From City Prison—In compliance with request for explanation, etc., Warden expresses the belief that the piece of tin used by Randall Fox in his attempt at suicide may have been given to prisoner in the court-room during recess; also states that cells have tinware (cups, spoons, etc.), from which it may have been torn. Piece was about three inches long and a quarter of an inch wide. Prisoner states that he received it in court-room and concealed it in lining of his shoe. On file.
