## Resolution Adopted.

WHEREAS, THERE HAS BEEN REFERRED to this Commission by the Division of Factory Inspection appeals from orders issued by said Division of Factory Inspection, said appeals having been made by the parties named herein against the premises noted, the granting of which appeals would necessitate a variation of law; and

Whereas, there has been submitted by said Division of Factory Inspection the following statement of conditions existing in each case and recommendations, which recommendations are made after a reinspection has been had:

1. Premises affected, Buffalo, 32 Churchill st.; appellant, Cutler Desk Co. 4—Additional exit as per Sec. 79-a. 5—Prohibit occupancy. 6—Enclose stairs. 7—Roof of stairway enclosure fireproof. 8—Self-closing fire doors at openings. 9—Stairways incombustible. Two-story nonfireproof building erected after October 1, 1913; with open stairs; no sprinkler; combustibles carried; no fire alarm system; occupancy, 14; above 1st floor, 10; exits, one interior stairway not enclosed fireproof, doors on 1st floor sliding, no doors on 2d floor; imperfect horizontal exit on 2d floor.

Recommendation: Accept as additional exit the bridge when same has been enclosed on top, bottom and sides with heavy sheet or corrugated iron; openings to bridge at each end to be provided with self-closing fire doors opening outwardly onto the bridge at both ends or to be sliding doors; doors to be full width of bridge, which is 7 feet. As compliance with No. 6 and No. 7 accept present interior stairway if same be enclosed with fireproof partition to the underside of the roof; exemption from skylight three-fourths area of shaft if there be windows to outer air within enclosure; all openings in said enclosure to be provided with self-closing fire doors opening outwardly so as not to obstruct the stairway. Waiver of No. 9 for incombustible stairway.

2. Premises affected, Jamestown, 202 North Main st.; appellant, Martin Merz. 1—Additional exit. 2—Prohibit occupancy. Three-story nonfireproof building; divided stairs; no sprinkler; combustibles carried; no fire alarm; occupancy, 14; factory, 12; other, 2; above 1st floor, 14; above 2d floor, 12; exits, two interior stairways, one from 1st to 3d floor and one from 1st to 2d floor, enclosed in lath and plaster partitions; doors to stairways open out and are self-closing; imperfect rear fire escape, openings to which are nonfireproof; size of openings, 7 feet high by 2 feet 6 inches wide; exits remote; no egress from roof; perfect horizontal exit on 3d floor only.

Recommendation: Acceptance of present exits while conditions and occupancy remain unchanged.

3. Premises affected, Johnson City, Corliss ave.; appellant, Endicott-Johnson Co. (Canton Building). Provide additional exits. Six-story fireproof factory building; open stairs; no sprinkler; combustibles carried; fire alarm system installed; occupancy of building, 2d floor, 70; 3d floor, 60; 4th floor, 195; 5th floor, 163; 6th floor, 120. Capacity of present exits are as follows: 2d floor, 168; 3d floor, 166; 4th floor, 416; 5th floor, 166; 6th floor, 166. Exits are two fireproof enclosed stairways, doors to which open outwardly and are self-closing; exits remote; horizontal exit on 4th floor only.

Recommendation: Acceptance of two stairways as means of exit from this building on condition that the occupancy be limited to the capacity of the exits on each floor.

4. Premises affected, Interlaken, Main st.; appellant, Covert's Saddlery Works. Additional exit. Three-story nonfireproof building; open stairs; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy of building, 18; 7 above 1st floor; 3 above 2d floor; exits, interior unenclosed stairway and an imperfect fire escape with nonfireproof openings 3 feet 6 inches high by 2 feet 6 inches wide; fire escape extends from 3d floor to roof of one-story section, and from roof of one-story section there is a ladder to ground; exits remote; no egress from roof.

Recommendation: Acceptance of fire escape while conditions and occupancy remain unchanged.

5. Premises affected, New York Mills (Main Mill No. 2); appellant, New York Mills Corp. Additional means of exit from attic, so that no means of exit will be more than 150 feet distant from any point in building, attic floor. Four-story nonfireproof building; divided stairs; no sprinkler; combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy, 362; above 1st floor, 225; above 2d floor, 143; exits, four interior stairways, two extending from 1st to 4th floors and two from 1st to 3d floors; two of these stairways are enclosed with partitions of fireproof material; doors open out, are self-closing; exits remote; no egress from roof; 4th floor only is involved, from which there are but two stairways with a distance of

435 feet between same; floor used for storage, only occasionally employees are thereon.  
Recommendation: Waiver of order while occupancy of 4th floor remains unchanged.

6. Premises affected, New York City, 518-522 W. 57th st.; appellant, Sterling Top & Equipment Co. 2—Provide and operate exhaust, etc., by operation of jointer, shaper, band saw and circular saw. Electric power used; never more than two persons regularly employed on wood-working machinery, even when plant is busy; there are installed a band saw, buzz saw, shaper and jointer; the shaper is used only for rabbiting hard wood strips; conditions require some provision for controlling dust, but do not warrant installation of complete exhaust system.

Recommendation: Full compliance with law be held in abeyance while conditions remain substantially unchanged, if bottom of band saw, buzz saw and jointer be boxed in.

