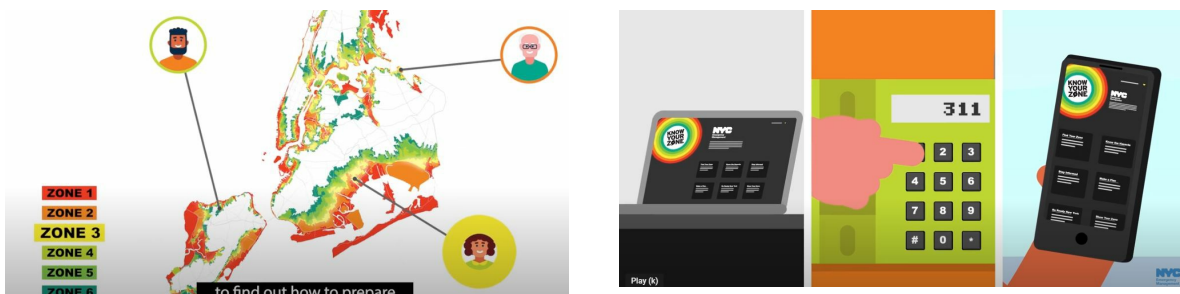




HURRICANES DON'T WAIT. NEITHER SHOULD YOU. #KNOWYOURZONE



The Atlantic Coastal Storm season started on June 1, 2022. Share this preparedness information with your communities.

Hurricanes don't wait, and neither should you.

- **MAKE AN EMERGENCY PLAN** - Everyone in your household should know and understand the emergency plan and evacuation zones. Visit <https://www1.nyc.gov/site/em/ready/guides-resources.page>
- **KNOW YOUR ZONE** - Visit www.nyc.gov/knowyourzone

PRESS RELEASE: NYC EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AND STATEN ISLAND BOROUGH PRESIDENT ANNOUNCE NEW BOROUGH COMMAND CENTER (June 1, 2022)

In line with the start of Atlantic hurricane season, the New York City Emergency Management Department and Staten Island Borough President Vito Fossella debuted the Borough Command Center (BCC) on Staten Island for emergency responders. The BCC will serve as a hub for NYC Emergency Management responders to mobilize and coordinate emergency assets during large-scale emergencies on Staten Island, allowing first responders to strategically address the specific needs of Staten Island's communities.

"Disasters start and end locally, and this new command center will allow us to effectively respond to emergencies that affect Staten Island," said **NYC Emergency Management Zach Iscol**. "We are thankful to Borough President Fossella and his office for their support in helping us continue to build a robust emergency response structure in this city."

Guidance During High Alert Level

- **Stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccines: Get vaccinated and boosted.** Vaccines are available for everyone ages 5 and older. Booster doses are available for everyone 12 and older.

- **Wear a face mask in all public indoor settings and crowded outdoor settings.** Upgrade to higher-quality masks, including KN95, KF94, N95, or a cloth mask on top of a surgical mask. Higher-quality masks will most benefit people who are at high risk of severe illness, are over 65 or are unvaccinated.

- **Consider avoiding higher-risk activities.** Do not go to crowded, indoor gatherings. Limit any type of gathering to a small number of people.
- **Get tested.** Testing is especially important if you have COVID-19 symptoms or were recently in contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19. You should also get tested before and after traveling or getting together with others.

- **Stay home if sick or recently exposed.** Follow all isolation and quarantine guidance, including wearing a face mask. COVID-19 is highly contagious. You can spread COVID-19 even if you do not have symptoms.

Each Toolkit contains:

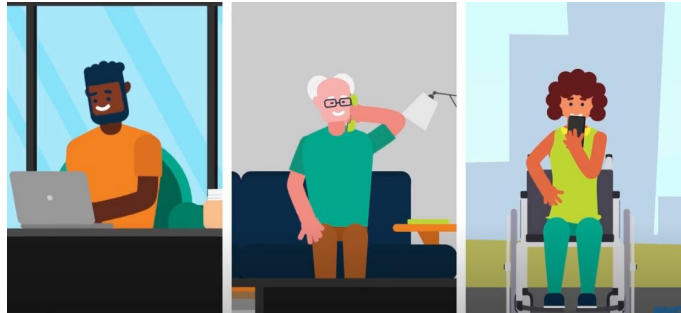
- 1 DVD of "The Storm" (subtitles available in English, Spanish, Russian, Arabic, Chinese, and Bangla)
