In compliance with section 126 of the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882, the Comptroller of the City of New York herewith publishes the following "full and detailed statement of the receipts and expenditures of the corporation," during the year ending on the first day of August, 1884, and "the cash balance or surplus" in the City Treasury at that date; also "the different sources of city revenue and the amount received from each source," together with "the several appropriations made, the objects for which the same were made, and the amount of money expended under each;" and also "the moneys borrowed on the credit of the corporation, the authority under which each loan was made, and the terms on which the same was obtained."

To this statement, which is specifically called for by law, is appended (under Schedule B), for public information, a brief review of the city's present bonded indebtedness as related to the past and to the future.

SCHEDULE "B."

THE CITY DEBT.

On the first of N wember next the net funded debt of the city will be at a lower point than at any time since the year 1872. The net debt was then \$87,352,957,38. From 1872 to 1876, in which year it reached its maximum, there was a rapid increase. The gross indebtedness of the city on December 31, 1876, exclusive of Revenue Bonds, was \$143,244,859.16, and the net debt, deducting the Sinking Fund (investments and cash), was \$114,948,611.76.

The total decrease of the net debt since December 31, 1876, to August 1, 1884, has been \$23,-941,150,77, as shown by the following statement:

It is estimated that after the payment of the bonds which will mature on the 1st of November next, the net debt will be further reduced more than \$2,000,000, and will then stand at about \$88,800,000, which will, in all probability, be the lowest point it will attain for many years to come.

After the present year the bonded debt of the city is likely to be largely increased by reason of certain public improvements authorized by recent acts of the Legislature, as follows:

1. The new Croton aqueduct, with its attendent reservoirs, estimated to cost \$25,000,000.

2. The projected Parks above the Harlem river, comprising more than 3,800 acres, estimated to require for the purchase of land alone, about \$12,000,000 to \$15,000,000.

3. Sites for School and Armory purposes and the erection of buildings thereon, estimated to require \$5,000,000.

The amount of expenditure for these and other like objects cannot fall much short of fifty millions of dollars.

There is one ground of satisfaction, however, to be found in the fact that the bonded indebtedness which is now falling due and being paid off year by year, is that which was put out at high rates of interest, while that which is being created at the present time is placed at the lowest rates of interest the city has ever known.

The following is a statement of the amount of stocks and bonds of the City and County of New York, exclusive of revenue bonds, outstanding July 31, 1884, showing the amount maturing in each year, and the portion held by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, together with a summary statement of the cash and other investments now held by the Sinking Fund for the redemption of the city debt:

SIR—There were 708 deaths reported to have occurred in this city during the week ending Saturday, August 9, 1884, which is a decrease of 18, as compared with the number reported the preceding week, and 46 more than were reported during the corresponding week of the year 1883. The actual mortality for the week ending August 2, 1884, was 739, which is 7.8 above the average for the corresponding week for the past five years, and represents an annual death-rate of 28.24 per 1,000 persons living, the population estimated at 1,360,612.
