Whereas, In order not to be considered as heing too indefinite in statement, additional representation is hereby made that it is estimated that the City is receiving but about two-thirds of the lighting contracted for, and also of same ratio of power without corresponding deductions being made from bills presented for lighting said district; now, in view of the foregoing.

Resolved, That this, the Local Board of the Borough of Queens, City of New York, in meeting assembled this October 5, 1900, does hereby most emphatically protest to the Commissioner of Public Lighting against such "public be damned" policy being practiced upon the common people in this borough in addition to taxing them to pay for such imposition.
