. The sale and delivery to purchaser will be made as nearly together as the circumstances of vacating the structures of their tenants will permit.

All the material of the buildings, sheds, walks, structures and cellars of whatsoever nature, with their exterior and interior fixtures, appurtenances and foundations of all kinds, except the exterior walls of the buildings and their foundations and the sidewalks and curb in front of said buildings, extending within the described area shall be torn down and removed from the premises. None of the dirt, debris or waste resulting from demolition shall be allowed to remain on the premises, except old mortar or plaster only, which may be left, but not higher at any point than two feet below the curb opposite that point. The exterior walls and their foundations shall be taken down only to a plane whose elevation shall be the level of the curb in front of the building. Where there is no curb the elevation of the surrounding ground shall be considered curb level. All wells, cesspools, sinks, etc., existing on the property must be filled to the level of the surrounding ground with clean earth.

The purchaser at the sale shall also withdraw and remove all abandoned water taps and old service mains, and in place thereof cause to be inserted a brass plug in the main water pipe in the street, in compliance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity that this has been performed.

The purchaser at the sale shall also remove all house sewer connections to the main sewer in the street and the openings of the main sewer

in street shall be properly closed in compliance with the directions of the Bureau of Sewers in the Borough in which the buildings are situated, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Bureau of Sewers that the work has been properly performed.

The permit for all opening in the street to be obtained by and at the expense of the purchaser of the building.

Failure to remove said buildings, appurtenances, or any part thereof, within thirty days from the day of possession will work forfeiture of ownership of such buildings, appurtenances, or portion as shall then be left standing, together with all moneys paid by said purchaser on account thereof at the time of the sale, and the bidder's assent to the above conditions being understood to be implied by the act of bidding, and The City of New York will, without notice to the purchaser, cause the same to be removed, and the cost and expense thereof charged against the security above mentioned.

The work of removal must be carried on in every respect in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and must be completed within thirty days from the day of possession, and the successful bidder will provide and furnish all materials of labor and machinery necessary thereto, and will place proper and sufficient guards and fences and warning signs by day and night for the prevention of accidents, and will indemnify and save harmless The City of New York, its officers, agents and servants, and each of them, against any and all suits and actions, claims and demands of every name and description brought against it, them or any of them, and against and from all damage and costs to which it, they or any of them be put by reason of injury to the person or property of another, resulting from negligence or carelessness in the performance of the work, or in guarding the same, or from any improper or defective materials or machinery, implements or appliances used in the removal of said buildings.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchasers.

Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furnishings, plaster, chimneys, projecting brick, etc., on the faces of such party walls are to be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam-ends, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and present a clean exterior. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York, is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless, as a condition precedent to the reception, or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The amount shall be as specified in the proposals or instructions to bidders and shall not be in excess of 5 per cent.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.

For particulars as to the quantity and quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to the City.

The contract must be bid for separately. The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids or estimates if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids or estimates in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bids or estimates upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel, can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done. Plans and drawings of construction work may also be seen there.
