MUNICIPAL CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION

Minutes of Meeting of the Municipal Civil Service Commission of New York, Held Wednesday, September 2, 1914, at 10.30 o'clock a. m.

Present-Dr. Henry Moskowitz, President, and Commissioners Darwin R. James, Jr., and Alexander Keogh. The president presided.
