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LAW DEPARTMENT.

Hon. HENRY G. STEBBINS,
President of the Department of Public Parks:

SIR—Your communication of the 31st instant to the Counsel to the Corporation was duly received. You state, in substance, that chapter 160 of the Laws of 1873 authorizes certain parties to lay a railroad track through Seventeenth street to Broadway and Union square, and that the company so authorized is preparing to lay its track across that portion of Seventeenth street which is between Fourth avenue and Broadway. You also state that the north side of Union square has been laid out, at great expense to the city, for the purpose of affording facilities to the First Division of the National Guard, and to the public, when desiring to hold public meetings for military, political, or other purposes; that the spot was designedly selected out of the way of public travel, and that the introduction of a railway directly across the grand plaza will limit the facilities which your Department has undertaken to furnish in the way suggested; and you inquire whether the Department has the legal authority to prevent any mutilation of the plaza, or its diversion from the uses to which it has been dedicated. You state also that, by chapter 89 of the Laws of 1832, Union place is bounded on the north by the northerly line of Seventeenth street, and you suggest that the ground embraced by Union square or park, and over which it is proposed to lay this railway, was the property of the citizens of this city, awarded for specific city uses; but that it is not city property in the sense which would authorize the State to grant the privilege of a railway over its surface; and you desire the opinion of the Counsel to the Corporation as to whether the railroad company can lawfully lay their track across and through Seventeenth street, as proposed; and also whether the route between Seventeenth street and Union square on the northeast, and Fourteenth street and Union square on the southwest, can be changed from that now proposed by way of the north and west sides of the square to one by way of the east and south sides of the square.

I have carefully examined the questions submitted by you, and am satisfied that you are under a misapprehension as to the nature of the title of the city to the portion of Seventeenth street referred to by you. Seventeenth street was one of the streets in this city laid down upon the map of 1807, and the proceedings to acquire title to that portion of the street between the Sixth and Third avenues were completed in the year 1831, the report of the Commissioners having been confirmed by the Supreme Court on the 22d of April in that year. The title which the city has, therefore, in that portion of the street for which such proceedings were taken, is the same as that which the city has in all streets laid down upon that map, and to which title has been acquired in the manner prescribed by law. It is well settled that, under these proceedings, the city acquires the fee of the land, and holds the same for public use.

Chapter 89 of the Laws of 1832, referred to in your letter, and which extended Union place to the north side of Seventeenth street, does not, in the slightest degree, change the nature of the title by which the city holds the fee of this street. It merely extends the boundaries of Union place so as to include Seventeenth street, and it has been within the power of any Legislature since 1832 to modify or entirely repeal this law. I do not see that there can be any question that, as the Legislature had the power to pass the act of 1832, it has the power entirely to repeal it and restore Seventeenth street to its former condition as one of the ordinary street, of the city.

I am unable to see, therefore, why the Legislature has not just as full and complete power to authorize the laying of the railroad track through

that part of Seventeenth street that it has to authorize the laying of such tracks through any of the other streets in the city. Since the passage of the Act of 1832 above referred to, which makes a portion of Seventeenth street, Broadway, Fourteenth street, and Fourth avenue parts of Union place, the University place and the Belt Railroad Companies have been authorized to lay their tracks through those streets. This fact alone creates a strong presumption that the including of those streets in Union place did not form any obstacle to their being used for street railway purposes. Aside, however, from any inference which might be drawn from considerations of this sort, I have no doubt that the powers of the Legislature over Seventeenth and other streets which formed portions of Union place, are precisely the same that they are over the other streets of this city.

The question as to the right of the Legislature to authorize railroad tracks to be laid through the streets of this city is too well settled to admit of discussion! The matter was finally settled in the Court of Appeals, in the case of *The People vs. Kerr* (27 New York Reports, page 188), after elaborate argument by such counsel as Messrs. O'Connor, Evarts, Noyes, Van Buren, Dickenson, and Anderson.