7. Premises affected, Pulaski; appellant, The Regal Paper Co. 6—Safety devices on newly installed elevator under car platforms instead of on top of same. Hand power used; elevator in storehouse, installed within past year and one-half; equipped with automatic safety device on top of car; no one rides on car, which is used rarely more than once a week; used for carrying stock between 1st and 2d floors.

Recommendation: Waiver of orders while conditions remain unchanged.

8. Premises affected, Rochester, 25 Otsego st.; appellant, B. O'Reilly. Provide additional means of exit. Six-story nonfireproof building; open stairs; no combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy, 15; above 1st floor, 4; above 2d floor, 4; exit, one interior unenclosed stairway (which was accepted without enclosure, as per variation granted October 25, 1916); fire escape on building has fireproof openings, but has 10-inch rise, 5½ inches wide, and is screened but 36 inches instead of 5 feet.

Recommendation: Acceptance of fire escape as additional exit while occupancy remains unchanged.

9. Premises affected, Rochester, 109 E. Main st.; appellant, Alexander Hone. Additional means of exit. Four-story building; divided stairs; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy, 18; 8 factory employees; above 1st floor, 13; above 2d floor, 10; exits, unenclosed interior stairway at northeast corner of building, extending from 1st to 4th floors; stairway in southwest corner from 1st to 2d floors; door from south end 4th floor to roof of adjoining three-story building, and from said roof a door leading to four-story building; from 3d floor a ladder from window at east end leading to roof of adjoining building; no factory employees on 2d or 3d floors; exits remote; no egress from roof; imperfect horizontal exit on 4th floor.

Recommendation: Accept exits as at present provided while conditions and occupancy remain unchanged.

10. Premises affected, Syracuse, 123 East Water st.; appellant, Larned & Baker Co. Permission to place bars across two windows, and glass in door on 1st floor. Building measures 20 feet wide; one inside stairway terminates about 3 feet from one of these windows, the other window is fireproof, being directly underneath fire escape balcony; 10 to 12 employees on upper floor of building; windows as at present constructed could not be used as means of exit; the inside frames of windows are lined with shelves on which bottles are placed; rear of building abuts the "heel path" of the canal, giving easy access to persons desiring to enter from the outside.

Recommendation: Permit bars to be placed along the two windows on ground floor and glass in doorway of rear portion of building on ground floor on condition that said doorway be made to swing outwardly.

11. Premises affected, Minetto (Office Building); appellant, Columbia Mills, Inc. 12—Prohibit occupancy. 13—Additional means of exit. (February 26, 1917.) Three-story and basement building, used for office and storage purposes; no combustibles; fire alarm system not installed; 83-a sprinkler system installed. Occupancy: basement, 72; 1st floor, 28; 2d floor, 44; 3d floor, 44. Exits, one interior stairway from 1st to 3d floors at easterly end; one interior stairway from 2d to 3d floors at westerly end; imperfect horizontal exits at both easterly and westerly ends in the form of a bridge, with one nonfireproof hinged door at each end; horizontal exits on 2d floor only; 1st floor has five means of egress to outer air; basement has tunnel connection with roller building, also tunnel connection with finishing building, and stairway to 1st floor and open area on two sides with windows; exits remote.

Recommendation: Acceptance of stairway from 2d to 3d floors with bridge at westerly end of 2d floor as a second means of exit while occupancy and conditions remain unchanged.

12. Premises affected, Minetto, Sizer Building; appellant, The Columbia Mills, Inc. Additional exit. One, two- and three-story building erected prior to Oct. 1, 1913; one-story building of concrete and brick; two-story building of frame; three-story building of brick; sprinkler installed; no fire alarm system; no combustibles; occupancy, 10; above 1st floor, 1; above 2d floor, 1; never more than five above the 1st floor; exits, an unenclosed interior stairway from 1st to 3d floors, a wooden stairway in two-story part.

AND it appearing that there are practical difficulties and unnecessary hardships in complying with the strict provisions of the law and the rules and regulations of the Industrial Code on the buildings noted herein, and that in granting the variations specified, public safety will be secured and the spirit of the law observed; and

It further appearing that each of the appellants herein has been notified that he would be given an opportunity to appear and be heard, and such of the appellants who appeared having been heard by the Commission, therefore

Be it resolved that the State Industrial Commission grant the variation set forth in each of the cases noted above, it being understood that

same shall be effective only during the time that conditions remain as of this date.

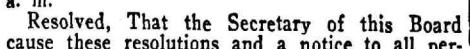

TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH BUILDINGS, ETC., WILL BE SOLD FOR REMOVAL FROM CITY PROPERTY.

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 will be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. The placing therein or permitting the occupancy of any such building by any tenant free for rent or otherwise, excepting the necessary watchmen or the workmen engaged in the actual demolition thereof, shall of itself be a breach of the above conditions of sale.

The person or persons making a bid for any service, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or officers, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the bids will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and the names of all persons interested with him therein, and if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also that it is made without any connection with any other person making a bid for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer or employee of The City of New York is, shall be, or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the bid that the several matters stated therein are in all respects true.

No bid will be considered unless as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of such bid, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks or trust companies of The City of New York, or a check of such bank or trust company signed by a duly authorized officer thereof, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.
