

PUBLIC NOTICE OF A SCOPING MEETING DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT

Crotona Park East/West Farms Rezoning and Related Actions (CEQR No. 10DCP017X)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT pursuant to Section 5-07 of the Rules of Procedure for Environmental Review (CEQR) $\,$ AND 6 NYCRR 617.8 (State Environmental Quality Review) that the New York City Department of City Planning, acting on behalf of the City Planning Commission as CEQR lead agency, has determined that a draft environmental impact statement is to be prepared for the proposed actions related to the redevelopment of Crotona Park East/West Farms Rezoning and Related Actions, CEQR Number 10DCP017X. The SEQRA classification for this proposal is a Type I.

A public scoping meeting has been scheduled for Thursday, March 4th, 2010, and will be held at the Fannie Lou Hamer Freedom High School, 1021 Jennings Street, Bronx, New York, 10460. The meeting will be held in the school cafeteria starting at 4:00 P.M. and participants are asked to enter the building from the entrance on West Farms Road. Written comments will be accepted by the lead agency until Monday, March 15th, 2010.

The applicant, Industco Holdings, LLC, proposes zoning map and zoning text amendments as well as special permits for a general large-scale development (GLSD) project. The proposed actions would facilitate the redevelopment of six sites under the control of the applicant (of which three would be governed by the controls of the proposed GLSD) and 28 sites not under the control of the applicant but located within the proposed rezoning area. The directly affected area encompasses 11 blocks in the Crotona Park East and West Farms neighborhoods within Bronx Community Districts 3 and 6 that lie along the strip of land midway between Longfellow and Boone Avenue on the west to West Farms Road on the east, between Freeman Street on the south, and Boston Post Road on the north. The area is currently zoned primarily

M1-1 along with a small area of R7-1 with selected C2-4 commercial overlays north of the Cross Bronx Expressway. The proposed actions would rezone the area to R6A, R7A, R7X, and R8X residential zoning districts with selected C2-4 commercial overlays. The proposed zoning text amendments would establish the Inclusionary Housing program within the proposed rezoning area and grant the CPC the authority to essory parking to be locate within a GLSD in Bronx Community District 3 without regard to lot coverage requirements.

The applicant is also requesting special permits from the City Planning Commission (CPC) under Section 74-74 of the NYC Zoning Resolution applicable to their proposed GLSD that would modify requirements pertaining to distribution of residential floor area, residential lot coverage, dwelling units, and off-street accessory parking; modify requirements for certain street wall locations, base and overall building heights, and minimum setbacks; allow outer court recesses with more than the permitted depth; and, allow enclosed accessory parking to be located anywhere within the general large-scale development GLSD without regard to lot coverage requirements (pursuant to the above proposed text amendment).

In addition to the above CPC approvals, the applicant also anticipates applying for funding from the NYC Department of Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) and NYC Housing Development Corporation (HDC).

The proposed actions are projected to result in redevelopment on a total of 26 projected development sites, resulting in a net increase of approximately 2,580 residential dwelling units (914 of which would be affordable units), 69,460 square feet (sf) of retail space, 11,900 sf of community facility space, and a net decrease of 391,700 sf of industrial space. In addition to the projected development sites, there are eight potential development sites, all located on properties not controlled by the applicant, considered less likely to be developed in the

foreseeable future. The analysis year for the proposed actions is 2019.

The projected development sites are located on a total of approximately 536,470 sf of lot area of which the applicant controls approximately 213,000 sf (40 percent) on six sites. On the three sites that would be part of the proposed GLSD, the applicant proposes to develop 840 dwelling units along with approximately 7,500 sf of commercial space and 11,900 sf of community facility space. In addition, the applicant proposes to develop three sites outside of the GLSD that would contain 430 dwelling units and approximately 27,500 sf of commercial space.