I am compelled, therefore, to advise you that the Legislature had full power and authority to pass the law authorizing the laying of railroad tracks through that portion of Seventeenth street which is included in Union place.

With regard to the second question submitted by you, I am also obliged to say that I do not think that either the Railroad Company, or the Department of Parks, or both, nor any other municipal authority, have any power to change the route laid down in chapter 160, of the Laws of 1873. It was formerly contended that the Common Council had the power to grant the right to lay railroad tracks through the streets of this city, but it was finally settled that the Common Council had no such power, and, by an act passed in 1860, being chapter 10 of the Laws of that year, it was provided that it should not be lawful, thereafter, to lay, construct or operate any railroad in any of the streets of the city of New York, except under the authority and subject to the regulations and restrictions which the Legislature should thereafter grant and provide. It is clear that the route prescribed by the Act of 1873 is through and along Seventeenth street, across the Fourth avenue, and continuing in that street to Broadway, and thence down Broadway to Fourteenth street, and, as above stated, I do not think that this route can be changed, except by an act of the Legislature of this State.

SIR—In compliance with your instructions under date of the 30th ultimo, we have the honor to submit the following as the report of the operations and actions of this Department, for the quarter ending with the 30th ult.

Presentation of the Bennett Medals.

This ceremony took place on May 18, 1874, at Tompkins square, being preceded by a review of a brigade of this Department by your Honor. Medals were presented to Assistant Foreman Henry Schuck, Engine Co. No. 34, and to Fireman Alfred Connor, Hook and Ladder Co. No. 10, for meritorious conduct during the year 1873.

Experiments of the Corps of Sappers and Miners.

On the 23d day of June, 1874, the first public experiments of the Corps of Sappers and Miners took place, at the northeastern extremity of Ward's Island, permission to use that locality having been courteously given by the Commissioners of Emigration. The results of the experiments (which were eminently satisfactory) demonstrated the usefulness of a corps of that character in case of the occurrence of a conflagration too powerful and extensive to be resisted by the ordinary means at the control of the Department.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC PARKS.

Abstract of the proceedings of the Board of Commissioners of the Department of Public Parks for the five weeks ending August 1, 1874.

An opinion was received from the Assistant Counsel to the Corporation, to the effect that the powers conferred upon the Department of Public Works by chapter 566, Laws of 1871, to make blind drains, are not conferred on this Department with reference to the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards.

The following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the Comptroller of the City of New York be, and he hereby is, requested to issue, under the provisions of chapter 645 of the Laws of 1874, to an amount not exceeding the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) of the public fund or stock, to be denominated the "City Parks Improvement Fund," for the improvement and regulation of the several parks, squares and public places, which by law now are,

or may hereafter be, under the control and management of the Department of Public Parks.

William Dent Beall was appointed temporarily as writing clerk, and his pay fixed at \$3 per day.

The action of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment in reducing the amount heretofore appropriated for the use of the Department, and in enacting that all salaries of the "President, clerks, officers, and employees, other than foremen of laborers," should be paid out of the fund appropriated for the maintenance and government of parks and places, was submitted to the Counsel to the Corporation, for his opinion as to whether said Board had not exceeded its authority by such action.

Advertisements were directed to be published for 245 tons of coal.

Mary F. Hyatt resigned the position of Ladies' Maid, in charge of Union Square Cottage, and Mrs. Joanna Decker was appointed in her place, and her pay fixed at \$10.50 per week.

Leave of absence for one week, with pay, was granted to Halsted Hermans, Rodman, and F. Griffenburg, Draughtsman.

All the iron railing formerly around Union square, and such other old material and sheep as are not required on the parks, were ordered to be sold by public auction.

The President was authorized to employ a force, in the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards, of ten laborers, two teams, and one messenger only, to be under the direction of a general foreman.

Offices with storage ground were hired for the use of the Department, in Fordham, at \$30 per month.

A plan was adopted and filed, showing the lines of curb and other surface constructions of Eighth avenue, adjacent to Central Park.

