AQUEDUCT COMMISSION.

Minutes of Stated Meeting of the Aqueduct Commissioners, held at their Office, No. 209 Stewart Building, on Wednesday, January 12, 1898, at 3 o'clock P. M.

Present—President Dooling, Commissioners Murray, Power and Ten Eyck. Commissioner Murray moved that the Commissioners proceed to the election of a Vice-President of the Aqueduct Commissioners.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Power, and was unanimously carried. Commissioner Murray moved that Commissioner William H. Ten Eyck be elected Vice-President of the Aqueduct Commissioners.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Power, and was unanimously carried.

In pursuance of a notice given at a meeting of the Commissioners, held on Wednesday, January 5, 1898, that at this meeting a motion would be made to amend section 1 of article III. of the By-laws, changing the number of members of the Committee of Finance and Audit from three to four members, being brought up before the Commissioners, was duly considered, and upon a roll-call being had, was unanimously passed and adopted.

Section 2 of article I., having been considered upon a like notice, changing the hour of the stated meetings of the Commissioners from three o'clock to two o'clock, was duly considered, and upon a roll-call being had, was unanimously passed and adopted.

Commissioner Power then moved that the Commissioners proceed to the election of a Committee of Finance and Audit.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ten Eyck, and was unanimously carried.

Commissioner Power then moved that the Committee of Finance and Audit be composed of Commissioners Dooling, Murray, Ten Eyck and Power.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Murray, and was unanimously carried.

Commissioner Power then moved that the Commissioners proceed to the election of a Construction or Executive Committee of the Aqueduct Commissioners.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Murray, and was unanimously carried.

Commissioner Power then moved that the Construction or Executive Committee be composed of the Mayor, the Comptroller, and Commissioners Dooling, Murray, Ten Eyck and Power.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ten Eyck, and was unanimously carried.

The Secretary called attention to the fact that, under the law creating the Aqueduct Commission, the Commissioner of Public Works was designated an ex-officio member of the Commission, and that he desired to know if there was any provision in the new charter designating any one to take his place as a member of the Aqueduct Commission.

Commissioner Power moved that the matter be referred to the President and Chief Engineer, with power to consult the Mayor.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ten Eyck, and was unanimously carried.

On motion of Commissioner Power, a recess was then taken.

Upon resuming the meeting there were present: President Dooling, Commissioners Murray, Power and Ten Eyck.

The Committee of Finance and Audit reported that they had organized and had elected as Chairman for the ensuing year Commissioner Charles H. Murray.

Which was ordered filed.

The Committee on Finance and Audit recommended the adoption of the following resolution:

On motion of Commissioner Ten Eyck, the same were approved and ordered certified to the Comptroller for payment.

The Construction or Executive Committee reported that they had organized and had elected as Chairman for the ensuing year Commissioner Peter J. Dooling.

Which was ordered filed.

The Construction or Executive Committee presented the resignation of Axeman DeWitt Benedict of the Croton River Division of the New Aqueduct, to take effect January 1, 1898, and recommended that the same be accepted as of that date.

On motion of Commissioner Murray, the recommendation was approved and the resignation accepted.

A communication was received from the Chief Engineer, dated January 12, 1898, containing a brief review of the action taken in regard to the land acquired by the City of New York for the construction of the New Croton Reservoir, and concerning the rental and occupation of the same.

On motion of Commissioner Power, the communication was laid on the table.

The following communication was received from the Chief Engineer:

NEW YORK, January 12, 1898.

To the Honorable, the Aqueduct Commissioners:

GENTLEMEN—At different times during the progress of the work connected with the construction of the New Croton Dam and adjacent reservoirs, surveys were made to determine in a preliminary manner the changes which must take place in the Croton Valley as regards highways, railroads and bridges.

The work connected with these changes is considerable and should be begun this year when all the necessary legal steps are taken. The local Assistant of the Counsel to the Corporation has that matter in charge.

I have consequently directed the Engineers in charge of that work to begin final surveys for the purpose of establishing the final location of the new highways and bridges rendered necessary by the proposed flowage of the valley, and of determining what changes must take place in the railroads.

On motion of Commissioner Ten Eyck, the action of the Secretary was approved and the reports ordered filed.

The Commissioners then adjourned.

Third—That the limits of our assessment for benefit include all those lots, pieces or parcels of land situate, lying and being in the Borough of Manhattan, in the City of New York, which taken together are bounded and described as follows, viz.: Beginning at a point on a line drawn parallel to One Hundred and Eighty-first street distant 100 feet northerly from the northerly side thereof and distant 100 feet westerly from the westerly side of Audubon avenue; thence easterly along said line drawn parallel to One Hundred and Eighty-first street to a line drawn parallel to Amsterdam avenue and distant 100 feet easterly from the easterly side thereof; thence southerly along said line drawn parallel to Amsterdam avenue to the southerly exterior line of the Reservoir; thence easterly along the southerly exterior line of the Reservoir and said line produced to the easterly side of the Croton Aqueduct; thence southerly along the easterly side of the Croton Aqueduct to the prolongation easterly of the centre line of One Hundred and Fifty-eighth street; thence easterly along said prolongation to the centre line of the Harlem River Driveway; thence southerly along said centre line of the Harlem River Driveway to the centre line of Edgecombe avenue; thence southerly along said centre line of Edgecombe avenue to the northerly side of One Hundred and Forty-fifth street; thence westerly along said northerly side of One Hundred and Forty-fifth street to a line drawn parallel to Avenue St. Nicholas and distant 100 feet westerly from the westerly side thereof; thence northerly along said line to the centre line of One Hundred and Fifty-eighth street; thence northerly along the middle line of the blocks between Avenue St. Nicholas and Amsterdam avenue to the middle line of blocks between One Hundred and Sixtieth street and One Hundred and Sixty-first street; thence westerly along the middle line of the blocks between One Hundred and Sixtieth street and One Hundred and Sixty-first street to a line drawn parallel to Amsterdam avenue and distant 100 feet westerly from the westerly side thereof; thence northerly along said line drawn parallel to Amsterdam avenue and distant 100 feet westerly from the westerly side thereof to the middle line of the blocks between One Hundred and Sixty-sixth street and One Hundred and Sixty-seventh street; thence westerly along said middle line of the blocks between One Hundred and Sixty-sixth street and One Hundred and Sixty-seventh street to a line drawn parallel to Audubon avenue and distant 100 feet westerly from the westerly side thereof, thence northerly along said line to the point or place of beginning; excepting from said area all streets, avenues and roads or portions thereof heretofore legally opened, as such area is shown upon our benefit maps deposited as aforesaid.

Fourth—That our report herein will be presented to a Special Term of the Supreme Court, Part III., of the State of New York, to be held in and for the County of New York, at the New York County Court-house, in the City of New York, on the 18th day of April 1898, at the opening of the Court on that day, and that thereon, or as soon thereafter as counsel can be heard thereon, a motion will be made that the said report be confirmed.
