
### No Notice ShakeOut Exercise




On Thursday, October 17th, NYC CERT members joined millions globally in participating in International ShakeOut Day, conducting earthquake drills at work, school, or home. NYC Emergency Management conducted a no-notice exercise with our volunteers, with about 23% of our program participating. While the participation rate might seem modest, it is realistic for a no-notice event. Notably, the response times and communication methods varied: more people responded via email in the morning, while text messages were more common in the afternoon.

For those in leadership, it's important to consider and survey your division members on their preferred communication methods to find what works best for your group.

# **NYC CERT SOPs: Notable Updates**

1. Section 2: Volunteer Membership Roles A: Membership Requirements (page 10)

#### **Active Member**

To remain Active, volunteers must complete and report a minimum of 25 approved volunteer service hours annually.





Members may request to temporarily change their membership status to inactive at any time for a period of up to two years.

Reasons for temporary inactive status include:

- Change of residence (moving out of New York City)
- Increased personal responsibility
- Health
- Personal decision

Members who are on temporary inactivation unrelated to disciplinary actions may resume their active status after NYCEM staff reviews their request for reinstatement. Reinstatement is at the discretion of NYCEM staff and not automatic. If NYCEM approves, the member will be designated as a probationary member. NYCEM will make the final decision on member status based on available details of division participation, including reported volunteer hours. Members inactive for more than two years are required to reapply to participate in NYC CERT basic training.

If a member requested temporary inactivation as a result of accepting a paid or unpaid position with NYCEM, they will not be required to apply for NYC CERT basic training upon exiting their position with the agency and returning to serve in a volunteer role within CERT.

If a member requested temporary inactivation as a result of accepting a paid or unpaid position with NYCEM, but was terminated from the agency involuntarily, they will not be eligible to return to their volunteer role within CERT.

Members who have resigned permanently and later request to be reinstated will be subject to a 6-month mandatory waiting period. If inactive for more than two years they are required to reapply to participate in NYC CERT basic training.

NYCEM may permanently designate a member inactive for the following reasons:

- Repeated loss of credentials
- Violation of program guidelines
- Disciplinary (see NYC CERT Code of Conduct), or lack of activity
  - If designated inactive for any of the above reasons by NYCEM, the member will be notified by email and physical letter sent to the email and home address on record with the reason they are being designated inactive.

# **Cybersecurity Awareness Training for CERT Volunteers Now Available**

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training covers basic skills that are important to know in a disaster when emergency services are not available. Volunteers who participate in CERT training have a better understanding of potential threats to the community, along with actionable steps they can take to mitigate risk and improve outcomes.

To provide additional support to CERT volunteers and the important role they play in their communities, FEMA partnered with the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Agency (CISA) to provide a list of cybersecurity awareness training courses CERT volunteers can take to improve their ability to prepare for and respond to cybersecurity threats. The courses are self-paced and publicly available at no cost from the Federal Virtual Training Environment and the National Cybersecurity Preparedness Consortium (NCPC). Course topics range from cyber essentials and fundamentals of cyber risk management to cyber ethics and mobile device security. If approached to support an event in your community, the following steps must be taken:

- Event organizer submits an official request using the <u>NYC CERT External</u> <u>Request Form.</u>
- NYC CERT Leadership should not submit form on behalf of the event organizer.
- For events lead by a NYC CERT Division, volunteer leadership (Ready



# What is the NYC CERT Uniform?

We are a Team! To ensure we all represent NYC Emergency Management with professionalism, this message serves as a friendly reminder about our uniform policy. Whether it's a preparedness event or an emergency response, being in proper uniform allows us to be easily identified by the public and first responders. It signifies our commitment to safety and fosters a sense of unity.

Here's a quick rundown of the NYC CERT uniform:


