Service Change for Queens Community Board 5 Residents Living in Maspeth, Middle Village, Ridgewood and Glendale

The New York City Department of Sanitation is announcing a service change for residents living in Queens Community Board 5, which includes parts of Maspeth, Middle Village, Ridgewood and Glendale.

Starting Monday, February 5, 2018, the Department will collect organic material once per week, on recycling day. The change will allow the Department to become more efficient with curbside bulk item collection.

Trash collection **will not** change.

Residents needing curbside collection of their large, bulky items can make an appointment at nyc.gov/bulk or by calling 311.

The Department of Sanitation (DSNY) promotes a healthy environment through the efficient management of solid waste and the development of environmentally sound long-range planning for handling refuse, including recyclables. The Department operates 59 district garages and manages a fleet of more than 2,000 rear-loading collection trucks, 450 mechanical brooms and 693 salt/sand spreaders. The Department clears litter, snow and ice from approximately 6,300 miles of City streets and removes debris from vacant lots as well as abandoned vehicles from City streets.
