

The most attended advanced training this month was the Emergency Operations Center & NYCEM Watch Command Overview (24.6hrs).


As of today, March's total reported volunteer hours tally up to 523.88 hours.


Division 5 members utilized their training in crowd management and traffic control to assist the precinct during this busy deployment.

CERT at Health Fair in Sunset Park





CERT Self-Deployment

It has come to our attention that a CERT member was seen self-deploying this week. We at NYCEM appreciate CERT's service and dedication to public safety and want to support members in any way that we can. However, as your instructors, Division/Borough leadership, and NYCEM staff have told all CERT members from day one during training that NYC CERT members, or teams, never self-deploy.

This is not to discourage participation and only serves as a reminder that this is for your own safety as an emergency responder. We encourage all CERT to listen to their Division leadership and to ask any questions that may come to mind, we also want to encourage all CERT members to review the CERT Standard Operating Procedures, Section 5: Operations, Deployment protocol.


