## MAYOR DE BLASIO APPOINTS RECOVERY CZAR LORRAINE GRILLO

**NEW YORK**—Mayor Bill de Blasio today named Lorraine Grillo as the Senior Advisor for Recovery. Grillo, who will serve as New York City's "Recovery Czar," will coordinate across City government to supercharge Mayor de Blasio's recovery agenda, as detailed on <u>RecoveryForAll.nyc.gov</u>.

"New York City was hit with an unprecedented health care and economic crisis. Together, we're taking unprecedented steps to drive a recovery for all of us," said **Mayor de Blasio**. "As New York City's first-ever Recovery Czar, Lorraine will cut through bureaucracy, coordinate across all agencies, and reach out to non-profit and private partners to make sure our recovery is felt in every borough, every neighborhood, and every block."

"I build things. That's what I do. And together, we are going to build a recovery that lifts up every New Yorker," said **Senior Advisor for Recovery Lorraine Grillo.** "Every job I've had serving the people of New York City, from responding to Hurricane Sandy to expanding universal Pre-K, has required an intense coordination across different agencies, companies and non-profits. That's the same aggressive approach I'm going to take to lead a recovery for all of us."

"We are leading an economic recovery that involves everything from vaccine distribution to reopening schools to attracting new jobs," said **Deputy Mayor of Housing and Economic Development Vicki Been**. "With Lorraine serving as our Recovery Czar, this effort on all fronts will have a dedicated, centralized leader to make sure we're leveraging every last bit of effort to bring our city back fairer and stronger than ever before."

In this new position, Grillo will coordinate across government agencies, non-profits and the private sector to ensure everyone is working together for New York City's recovery. Working with the New York City Taskforce on Racial Inclusion and Equity, Grillo will build on her work championing minority-and women-owned businesses (MWBE) and push for economic justice across all recovery efforts. Grillo will work directly with Mayor de Blasio to lead a recovery war room that will convene leaders across government for regular progress on recovery efforts.

Grillo's appointment as Recovery Czar is effective immediately, and she will begin a transition from her roles as Commissioner of the Department of Design and Construction and CEO of the New York City School Construction Authority. Grillo, who has served at the School Construction Authority since 1994 and serving as its president since 2010, brings unmatched experience in building physical infrastructure, fair and equitable contracting, and putting the concerns of low-income New Yorkers first.

"Lorraine and I have worked closely for decades on all things school construction-related. Her diverse experiences as a civil servant have positioned her well for this new responsibility, and I look forward to working together with her in this exciting role as we all pitch in to help our City recover from COVID-19," said **State Senator Robert Jackson**.

"Lorraine Grillo has a long and distinguished track record as a public servant dedicated to improving the lives of New Yorkers. I look forward to working with Lorraine to ensure our city comes back from this pandemic as quickly and equitably as possible. We are at a pivotal moment in our city's history and we must get this recovery right," said **Speaker Corey Johnson**.

## About Recovery Czar Lorraine Grillo

Lorraine Grillo began her career at the New York City School Construction Authority (SCA) over 25 years ago as a Community Relations specialist. Over the years, she held a variety of positions within the agency including Director of Government and Community Relations, Senior Director of Real Estate Services and then Executive Director/Chief of Staff to the President.

In May of 2010, Lorraine took over as Acting President and CEO. After successfully opening 26 new schools, at the time, the single most successful year in SCA history, she was appointed President and CEO. In February 2014, Mayor Bill de Blasio reappointed Lorraine to her position making her one of only two re-appointments from the prior administration and the longest serving SCA president.

Over the past ten years, Grillo has built over 80,000 K-12 school seats and over 9,000 universal Pre-K seats. Grillo has coordinated almost 4,000 capital improvement projects in New York City buildings and has managed a total of \$28 billion in budgets. She has led the SCA in its effort to find new and innovative ways to address school overcrowding including developing strong public/private partnerships with major developers.

Grillo's team was responsible for the reopening of 71 schools damaged by Hurricane Sandy in record time. In addition, in 2015, under her leadership, the SCA met the administration's mandate opening 35 Universal PreK centers for the city's four-year-old children in less than six months. Throughout her career, she continues to be a tireless advocate for the MWBE community, maintaining the SCA's reputation for the best MWBE program in New York state, and as a national model.