All general foremen and foremen were informed that whenever they may be suspended that such suspension is made without pay.

Proposals for 245 tons of coal and 1,000 lineal feet of dressed base course stone for Eighth avenue wall were publicly opened.

Thirty-five thousand dollar bonds of the late town of Kingsbridge were sent to the Finance Department.

Leave of absence for one week was granted to Morris E. Sterne, Clerk, and S. B. Smith, First Assistant Division Engineer.

True W. Rollins declined to accept the award of the granite-work of a portion of the Art Museum, and said work was ordered to be re-estimated.

Two horse-drinking-troughs were ordered for Five Points Park.

The bid of Theodore F. Tone, for 245 tons of coal, was accepted.

A plan was adopted for a carriage entrance to the Central Park, at the corner of Eighth avenue and One Hundred and Tenth street.

Mr. H. B. Dodworth presented to the Department a piece of the "Charter Oak."

The proposal of the Bigelow Blue Stone Company, for furnishing 1,000 feet of base course stone for eighth avenue wall, was accepted.

The proposal of Kohler & Perkins, for furnishing 5,000 cubic yards of screened gravel, was accepted.

ORDINANCES, RESOLUTIONS,

PASSED BY BOTH BRANCHES OF THE

COMMON COUNCIL

AND

APPROVED BY THE MAYOR,

DURING THE WEEK ENDING AUGUST 1, 1874.

AN ORDINANCE to amend an ordinance entitled "An ordinance to regulate permits for street-stands, sheds, cases, signs, stairways, hoistways, and deliveries," approved February 24, 1866.

The Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty of the City of New York do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 5 of the above-entitled ordinance is hereby amended, and shall read as follows:

§ 5. Every grantee of a privilege under this ordinance for a show-case, signs, stairways, or hoistways, shall pay a sum of one dollar for each, and grantees of all other privileges the sum of one dollar, towards the expense of executing this ordinance, to be accounted for among other fees of the Mayor's office. It is hereby understood and expressed that for the receiving and delivering of goods no fee shall be charged. And the Corporation Attorney shall not hereafter institute suits for alleged obstructions occasioned by the receipt or delivery of merchandise in the ordinary course of business; but no person shall deposit any article or articles upon any street or sidewalk in this city in such manner as to obstruct the free use thereof by the public. The aggregate sum for any one permit containing all or any portion of the privileges expressed in this section shall not exceed the sum of three dollars, and all may be granted for that fee; but in no case is permission to be given to use the street beyond the stoop line.

SEC. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

LETTER FROM THE ASSISTANT COUNSEL TO THE CORPORATION TO THE COMPTROLLER.

AUGUST 3, 1874.

Hon. ANDREW H. GREEN,

Comptroller:

SIR—Your letter of the 23d ult. to the Counsel to the Corporation in reference to the contract for regulating, etc., Broadway, between Thirty-second and Fifty-ninth streets, was duly received. You state that the ordinance authorizing these improvements was passed by a three-fourths vote of the Common Council, and contained the following provision: "The same to be done in such manner as the said Commissioner may deem expedient and for the best interests of the city and property-owners." You refer to section 91 of the Charter relating to contracts, and then say that the Common Council may have the power to direct that work should be done otherwise than by contract, by a three-fourths vote, but their directions must be explicit, and not confer the power on a department to do work either by contract or days' work, as such department may elect, or, in other words, that the Common Council may suspend the provision that requires work to be done by days' work, but they cannot dispense with the requirement to do work by contract at public letting, so that the department may do it by contract at private letting; and you request to be informed whether a contract so made is in conformity with the Charter, and if you are justified in making payments thereon.

Your letter raises two questions. First, whether it was within the power of the Common Council to adopt an ordinance in the form in which this one was framed; and, secondly, whether, if the ordinance was valid, the Commissioner of Public

Works, if he elected to do the work by contract, was not obliged to do it by public letting.