According to the applicant, fifty percent of the dwelling units on the applicant controlled sites would be subsidized under a mix of the Inclusionary Housing program, other governmental housing programs, and/or other subsidy mechanisms. Therefore, of the 1,270 dwelling units projected to be developed on applicant controlled sites, 635 are expected to be affordable units. For the sites not controlled by the applicant, it is assumed twenty percent of the dwelling units (i.e., 279 units) would be subsidized under the Inclusionary Housing program.

The present land use of the area proposed to be rezoned includes light industrial, automotive repair, warehouse and storage buildings, school facilities and a city park. Absent the proposed actions, it is assumed that the vast majority of the rezoning area would remain as it is under existing conditions. The area surrounding the proposed rezoning area contains residential, commercial and institutional uses.

As stated by the applicant, the overall goal and objective of the proposed actions would be to allow for the revitalization of an underutilized light manufacturing district to provide affordable work-force housing with retail and community facilities appropriate for the existing and proposed communities.

Public comments are requested with respect to issues to be addressed in the Draft Environmental Impact Statement.

Name, Description and Location of Proposal

The applicant, C & G Empire Realty LLC, is proposing a zoning map amendment on a portion of Block 4949 (Lots 31, 46, and 8900) from a M1-1 zoning district to a R6 zoning district with a C2-2 commercial overlay. The subject area is located in the Downtown Flushing neighborhood in Queens Community District 7 north of Northern Boulevard and east of College Point Boulevard. The proposed rezoning area is on the north side 35th Avenue between Prince and Farrington Streets. The proposed action would serve to extend an adjacent R6/C2-2 zoning district that exist along the south side of 35th Avenue to include the proposed rezoning area.

The proposed action would facilitate a proposal by the applicant to redevelop a 43,146 square-foot property located at 134-03 35th Street (Block 4949, Lot 46) that is currently developed with a two-story, approximately 30,438 square-foot structure occupied by a wholesale appliance and plumbing supply company, accessory office space, and three retail stores. The applicant intends to redevelop the site as a

11-story mixed use building with a total floor area of 125,570 square feet (2.91 FAR) that contains 100 residential dwelling units (87,780 square feet), 17,640 square feet of commercial space, and community facility space of 20,150 square feet that includes a community center (14,000 square feet). The proposed project would also provide 189 subsurface and surface parking spaces with access from 35th Street for the residential subsurface parking garage (170 spaces) and from Prince Street for the non-residential surface parking area (19 spaces). To ensure a conservative analysis, the environmental review considers a projected development on the same site with 100 dwelling units, 17,640 square feet of commercial space, and 48,014 square feet of community facility space for a total floor area of approximately 153,434 square feet (3.56 FAR)

In addition, the proposed action could facilitate development on a second site, not owned by the applicant, located at 134-37 35th Street (Block 4949, Lot 31) and currently developed with a a one-story, approximately 36,960 square-foot former warehouse occupied by a restaurant, nightclub, and accessory offices. Under the proposed action, the site could potentially be redeveloped as a 11-story mixed-use building of approximately 172,480 square feet (4.10 FAR) containing approximately 110 residential dwelling units (96,480 square feet), approximately 38,000 square feet of ground floor retail and commercial office space, approximately 38,000 square feet of second floor community facility medical office space, and approximately 344 accessory garage parking spaces in the building's cellar and sub-cellar levels.

Lot 8900, located north of and adjacent to Lot 31, would not be developed in the future as it would continue to serve as a right-of-way providing access to the adjacent lots 31 and 46. It was assumed for the purpose of this environmental review that the development rights pertaining to lot 8900 would be transferred to lot 31 as illustrated above. The analysis year for the proposed action is 2011.

As noted above, the rezoning area is presently zoned as a M1-1 district that permits light industrial uses at a maximum floor area ratio (FAR) of 1.0. The proposed action would rezone the area to a residential R6 zoning district with C2-2 commercial overlay that would permit mixed use buildings at a maximum FAR of 4.80. Building heights for R6 zoning districts are governed by the sky exposure plane. However, as this location is along the flight path for the LaGuardia Airport, buildings would be limited to no more than 115 feet in height. Also in R6 districts, parking is required at a rate of seven spaces for every ten dwelling units and open space has to be provided at a ratio between 27.5 to 37.5 percent.

