DSNY Holds Graduation, Promotion and Awards Ceremony

Commissioner Discusses City's 0x30 Campaign, to Send Zero Waste to Landfill by 2030

WHAT:

The New York City Department of Sanitation will hold a **graduation**, **promotion** and **awards** ceremony with more than 700 employees. Commissioner Kathryn Garcia will also speak about the **0x30 Campaign**, our goal of sending zero waste to landfill by 2030.

Gold Medal of Honor awardees, given to employees who went above and beyond the call of duty, include:

- **Curtis Jackson**, a Sanitation Worker who thwarted an attempted robbery at a convenience store while on duty
- Sara Bartlett, Elizabeth Maldonado, Briana Marquez, Cheri Marquez and Lisa Whitfield, civilian employees who worked together to save the life of a coworker who suffered a heart attack while driving. They will be reunited with the coworker they saved.

About the New York City Department of Sanitation

The Department of Sanitation (DSNY) promotes a healthy environment through the efficient management of solid waste and the development of environmentally sound long-range planning for handling refuse, including recyclables. The Department operates 59 district garages and manages a fleet of 2,022 rearloading collection trucks, 450 mechanical brooms and 500 salt/sand spreaders. The Department clears litter, snow and ice from approximately 6,500 miles of City streets and removes debris from vacant lots as well as abandoned vehicles from City streets.
