A “wide street” is any #street# 75 feet or more in width. (*ADD PROPOSED SPACE BETWEEN LINES HERE*)

In C5-3, C6-4 or C6-6 Districts, when a #front lot line# of a #zoning lot# adjoins a portion of a #street# whose average width is 75 feet or more and whose minimum width is 65 feet, such portion of a #street# may be considered a #wide street#; or when a #front lot line# adjoins a portion of a #street# 70 feet or more in width, which is between two portions of a #street# 75 feet or more in width, and which portion is less than 700 feet in length, such portion may be considered a #wide street#, and in that case, for the purposes of the height and setback regulations and the measurement of any #publicly accessible open area# or #arcade#, the #street line# shall be considered to be a continuous line connecting the respective #street lines# of the nearest portions of the #street# which are 75 feet or more in width.

In Community District 7 in the Borough of Manhattan, the roadways of Broadway between West 94th and West 97th Streets which are separated by mapped #public park# shall each be considered a #wide street#.

Governors Island Corporation, doing business as The Trust for Governors Island (The Trust), is a not-for-profit corporation and instrumentality of the City of New York. The Trust holds title to 150 acres of the 172 acres of Governors Island (the Island) located in New York Harbor. The northern part of the Island (North Island) consists of the approximately 92-acre area north of Division Road and is designated as both a National Historic Landmark District and a New York City Historic District. This area includes the National Monument, a 22-acre area administered by the National Park Service (NPS). The portion of the Island south of Division Road (South Island) consists largely of 1960s and 1970s non-historic development on landfill. The Proposed Project consists of the creation of parks and open spaces pursuant to the Park and Public Space Master Plan, reuse of historic buildings, two areas of mixed-use development, and modernization and upgrade of certain infrastructure. This redevelopment of the Island is a complex process and not all the specifics of future development are known at this time.

The initial phase (Phase 1) would be park and open space development that is presently funded and includes the improvement of existing space and the creation of new, publicly accessible spaces on the Island. Also included in Phase 1 are upgrades and stabilization of the existing infrastructure to support the phased redevelopment of Governors Island, specifically: (1) the replacement and repair of the seawall with the consolidation and upgrade of stormwater outfalls, and (2) the provision of new potable water connection(s) beneath Buttermilk Channel. Phase 1 would be completed in 2013. The later phases include additional open space projects identified in the Park and Public Space Master Plan but not presently funded, as well as mixed-use development on the Island. Completion of the later phases park and open space, retenuing of historic buildings, and new development would occur over time in later phases as plans are developed and funding is secured. For analysis purposes, the full project is assumed to be complete in 2030. Several scenarios have been identified that could represent a reasonable range of new development that could occur in conformance with the Island's current land use covenants.

The project site is located on Governors Island in New York Harbor and is designated as Block 1, Lot 10 in Manhattan Community District 1. The project site does not include the 22 acre National Monument.

The initial discretionary action by the City is the approval of capital funding to begin construction of Phase 1 and to invest in basic Island infrastructure. This funding approval is a discretionary action subject to City Environmental Quality Review (CEQR). In addition, New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) permits and a nationwide or other permit from the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) will be required for in-water work associated with the Phase 1 infrastructure improvements. Discretionary actions for the mixed-use development in the later phases are expected to include land use approvals such as rezoning, special permits, modifications, and/or authorizations from the City Planning Commission (CPC); NYSDEC and/or New York City Department of Environmental Protection (NYCDEP) permits or approvals; as well as approval of capital funding for the completion of the park and open space. Subsequent discretionary actions will require further environmental review, the extent of which will be determined at that time.

Directing that a Generic Environmental Impact Statement (GEIS) be prepared, the Environmental Assessment Statement, Positive Declaration, and draft Scope of Work were issued by the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Economic Development on March 4, 2011. A Public Scoping Meeting was held on April 5, 2011 and a Final Scope of Work was issued on October 19, 2011. A DGEIS was prepared and issued on October 21, 2011. ## READER'S GUIDE

The City Record (CR) is published each business day and includes notices of proposed New York City procurement actions, contract awards, and other procurement-related information. Solicitation notices for most procurements valued at or above \$100,000 for information technology and for construction and construction related services, above \$50,000 for other services, and above \$25,000 for other goods are published for at least one day. Other types of procurements, such as sole source, require notice in The City Record for five consecutive days. Unless otherwise specified, the agencies and offices listed are open for business Monday through Friday from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., except on legal holidays.