The surrounding area is presently zoned M1-1 or M2-1 to the north and west of the proposed rezoning area. To the south beyond the adjacent R6/C2-2 district and south of Northern Boulevard are C4-3 and C4-2 districts. And to the east is a residential R6 district. At the current time, the properties adjacent to the proposed rezoning area to the north include a three-story walk up apartment building and a recently constructed three-story building containing two commercial uses (office and storage). Further to the north and west are one- and two-story warehouses, auto repair garages, and several small one- and two-story office and commercial buildings. It also includes several residential buildings including several three-story apartment buildings, two-story residences and row houses, and an eight-story condominium building. The area to the south of the site is predominantly developed with residential uses including two- and threestory residential and mixed-use buildings (ground floor retail space) and a four-story apartment building directly across 35th Avenue from the site. The area also includes several one- and two-story commercial buildings, a church and day care center, and a few one- and two-story warehouses. Fourstory apartment buildings are located directly across the street from the proposed rezoning area to the east, as is the seven-story Flushing International Hotel and several retail stores along 35th Avenue.

To avoid any potential significant adverse impacts, an (E) designation (E-246) would be mapped as part of the proposed rezoning. The applicant's site (Block 4949, Lot 46) would receive an (E) designation for air quality and noise. The nonapplicant site (Block 4949, Lot 31) would receive an (E) designation for hazardous materials, air quality and noise. In addition the lot that is presently serving as a right-of-way (Block 4949, Lot 8900) would receive an (E) designation for hazardous materials.

Statement of No Significant Effect:

The Environmental Assessment and Review Division of the Department of City Planning, on behalf of the City Planning Commission, has completed its technical review of the Environmental Assessment Statement, dated January 21, 2009, prepared in connection with the ULURP Application (No. 030223 ZMQ). The City Planning Commission has determined that the proposed actions will have no significant effect on the quality of the environment, once it is modified as follows:

1. The applicant agrees via a restrictive declaration to conduct a Phase II Environmental Site Assessment (Phase II) in accordance with the sampling protocol approved by New York City Department of Environmental Protection (DEP).

The applicant further agrees to perform any necessary remediation of the subject property if hazardous materials are found as the result of the Phase II. The applicant would prepare a Remedial Action Plan, including a sampling protocol and a health and safety plan, for DEP for approval. Remediation measures would be undertaken pursuant to the approved remediation plan.

The restrictive declaration also restricts the applicant from submitting any permit applications to the New York City Department of Buildings (DOB) that would allow for soil disturbance on the subject property until such time that DEP provides the necessary written notice to DOB.

The applicant agrees via a restrictive declaration to

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conduct archaeological identification, investigation and mitigation in accordance with the *CEQR Technical Manual* and New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission (LPC) Guidelines for Archaeological Work in New York City.

The restrictive declaration also restricts the applicant from submitting any permit applications to the DOB that would allow for soil disturbance on the subject property until such time that LPC provides the necessary written notice to DOB.

Supporting Statement:

The above determination is based on an environmental assessment which finds that:

1. Existing land and environmental records for the subject property were reviewed by DEP's Bureau of Environmental Planning and Assessment, and pursuant to a letter dated February 28, 2005, subsurface investigation of soil and groundwater was recommended by DEP due to the potential presence of hazardous materials on the site as a result of past and present on-site land uses. As such, the applicant has entered into a restrictive declaration which requires that a Phase II Environmental Site Assessment (Phase II) be conducted in accordance with the approved sampling protocol.

Further, if warranted by the Phase II, the applicant would conduct any necessary site remediation in accordance with a Remedial Action Plan reviewed and approved by DEP. The restrictive declaration is binding upon the property's successors and assigns. The declaration serves as a mechanism to assure the potential for hazardous material contamination that may exist in the sub-surface soils and groundwater on the project site would be properly characterized prior to any site disturbance (i.e., site grading, excavation, demolition, or building construction). The restrictive declaration was prepared in a form acceptable to the DEP and the restrictive declaration was executed on July 3, 2006. Pursuant to a letter from the DEP dated September 14, 2006, the DEP is in receipt of a signed copy of a DEP-approved restrictive declaration with proof of recording for the site.

