












Number and Percent of Patients with Confirmed COVID-19 March 13 – March 19, 2021








Number and Percent of Open Housing Areas with a COVID-19 Designation March 13 – March 19, 2021








III. Housing: Percentage of People in Custody in Housing Areas with a COVID-19 Housing Designation¹