Section 91 of the Charter of 1873 provides, among other things, that work involving the expenditure of more than \$1,000 shall be done by contract, under such regulations concerning it as shall be established by ordinance of the Common Council, "unless otherwise ordered by a vote of three-fourths of the members elected to the Common Council."

It is possible that the words quoted from section 91 might admit of the construction put upon them in your letter, but such a construction, in my opinion, would be forced and unnatural, and would do violence to the clearly expressed intention of the Legislature. The only grounds upon which I can imagine that it can be claimed that the ordinance referred to did not order the work in question to be done "otherwise" than by contract, under the ordinances of the Common Council, are two: First, The ordinance authorizes the work to be done in such manner as the Commissioner of Public Works may deem expedient, and for the best interests of the city and property-owners. This language is broad enough to allow the Commissioner to do the work in any manner in which it can be done, including the doing of it by contract at public letting; and, therefore, I suppose, it is argued that, as the Common Council allow him to do it in certain ways, one of which is by contract at public letting, they have not ordered him to do it "otherwise" than by contract at public letting. But I cannot suppose that a court of law would ever put such a narrow and strained construction upon the language used in the statute. The evident intent of the Legislature was, that, as a rule, work should be done by contract at public letting; but that, if the Common Council, by a three-fourths vote of all the members elected, saw fit to allow it to be

done in any other way, it should have the power to do it. It is perfectly clear that the Common Council did intend that it should, or might be, done in some other way than that prescribed by the statute, and it is the duty of the departments to carry their intentions into effect; and when they say that the work shall be done in any manner in which it can be done, including that allowed by the statute, they do substantially lay down a different rule for the action of the Commissioner than that prescribed by the statute itself, and, in my opinion, they do, in the language of the statute, "otherwise order."

Secondly. It is claimed, as I understand, that the ordinance is invalid, because it leaves it discretionary with the Commissioner of Public Works to choose in what manner the work shall be done. I fail to perceive the force of this objection, and I think there is nothing whatever in the statute to sustain it. I do not see why the Common Council, by a three-fourths vote, could not direct that this work should be done in one of two ways, leaving it discretionary with the Commissioner to select which of those two ways he would adopt; and if they could do this, I see no reason why they cannot direct that it should be done in one of a dozen ways, if there are so many in which it can be done, and that that one should be selected by the Commissioner of Public Works.

My opinion is equally decided upon the other question raised by your letter, whether, as the Commissioner of Public Works elected to do the work by contract, he could do it by contract at private letting. This question has been repeatedly passed upon by the Courts. It was raised in the suits and proceedings brought by Charles Guidet to recover payment for work done in South Fifth avenue and a portion of Church street. Section 6 of chapter 872 of the Laws of 1872 provides that the work on those two streets might be done by days' work, or by contract, or in such manner as the said Commissioner of Public Works might deem expedient. The work was done by contract at private letting, and it was claimed that this rendered the contracts invalid, and that Mr. Guidet could not recover. The point was several times presented to the Court, but was always overruled. The Court held distinctly, that, as the Commissioner had the right to do the work in such manner as he might deem expedient, he had the right to do it by contract or private letting. The same question was recently raised in a proceeding taken to vacate the assessments for work done in South Fifth avenue. His Honor, Judge Lawrence, however, decided that it was competent for the Commissioner of Public Works to have the work performed in the manner and form which he adopted, and that he was not obliged to advertise for bids for the work of paving said street or avenue, under the provisions of the act above referred to. The question raised by your letter has thus been distinctly brought before different judges, at different times, and in different suits and proceedings, and as such judges have uniformly overruled the objection, and as I see no reason whatever for doubting the correctness of their decisions, I must advise you that the law upon this point is to be regarded, for present purposes, as settled.

I accordingly advise you—

First. That it was within the power of the Common Council, by a three-fourths vote of all the members elected thereto, to adopt the ordinance in question, and that the ordinance is valid and binding.

Secondly. That, under the ordinance in question, it was not necessary for the Commissioner of Public Works to advertise for bids, and that it was competent for him to make the contract to do the work in question at private letting, and without such advertisement or bids.
