Our fleet now boasts a cryptic message: 0X30. This is our call to action, leading New Yorkers to send zero waste to landfills by 2030, a goal the Mayor announced in April.

You perform the grueling and meaningful work of collecting refuse, recyclables and organics. Over the next five years, we're implementing programs to make it easier for residents to reduce the waste they generate and help us extract resources that would otherwise be buried in landfills. We have already taken steps to achieve 0X30:

- A redesigned website (nyc.gov/zerowaste) which highlights our waste-reduction programs.
- Our new Guide to Zero, a pocket guide to help residents understand appearance our services and help uniforms. protect our environment.
- An expanded Organics embrace Collection Pilot Program bringing us closer to our goal of serving all Yorkers with curbside collection or drop offs by 2018.
- A completed textile collection pilot program which collected more of 100 than tons textiles for donations.
- A new online application to make it easier to buy, sell, exchange,

donate and receive goods will go live next

We are working with DOE and NYCHA to improve and expand recycling and waste reduction at schools public housing developments, too.
