On January 26, forecasters called for an historic blizzard that would dump up to 30 inches of snow across the City and the metropolitan region. Here at DSNY, we hoped for the best while preparing for the worst. I was impressed by the level of commitment and service that DSNY employees from all parts of the agency showed in fighting this storm and keeping the streets and highways clear. As I have told many of you, Sanitation employees are the first of the first responders. Without our critical service, the City would grind to a halt and police, fire, and EMS would be unable to answer emergency calls.

While the City received Information closer to 12 inches of snow from that storm, towns just 40 miles east of the Queens/Nassau border

received more than 24 inches. In total we have received 22 inches of snow so far this season, and February looks to offer at least a few more storms for us to fight. I am incredibly proud of the work that we have done so far this season, and I am confident that we will be able to finish out the season strong.
