


City And State Personal Income Tax Shortfalls




Accumulation of the Year-End Budget Surplus

(\$ in millions)




Outyear Gaps Have Grown






Agencies Can Do More








Percent Increase FY14 - FY18

Improving Accountability in the Capital Budget

Charter Revision Proposals

- 1 One capital project per capital budget line
- 2 Regular reporting on condition of capital assets
- 3 Report on schedule delays and cost overruns