Furthermore, as stated in the letter of February 28, 2005, DEP stipulated that the applicant would be required to conduct a building hazardous material survey of lead-based paint, PCBs, and asbestos in areas where construction, demolition, and/or renovation would occur on the subject property.

Consequently, no significant adverse impacts related to hazardous materials will occur.

2. A previous application for the proposed development site requested a determination from LPC as to whether the subject site contains any historical, architectural, or archaeological significance. By letter dated December 31, 2002, LPC determined that the subject site may be archaeologically significant and that further testing would be required in order to determine if the site contains remains from Native American burials and occupation as well as from circa 1859 residential occupation. As such, the applicant has entered into a restrictive declaration which requires that prescribed archaeological work be conducted in accordance with in accordance with the CEQR Technical Manual and LPC Guidelines for Archaeological Work in New York City.

The restrictive declaration is binding upon the property's successors and assigns. The declaration serves as a mechanism to assure that archaeological testing be conducted and that any necessary mitigation measures be undertaken prior to any site disturbance (i.e., site grading,

excavation, demolition, or building construction). The restrictive declaration was prepared in a form acceptable to the LPC and the restrictive declaration was executed on May 10, 2006 and recorded with the City's Department of Finance on August 30, 2006.

Consequently, no significant adverse impacts to archaeological resources will occur.

3. No other significant adverse effects on the environment which would require an Environmental Impact Statement are foreseeable.

It is fully agreed and understood that if the foregoing conditions, modification, and alterations are not fully incorporated into the proposed action, this Conditional Negative Declaration shall become null and void. In such event, the applicant shall be required to prepare a Draft Environmental Impact Statement before proceeding further with said proposal.

This Conditional Negative Declaration has been prepared in accordance with Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law 6NYCRR part 617.

Name, Description and Location of Proposal

The Department of City Planning (DCP) is proposing to rezone approximately 890 acres (on 238 blocks) of the Astoria area of Queens Community District 1 to reinforce established development patterns and allow for a modest increase in residential and commercial density. The rezoning area is bounded by 20th Avenue on the north, Steinway Street on the east, Broadway on the south, and Vernon Boulevard, 8th Street, 14th Street, and the East River on the west, and it encompasses 177 full and 61 partial blocks (for a total of 8,563 lots). The proposed actions would also make the Inclusionary Housing Program applicable in certain districts in select portions of the rezoning area. The specific actions are comprised of two components:

Zoning Map Amendment: to change approximately 890 acres of land currently zoned R4, R5, R6, and R6B to R4, R4B, R4-1, R5, R5B, R5D, R6A, R6B, R7A, C4-3, C4-2A, and C4-4A to reinforce established development patterns and to update commercial overlay districts in the rezoning area by reducing overlay depth or eliminating overlays where only residential uses exist and creating new C1-3, C2-3, and C1-4 districts to reflect existing commercial use patterns. This action would result in a modest increase in residential and commercial density.

Zoning Text Amendment: to revise Section 23-144 of the NYC Zoning Resolution (ZR) to make the Inclusionary Housing Program applicable in R7A Districts proposed to be mapped on 21st Street between 28th Avenue and Broadway and on Vernon Boulevard between Welling Court and 31st Drive and in a C4-4A district proposed to be mapped on block fronts at the intersection of Newtown Avenue and 31st Street

The rezoning study was initiated by DCP following

community concerns that the current zoning in the rezoning area does not adequately provide for orderly growth that reinforces Astoria's established scale and building patterns. Out-of-scale towers, disruption of front yard and street wall continuity, and encroachment of commercial uses on residential side streets threaten to undermine the character of the area. In addition prime corridors are not distinguished from residential side streets in the current zoning patterns, and as a result, recent development has not strengthened the established mixed-use areas of the neighborhood.

