WORK PERFORMED BY THE SANITARY BUREAU

During the Quarter Ending December 34, 1899.

The following is a summary of the operations of the Sanitary Bureau, which is charged with the duty of inspecting and reporting, in proper form, all nuisances or causes of danger to the public health; with the execution of the orders of the Board; with the care of contagions discases and of the hospitals where patients afferted with contagions discases are treated; with the inspection of foods and offensive trades; with the inspection of recreantile establishments and issuance of employment certificates; with the pathological, hacteriological and chemical research and investigations, and with the inspection of scholars attending the public, parochial and private schools.
