Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (5)	Agency employee inadvertently disclosed identifying information to a member of the public by email.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (9)	Contractor experienced a security incident resulting in disclosures of identifying information to a third party.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee inadvertently disclosed identifying information to a member of the public by verbal means.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Contractor improperly disclosed identifying information to another agency by email.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Contractor inadvertently disclosed client identifying information to a member of the public by mis-indexing clients' identifying information.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee inadvertently disclosed client identifying information by uploading it to a third party.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee inadvertently disclosed client identifying information to a city contractor by email.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee inadvertently disclosed client identifying information by emailing it to another client.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Contractor mistakenly disclosed client identifying information by uploading it to a public website.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee improperly disclosed identifying information to another agency by file transfer.



Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Subcontractor inadvertently disclosed identifying information by leaving client documents at an unknown location.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employees improperly disclosed client identifying information to a third party.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (3)	Agency employee inadvertently disclosed client identifying information to a member of the public by mail.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (3)	Agency employee improperly disclosed identifying information by sending an electronic message to a third party.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (3)	Agency employee improperly disclosed identifying information to a third party.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee inadvertently disclosed identifying information to a member of the public by handing a client's document to the wrong client.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee improperly disclosed identifying information by emailing an audio recording of an agency meeting to a news outlet.