The proposed rezoning strategy addresses concerns about recent development through the use of newer contextual zoning designations to more closely reflect residential building types and development patterns that characterize the neighborhood on a block-by-block basis. The proposed contextual zoning is intended to preserve the scale and character of Astoria's blocks and ensure that future residential development would be more consistent with the surrounding neighborhood's building patterns.

The proposed rezoning also provides opportunities for moderate growth. Proposed R5D, R6A, R7A, C4-2A, C4-3, and C4-4A districts would encourage new mixed-used, moderate-density development along some of the area's wider streets, commercial corridors and at sites close to transit hubs. An Inclusionary Housing zoning bonus would be applied in targeted growth areas to provide incentives for the construction or preservation of affordable housing units.

The modifications to the commercial overlay districts are intended to prevent encroachment of commercial uses on residential blocks, make parking requirements more appropriate, and create new districts that would reflect existing commercial uses and provide new business location opportunities.

The proposed actions is projected to result in development on 18 sites with a net increase of 419 dwelling units, 146 units of which would be affordable under the Inclusionary Housing program, a net increase of 87,278 square feet of commercial space, a net decrease of 34,283 square feet of community facility space, and a net increase of 356 accessory parking spaces. In addition to these 18 projected development sites, 46 potential development sites have been identified within the rezoning area. The analysis year for the proposed action is 2019.

To avoid any potential impacts associated with hazardous materials and air quality, as part of the proposed rezoning, an (E) designation (E-245) would be mapped.

Statement of No Significant Effect:

The Environmental Assessment and Review Division of the Department of City Planning, on behalf of the City Planning Commission, has completed its technical review of the Environmental Assessment Statement, dated January 22, 2010, prepared in connection with the ULURP Applications (N 100200 ZRY & 100199 ZMQ). The City Planning Commission has determined that the proposed action will have no significant effect on the quality of the environment.

Supporting Statement:

The above determination is based on an environmental assessment which finds that:

- . The (E) designation for hazardous materials would ensure that the proposed actions would not result in significant adverse impacts due to hazardous materials.
- 2. The (E) designations for air quality would ensure that the proposed actions would not result in significant adverse impacts due to air quality.
- 3. No other significant adverse effects on the environment which would require an Environmental Impact Statement are foreseeable.

READER'S GUIDE

The City Record (CR) is, published each business day and includes notices of proposed New York City procurement actions, contract awards, and other procurement-related information. Solicitation notices for most procurements valued at or above \$100,000 for information technology and for construction and construction related services, above \$50,000 for other services, and above \$25,000 for other goods are published for at least one day. Other types of procurements, such as sole source, require notice in the City Record for five consecutive days. Unless otherwise specified, the agencies and offices listed are open for business Mondays thru Fridays from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. except legal holidays.

NOTICE TO ALL NEW YORK CITY CONTRACTORS

The New York State Constitution ensures that all laborers. workers or mechanics employed by a contractor or subcontractor doing public work are to be paid the same wage rate that prevails in the trade where the public work is being done. Additionally, New York State Labor Law §§ 220 and 230 provide that a contractor or subcontractor doing public work in construction or building service must pay its employees no less than the prevailing wage. Section 6-109 (the Living Wage Law) of the New York City Administrative Code also provides for a "living wage", as well as prevailing wage, to be paid to workers employed by City contractors in certain occupations. The Comptroller of the City of New York is mandated to enforce prevailing wage. Contact the NYC Comptrollers Office at www.comptroller.nyc.gov, click on Labor Law Schedules to view rates.

