BOARD OF STREET OPENING AND IMPROVEMENT.

The Board of Street Opening and Improvement met at the Mayor's office on Friday, June 5, 1891, at 2 o'clock P. M., pursuant to the following notice:

OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF STREET OPENING AND IMPROVEMENT,
ROOM NO. 10, STEWART BUILDING,
NEW YORK, June 2, 1891.

SIR—You are respectfully requested to attend a regular meeting of the Board of Street Opening and Improvement of the City of New York, to be held in the Mayor's office, at the City Hall, on Friday, June 5, 1891, at 2 o'clock P. M., at which it is proposed to consider unfinished business, with such other matters as may be brought before the Board.

The roll was called and the following members were present and answered to their names:
The Mayor, the Comptroller, the Commissioner of Public Works, the President of the Department of Public Parks, the President of the Board of Aldermen, and the Commissioner of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards—6.

The minutes of the meetings of May 1, May 8 and May 25, 1891, were read and approved.
The following petitions for the opening of One Hundred and Thirty-seventh, One Hundred and Thirty-ninth and One Hundred and Fortieth streets, from Locust avenue to the Southern Boulevard, in the Twenty-third Ward, were presented, and, on motion, were referred to the Commissioner of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards for report thereon.

To the Board of Street Opening and Improvement of the City of New York:

The Port Morris Land and Improvement Company and others, whose names are subscribed, owners of more than one-half the assessable frontage on East One Hundred and Thirty-seventh street, between the Southern Boulevard and Locust avenue, in the Twenty-third Ward of the City of New York, respectfully petition your Honorable Board to take the necessary steps at once for opening East One Hundred and Thirty-seventh street, from the westerly line of Locust avenue to the easterly line of the Southern Boulevard, in accordance with the lines and location fixed by law.

The length of the portion of said street proposed to be opened (including the width of cross streets) is 1,735 feet; the assessable frontage of lands on said street, as proposed to be opened, is 3,026 feet (not including the width of cross streets).

The Port Morris Land and Improvement Company owns 857 feet of said frontage, and is the owner of the fee of a large portion of the lands in that portion of the street proposed to be opened; and the other petitioners are the owners of 443 feet of said frontage, making in all about forty per cent. thereof.

The said street is a first-class street and is more than a mile in length, and by law, one-half of the expense of said opening, including damage for lands, is required to be paid by the City.

Your petitioner, The Port Morris Land and Improvement Company, in order to secure immediate improvement to its large property, is willing to accept a nominal award of \$1 for all its land taken in said opening, and to waive the benefit of the provision of law aforesaid, requiring the City to pay one-half of the assessment, and to pay the entire assessment for said opening, so far as its land fronting on said street is concerned, and to guarantee the City against any assessment for said opening, and to pay to the Comptroller any sum which may be assessed against the City for such opening, and is ready and willing to execute necessary bond or other instrument to that effect, as soon as the same can be drawn and approved by the proper authorities.

The opening of this and other streets leading to the valuable water-front at Port Morris, and making this large tract of land available for immediate improvement must, in the near future, result

in a great increase in the value of the adjacent property, in addition to furnishing much needed room for manufacturing and other great business interests within the limits of our own city.

The table hereto annexed shows the length and ownership of lands on that portion of the street proposed to be opened.

HEALTH DEPARTMENT, No. 301 MOTT STREET,
NEW YORK, June 5, 1891.

W. A. EWING, M. D., Sanitary Superintendent:

SIR—We have the honor to submit the following report in regard to the unsanitary condition of that section of the city bounded by the Southern Boulevard, Walnut avenue, One Hundred and Thirty-sixth and One Hundred and Thirty-eighth streets. There are at least fifty buildings, including tenement-houses, dwellings, factories and stables in this district, which are compelled, from lack of any sewerage facilities, to discharge all their waste water into the street gutters, and, owing to the topography of the land, all this sewerage eventually stagnates upon the low lands adjoining the embankment of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad tracks, which condition is a menace to the health of the inhabitants of this vicinity.

We, therefore, recommend the instituting of necessary proceedings to legally open and construct proper sewers in East One Hundred and Thirty-sixth and One Hundred and Thirty-seventh streets.

We further recommend that copies of this report be transmitted to the Board of Street Opening and to the Commissioner of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards.

That Anderson avenue as it formerly existed is shown on the map of the Commissioners of the Town of Morrisania, appointed in 1868 to lay out streets, and which map was filed in 1871, and as it then existed it entered Jerome avenue at a point distant about 350 feet north of One Hundred and Sixty-first street, and ran almost due north and south.

That Anderson avenue, between Jerome avenue and a distance of over four hundred and fifty feet therefrom, was regulated, graded at large expense, and used for many years on the lines shown on said Commissioner's map of the Town of Morrisania.

That the expense thereof was borne by the adjacent property-owners.

