# NYCEM Hosts Graduation Ceremony for John D. Solomon Fellowship for Public Service Graduates




The ten fellows, who are graduate students from New York University, Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai, Columbia University, John Jay College of Criminal Justice, Hunter College, and St. John's University, completed a ninemonth fellowship focused on emergency management at seven City agencies and the American Red Cross of Greater New York.

During the nine-month fellowship program, fellows represented their respective agencies at virtual and in person meetings, undertaking various individual and agency-directed projects. The New York City Emergency Management Department administers the John D. Solomon Fellowship for Public Service, the first student fellowship in New York City devoted specifically to emergency management.


