RISING ABOVE: NYC EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AND NYC COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (CERT) LAUNCH CITYWIDE FLOOD PREPAREDNESS DAY OF ACTION IN JACKSON HEIGHTS, QUEENS

August 23, 2023 — NYC Emergency Management (NYCEM) and its dedicated NYC Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) volunteers sprang into action today, holding a comprehensive day of action titled *"Rising Above: Citywide Flood Preparedness Day of Action & Resource Fair"* based out of Diversity Plaza, a community hub nestled in the heart of Jackson Heights, Queens. This public engagement initiative was laser-focused on arming communities across all five boroughs with knowledge and resources to combat the threat of flooding. The day was a step forward in the City of New York's goal of promoting proactive preparedness and fostering resilient communities in the fight against severe flooding. While supplies last, New Yorkers can still obtain flood alarms and barriers at locations detailed on <u>nyc.gov/risingabove23</u>.

NEW YORK TASK FORCE 1 URBAN SEARCH AND RESCUE TEAM ARRIVES IN COLUMBIA, SOUTH CAROLINA AHEAD OF HURRICANE IDALIA,

FDNY INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM DEPLOYS TO LOUISIANA TO RESPOND TO WILDFIRES AND EXTREME HEAT

August 29, 2023 — New York City Emergency Management (NYCEM) announced that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has activated and pre-positioned the Urban Search and Rescue (US&R) New York Task Force 1 (NY-TF1) team to Columbia, South Carolina, in anticipation of Hurricane Idalia. NYCEM also announced that the FDNY Incident Management Team has been activated through an Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) request from the State of Louisiana to support the state's response to wildfires and extreme heat.

The 46-member New York Task Force 1 team, comprised of specially trained responders from the Fire Department of New York (FDNY) (22 members) and the New York City Police Department (NYPD) (23 members), and one from NYCEM, along with two trained canines, departed at 1:00 A.M. this morning from the NYCEM Emergency Support Center in Bushwick. TRIE NEIGHBORHOOD INITIATIVE (FY 2023-2024) PARTNERSHIP APPLICATION

The Taskforce for Racial Inclusion and Equity (TRIE) Neighborhood Initiative is an initiative led by the NYC Civic Engagement Commission that invests in supporting and leveraging collaborative, communitybased coalitions in 33 neighborhoods.

Each TRIE neighborhood will be led by a community-based anchor organization who brings together a group of at least 3 additional organizations in creating a TRIE coalition that will promote civic engagement and community problem-solving. The CEC seeks 33 community-based organizations to participate in the TRIE Neighborhood Initiative (TNI) between 2023-24 and serve as a TRIE Coalition Lead Organizer.

The CEC will award funding of \$55,000 to the TRIE Coalition Leads to carry out the following activities, in collaboration with coalition members:

- Community Organizing (Organizing a coalition and hosting monthly check-ins, attending CEC-led capacity-building trainings, and administrative tasks necessary to carrying out this work, including reporting on deliverables)
- Participation in Citywide Participatory Budgeting (PB)
- Voter Education & Outreach
- Support Civic Engagement Capacity Building in TRIE Neighborhoods