That subsequent to annexation the Commissioners of the Department of Public Parks filed a map showing Anderson avenue discontinued, between Jerome avenue and a point about four hundred and fifty feet north, and deflecting said avenue to the southwest in a line parallel with Jerome avenue and continuing the same a distance of nearly a quarter of a mile until the same reached Sedgwick avenue.

That by a resolution of the Commissioners of the Department of Public Parks, passed May 8, 1890, Anderson avenue, between Sedgwick avenue and Bremer avenue, was taken off the map.

That the effect of this discontinuance is to change the original plan of the engineers of the Park Department to have Anderson avenue continue parallel with Jerome avenue until it terminated at Sedgwick avenue, and to leave Anderson terminate at the foot of a steep grade at Bremer avenue.

That the objective point is Jerome avenue and it will be reached much quicker and easier by restoring the lines of Anderson avenue to their former existence, and discontinuing Anderson avenue, from Bremer avenue to where the old line would strike the same, at a distance between four and five hundred feet therefrom.

That the cost of acquiring title to Anderson avenue through the petitioner's premises, if the same is continued to Bremer avenue, will entail a large expense, and the cost of the regulating and grading thereof will entail a very large expense, especially as the land is rocky, and the grading heavy, besides greatly injuring the availability of the adjacent land, whereas the line of the avenue as formerly existing to Jerome avenue is already graded and paid for and the land dedicated for the purposes of a street.

Your petitioners offer that in case it should be considered that the filing of said map by the Commissioners of the Department of Public Parks operated as a closing of the former and actually existing macadamized road known as Anderson avenue, between the points in question, that they will cede to the City free of charge the said lands owned by them composing the said former Anderson avenue.

That no proceedings have ever been taken looking to the legal opening of Anderson avenue as proposed to be changed by the Commissioners of the Department of Public Parks.

That annexed to this petition is a map prepared by Chandler Withington, City Surveyor, which gives the grades and courses of the streets as they now exist, and as they formerly existed, and an inspection thereof, it is respectfully submitted, will show the desirability of granting the prayer of your petitioners.

Wherefore, your petitioners pray that the Board of Street Opening and Improvement will examine into the matters aforesaid and take or cause to be taken such measures as will alter or change the map of the City of New York by abandoning the proposed Anderson avenue between the points in the petition set forth, and restoring the former Anderson avenue to its intersection with Jerome avenue.

To Chief Inspector Bullard:

SIR—Upon examination of that portion of the Twenty-fourth Ward known as Fordham Heights, Mount Hope and Mount Eden, we find that the want of a system of sewerage, owing to the rapid increase of new buildings and the consequent increase in the number of residents, is very pressing indeed.

The main sewer will be built on Jerome avenue, excepting a small portion, commencing at the intersection of Jerome and Cromwell avenues, thence north to Inwood avenue, to Belmont place, to Jerome avenue, and thence northward as far as St. James street.

Jerome avenue has been declared legally opened, but the advancement of the main sewer north of the intersection of Jerome and Cromwell avenues will be stopped until such time as the "Board of Street Opening and Improvement" shall declare the above mentioned avenues opened. The portion of Cromwell avenue needed for the sewer is only about 600 feet, of Inwood avenue about 3,600 feet, and of Belmont place about 400 feet.

The building of this sewer will not only drain the swamp land now flooded from the overflow of Cromwell Creek, but in connection with its branch sewers, it will remove the necessity of cess-pools, which are a continual source of danger to the health of the residents of this portion of the Twenty-fourth Ward.

We would, therefore, recommend that the necessary proceedings be commenced to declare the following avenues legally opened: Cromwell avenue, from Jerome to Inwood avenue; Inwood avenue and Belmont place, from Inwood to Jerome avenue.

We would also recommend that copies of this report be forwarded to the Board of Street Opening and Improvement and to the Department of Street Improvement of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards for action.

Hon. HUGH J. GRANT, Chairman, Board of Street Opening and Improvement:

SIR—We have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of a communication from your Board, enclosing a resolution submitted to said Board in the matter of establishing the Cathedral Parkway by widening One Hundred and Tenth street, between Seventh avenue and Riverside Park, to the following effect, viz.:

"Resolved, That this Board deeming it for the public interest so to do, hereby respectfully requests the Council to the Corporation to take the necessary proceedings in the name of the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of New York to acquire title wherever the same has not been heretofore required for the use of the public to the land required for 'Cathedral Parkway' as provided for by chapter 275 of the Laws of 1891, passed April 28, 1891, consisting in the widening and enlarging of One Hundred and Tenth street, between Seventh avenue and Riverside Park, so as to conveniently connect thereby and by appropriate entrances in connection therewith Central park, Morningside Park and Riverside Park."