New York City's "Burma Law" (Local Law No. 33 of 1997) No Longer to be Enforced. In light of the United States Supreme Court's decision in **Crosby v. National Foreign Trade Council**, 530 U.S. 363 (2000), the City has determined that New York City's Local Law No. 33 of 1997 (codified in Administrative Code Section 6-115 and Charter Section 1524), which restricts City business with banks and companies doing business in Burma, is unconstitutional. This is to advise, therefore, that the language relating to Burma contained in existing New York City contracts may not be enforced

CONSTRUCTION/CONSTRUCTION SERVICES OR CONSTRUCTION RELATED SERVICES

The City of New York is committed to achieving excellence in the design and construction of its capital program, and building on the tradition of innovation in architecture and engineering that has contributed to the City's prestige as a global destination.

VENDOR ENROLLMENT APPLICATION

New York City procures approximately \$7 billion worth of goods, services, construction and construction-related services every year. The NYC Procurement Policy Board Rules require that agencies primarily solicit from established mailing lists called bidder/proposer lists. To register for these lists--free of charge-, prospective suppliers should fill out and submit the NYC-FMS Vendor Enrollment application.

PRE-QUALIFIED LIST

New York City procurement policy permits agencies to develop and solicit from pre-qualified lists of vendors, under prescribed circumstance. When it is decided by an agency to develop a pre-qualified list, criteria for pre-qualification must be clearly explained in the solicitation and notice of the opportunity to pre-qualify for that solicitation must be published in at least five issues of the CR.

Information and qualification questionnaires for inclusion on such list may be obtained directly from the Agency Chief Contracting Officer at each agency, (see Vendor Information Manual). A completed qualification Questionnaire may be submitted to the Chief Contracting Officer at any time, unless otherwise indicated and action (approval or denial) shall be taken by the agency within 90 days from the date of submission. Any denial or revocation of pre-qualified status can be appealed to the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings, (OATH), Section 3-11 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules describes the criteria for the general use of pre-qualified lists.

NON-MAYORAL ENTITIES

The following agencies are not subject to Procurement Policy Board rules and do not follow all of the above procedures: City University, Department of Education, Metropolitan Transportation Authority, Health & Hospitals Corporation, Housing Authority. Suppliers interested in applying for inclusion on bidders list should contact these entities directly (see Vendor Information Manual) at the addresses given.

PUBLIC ACCESS CENTER

The Public Access Center is available to suppliers and the public as a central source for supplier-related information through on-line computer access. The Center is located at 253 Broadway, 9th floor, in lower Manhattan, and is open Monday through Friday from 10:00 A.M to 3:00 P.M. ATTENTION: NEW YORK CITY MINORITY AND WOMEN OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES

Join the growing number of Minority and Women Owned Business Enterprises (M/WBEs) that are competing for New York City's business. In order to become certified for the program, your company must substantiate that it: (1) is at least fifty-one percent (51%) owned, operated and controlled by a minority or woman and (2) is either located in New York City or has a significant tie to New York City's business community. PROMPT PAYMENT

It is the policy of the City of New York to pay its bills promptly. The Procurement Policy Board Rules generally require that the City pay its bills within 30 days after the receipt of a proper invoice. The City now pays interest on all late invoices. The grace period that formerly existed was eliminated on July 1, 2000. However, there are certain types of payments that are not eligible for interest. These are listed in Section 4-06 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules. The Comptroller and OMB determine the interest rate on late payments twice a year, in January and in July.

HOW TO READ CR PROCUREMENT NOTICES

Procurement Notices in the CR are arranged by alphabetically listed Agencies, and within Agency, by Division if any. The notices for each Agency (or Division) are further divided into three subsections: Solicitations, Awards; and Lists & Miscellaneous notices. Each of these subsections separately lists notices pertaining to Goods, Services, or Construction.

Notices of Public Hearings on Contract Awards appear at the end of the Procurement Section. At the end of each Agency (or Division) listing is a paragraph giving the specific address to contact to secure, examine and/or to submit bid or proposal documents, forms, plans, specifications, and other information, as well as where bids will be publicly opened and read. This address should be used for the purpose specified UNLESS a different one is given in the individual notice. In that event, the directions in the individual notice should be followed. The following is a SAMPLE notice and an explanation of the notice format used by the CR.
