and, together with the report of Commissioner Meyer recommending that a renewal lease be granted, was placed on file, and the following resolution adopted:

Resolved, That, by virtue of the power and authority vested in this Board and in pursuance of the statutes in such cases made and provided, this Board hereby agrees to lease, assign and to farm-let to the Southern Pacific Company all and singular the wharfage which may arise, accrue or become due, in the manner and at the rates prescribed by law, for the bulkhead northerly of Pier, new 25, North river, about thirty-two feet, for a term of nine years and nine months from May 1, 1899, that is, until February 1, 1909, the date on which the renewal term of Pier, new 25, North river, expires; the rental to be at the rate of one thousand dollars per annum, provided that said Southern Pacific Company shall, within ten days after receipt hereof, file in this Department its acceptance of the terms and conditions of this resolution, and agree to execute a lease, when so notified by the Board, containing the usual covenants and conditions at present embodied in the leases of wharf property now used by this Department.

The communication from Naulight & Company, requesting permission to use and occupy the bulkhead on the East river, along the northerly side of East One Hundred and Twenty-fifth street, together with the new-made land in the rear thereof, was tabled for one week, and the Secretary directed to request said applicants to submit more definite information as to what they desire.

The following communications were also tabled for one week:

From the Manhattan Steamship Company—Requesting permission to make certain alterations and repairs to the offices on Pier, new 1, North river.

From the Long Island Railroad Company—Requesting a renewal lease of the franchise of the ferry from the foot of Pine street, East river, to Long Island City.

From the Engineer-in-Chief—In relation to the condition of the water-front property between Jackson and Corlears streets, East river.

The following reports on Secretary's Orders were referred to the Treasurer for collection:

No. 18454, submitting cost of repairing the Pier at the foot of West Thirty-fourth street where damaged by the tug "Theresa" and "Harlem River No. 2," amounting to \$49.78, for collection from Mrs. Frounigh and J. H. McConnell, the respective owners of said tug.

No. 18465, submitting cost of repairing the Pier at the foot of West Thirty-fourth street where damaged by the schooner "John H. Buttrick" while in tow of the tug "George W. Wright," amounting to \$219.53, for collection from George W. Connolly, owner of said tug.

The communication from John M. Scribner, in relation to the condition of the Pier at the foot of East Eleventh street, was referred to the Engineer-in-Chief to examine and report as to the cost of rebuilding said pier.

The following permit was granted, to continue during the pleasure of the Board:

Charles Wagner, to erect a frame structure, 6 by 6 feet, in the rear of the bulkhead at One Hundred and Twenty-ninth street and Second avenue.

The following permits were granted, the work to be done under the supervision of the Engineer-in-Chief:

Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company, to repair the plank driveway in front of Pier 27, East river, at the easterly end of the bulkhead shed thereat.

Estate of Charles A. Coc, to repair the bulkhead at Water and East streets, East river, the work to be kept within existing lines.

Gildersleeve, contractor, be and is hereby extended to December 1, 1898, provided the written consent of the sureties on said contract is filed in this Department.

From William P. Youngs & Brothers—Requesting permission to construct pile platforms on land under water between Thirty-fifth and Thirty-sixth streets, East river.

On motion, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That permission be and hereby is granted William P. Youngs & Brothers to erect a temporary platform within the lines of the water grant originally made to the Farmers Loan and Trust Company, and now owned by said William P. Youngs & Brothers, between Thirty-fifth and Thirty-sixth streets, East river, in accordance with plan submitted, the work to be done under the direction and supervision of the Engineer-in-Chief of this Department; it being understood that this resolution shall be of no force or effect unless the said William P. Youngs & Brothers shall file in this Department a written agreement, the form of which shall be approved by the Corporation Counsel, to remove said structure whenever so notified by the Board, and also that in the event that the Board of Docks shall decide that the bulkhead between East Thirty-fifth and East Thirty-sixth streets, or land under water covered by said platform, is needed for the improvement of the water-front, that then and in such case no additional item of value shall be claimed or allowed by reason of the erection of said platform or any structure thereon in proceedings instituted for the acquisition of said property, either by purchase or condemnation.

From the Treasurer—Recommending that permission be granted Hencken & Willantrock to erect a coal-boasting mast and gaff on the bulkhead, between Houston and Stanton streets, East river, the privilege to continue during the pleasure of the Board, and that no compensation be charged therefor, the premises being private property. Recommendation adopted.