In reply we have the honor to say that the act in section 1 provides as follows :
"One Hundred and Tenth street in the City of New York, between Seventh avenue and Riverside Park is hereby widened and enlarged. * * * The street shall be widened and enlarged by including therein all the following described pieces or parcels of land," etc.
Section 2 provides that "It shall be the duty of the Counsel to the Corporation within three months after the passage of this act to take the necessary means and proceedings to acquire title to the said parcels of land above described."
By section 3, among other things, it is provided that "the Department of Parks shall have exclusive control and management of the said parkway upon the acquisition of title thereto by the City of New York."

In accordance with this act it does not seem that the Department of Parks has any control or authority over the said parkway until title thereto has been acquired, nor does it appear that the Board of Street Opening has anything to do with the matter, inasmuch as under section 2 the duty of the Corporation Counsel is established to take proceedings, within three months from the passage of the act, to acquire title. We, therefore, recommend that the resolution be laid on the table, as the act is mandatory upon the Corporation Counsel.

The Board signed petitions to Supreme Court for appointment of Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment in the following street opening proceedings :
Pelham avenue, westerly to Webster avenue, in the Twenty-fourth Ward.

Welch street, from the New York and Harlem Railroad to Webster avenue, in the Twenty-fourth Ward.

One Hundred and Thirty-first street, from Tenth to Convent avenue, in the Twelfth Ward.

One Hundred and Eighty-seventh street, from Tenth avenue to Kingsbridge road, in the Twelfth Ward

The Board then adjourned.

ACQUIRED BY WATER GRANTS.

ATTENTION IS CALLED TO THE RECENT
 act of the Legislature (chapter 449, Laws of 1889),
 which provides that whenever any streets or avenues in
 the city, described in any grant of land under water,
 from the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty containing
 covenants requiring the grantees and their successors to
 pave, repave, keep in repair or maintain such streets,
 shall be in need of repairs, pavement or repavement
 the Common Council may, by ordinance, require
 the same to be paved, repaved or repaired, and
 the expense thereof to be assessed on the property
 benefited; and whenever the owner of a lot so assessed
 shall have paid the assessment levied for such paving,
 repaving or repairing, such payment shall release and
 discharge such owner from any and every covenant and
 obligation as to paving, repaving and repairing, con-
 tained in the water grant under which the premises are
 held, and no further assessment shall be imposed on
 such lot for paving, repaving or repairing such street or
 avenue, unless it shall be petitioned for by a majority
 of the owners of the property (who shall also be the owners
 of a majority of the property in frontage) on the line of
 the proposed improvement.

The act further provides that the owner of any such
 lot may notify the Commissioner of Public Works, in
 writing, specifying the ward number and street num-
 ber of the lot that he desires, for himself, his heirs
 and assigns, to be released from the obligation of such
 covenants, and elects and agrees that said lot shall be
 thereafter liable to be assessed as above provided, and
 thereupon the owner of such lot, his heirs and assigns
 shall thenceforth be relieved from any obligation to
 pave, repair, uphold or maintain said street, and the lot
 in respect of which such notice was given shall be liable
 to assessment accordingly.

The Commissioner of Public Works desires to give
 the following explanation of the operation of this act:
 When notice, as above described, is given to the
 Commissioner of Public Works, the owner of the lot or
 lots therein described, and his heirs and assigns, are
 forever released from all obligation under the grant in
 respect to paving, repaving or repairing the street in
 front of or adjacent to said lot or lots, except one assess-
 ment for such paving, repaving or repairs, as the
 Common Council may, by ordinance direct to be made
 thereafter.

No street or avenue within the limits of such grants
 can be paved, repaved or repaired until said work is
 authorized by ordinance of the Common Council, and

Those entitled to exemption are: Clergymen, lawyers, physicians, surgeons, surgeon-dentists, professors or teachers in a college, academy or public school, editors, editorial writers or reporters of daily newspapers, licensed pharmacutists or pharmacists, actually engaged in their respective professions and not following any other calling; militiamen, policemen, and firemen; election officers; jury non-residents, and city employees, and United States employees; officers of vessels making regular trips; licensed pilots, actually following that calling; superintendents, conductors and engineers of a railroad company other than a street railroad company; telegraph operators actually doing duty as such; Grand, Sheriff's, and Civil Court jurors; stationary engineers; and persons physically incapable of performing jury duty by reason of severe sickness, deafness, or other physical disorder.

It is also punishable by fine or imprisonment to give or receive any present or bribe, directly or indirectly, in relation to a jury service, or to withhold any paper or make any false statement and every case will be fully prosecuted.

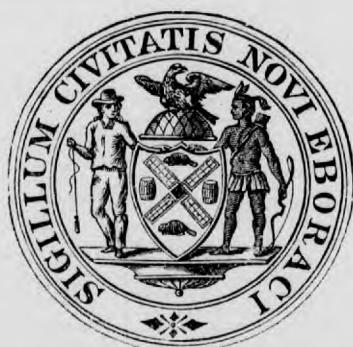
