

Thank you to all who participated in last week's **Quiz of the Week**. The correct answer is **A) District Leader> Division Chief> Borough Coordinator (70%)**. This can be seen on the Communication Structure chart, in Section 3B of the **NYC CERT Standard Operating Procedures**. The direct line of communication from General members to CERT Staff naturally flows from the most local leader,



District Leader, to the next level, Division Chief, and accordingly to the Borough Leadership members before having to reach out to CERT Staff. Communication flows in both directions, so the answer you are looking for could be right next door - if your District leader lives next door!

Health & Safety Protocol

As NYCEM's Human Capital Bureau continues to review submissions relating to the Vaccine Mandate, NYCEM will continue sharing updates including the NYC CERT Newsletter and requests with membership with the understanding there is approval needed prior to any in-person deployments and events.

As of **Tuesday, February 1, 2022**, volunteers who did not submit appropriate documentation to meet the vaccine mandate or request a reasonable accommodation through NYCEM will soon be placed as inactive until they are in compliance.

- To submit vaccination records, please e-mail an approved proof of vaccination to: <u>CERTVaxVerification@oem.nyc.gov</u>.
- Please review necessary steps **HERE**.

All members placed inactive as a result of incompliance may be re-activated within two years (February 2024) if the proper documentation is submitted as requested and approved by NYC Emergency Management.




