First - with our team still recovering from one of the City's most unforgiving winters record - Mayor Bill de Blasio commended our extraordinary service this past snow season while announcing our tentative contract with Local 831. This agreement represents how good-faith negotiations between labor and management bring great success.

Second, this year's budget process is monumental for productivity and growth: With additional funding – new support not seen in 10 years - we are now better positioned to grow, perform and serve as a world-class health and safety organization.

With our future secure, we are embarking on a new orientation to waste: shifting an agency historically and singularly focused on collection and snow removal to a premiere organization that will bring New York City to new level of environmentalism. Earlier this month, I convened our