### NOTICE TO ALL NEW YORK CITY CONTRACTORS

The New York State Constitution ensures that all laborers, workers or mechanics employed by a contractor or subcontractor doing public work are to be paid the same wage rate that prevails in the trade where the public work is being done. Additionally, New York State Labor Law §§ 220 and 230 provide that a contractor or subcontractor doing public work in construction or building service must pay its employees no less than the prevailing wage. Section 6-109 (the Living Wage Law) of the New York City Administrative Code also provides for a "living wage", as well as prevailing wage, to be paid to workers employed by City contractors in certain occupations. The Comptroller of the City of New York is mandated to enforce prevailing wage. Contact the NYC Comptroller's Office at [www.comptroller.nyc.gov](http://www.comptroller.nyc.gov), and click on Prevailing Wage Schedules to view rates.

### CONSTRUCTION/CONSTRUCTION SERVICES OR CONSTRUCTION-RELATED SERVICES

The City of New York is committed to achieving excellence in the design and construction of its capital program, and building on the tradition of innovation in architecture and engineering that has contributed to the City's prestige as a global destination.

### VENDOR ENROLLMENT APPLICATION

New York City procures approximately \$17 billion worth of goods, services, construction and construction-related services every year. The NYC Procurement Policy Board Rules require that agencies primarily solicit from established mailing lists called bidder/proposer lists. Registration for these lists is free of charge. To register for these lists, prospective suppliers should fill out and submit the NYC-FMS Vendor Enrollment application, which can be found online at [www.nyc.gov/selltonyc](http://www.nyc.gov/selltonyc). To request a paper copy of the application, or if you are uncertain whether you have already submitted an application, call the Vendor Enrollment Center at (212) 857-1680.

### SELLING TO GOVERNMENT TRAINING WORKSHOP

New and experienced vendors are encouraged to register for a free training course on how to do business with New York City. "Selling to Government" workshops are conducted by the Department of Small Business Services at 110 William Street, New York, NY 10038. Sessions are convened on the second Tuesday of each month from 10:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. ### PRE-QUALIFIED LISTS

New York City procurement policy permits agencies to develop and solicit from pre-qualified lists of vendors, under prescribed circumstances. When an agency decides to develop a pre-qualified list, criteria for pre-qualification must be clearly explained in the solicitation and notice of the opportunity to pre-qualify for that solicitation must be published in at least five issues of the CR. Information and qualification questionnaires for inclusion on such lists may be obtained directly from the Agency Chief Contracting Officer at each agency (see Vendor Information Manual). A completed qualification questionnaire may be submitted to an Agency Chief Contracting Officer at any time, unless otherwise indicated, and action (approval or denial) shall be taken by the agency within 90 days from the date of submission. Any denial or revocation of pre-qualified status can be appealed to the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings (OATH). Section 3-10 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules describes the criteria for the general use of pre-qualified lists. ### NON-MAYORAL ENTITIES

The following agencies are not subject to Procurement Policy Board Rules and do not follow all of the above procedures: City University, Department of Education, Metropolitan Transportation Authority, Health & Hospitals Corporation, and the Housing Authority. Suppliers interested in applying for inclusion on bidders lists for Non-Mayoral entities should contact these entities directly at the addresses given in the Vendor Information Manual.

### PUBLIC ACCESS CENTER

The Public Access Center is available to suppliers and the public as a central source for supplier-related information through on-line computer access. The Center is located at 253 Broadway, 9th floor, in lower Manhattan, and is open Monday through Friday from 9:30 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., except on legal holidays. ### ATTENTION: NEW YORK CITY MINORITY AND WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES

Join the growing number of Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprises (M/WBEs) that are competing for New York City's business. In order to become certified for the program, your company must substantiate that it: (1) is at least fifty-one percent (51%) owned, operated and controlled by a minority or woman and (2) is either located in New York City or has a significant tie to New York City's business community. ### PROMPT PAYMENT

It is the policy of the City of New York to pay its bills promptly. The Procurement Policy Board Rules generally require that the City pay its bills within 30 days after the receipt of a proper invoice. The City pays interest on all late invoices. However, there are certain types of payments that are not eligible for interest; these are listed in Section 4-06 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules. The Comptroller and OMB determine the interest rate on late payments twice a year: in January and in July.

### HOW TO READ CR PROCUREMENT NOTICES

Procurement notices in the CR are arranged by alphabetically listed Agencies, and within Agency, by Division if any. The notices for each Agency (or Division) are further divided into three subsections: Solicitations, Awards; and Lists & Miscellaneous notices. Each of these subsections separately lists notices pertaining to Goods, Services, or Construction.

Notices of Public Hearings on Contract Awards appear at the end of the Procurement Section.

At the end of each Agency (or Division) listing is a paragraph giving the specific address to contact to secure, examine and/or to submit bid or proposal documents, forms, plans, specifications, and other information, as well as where bids will be publicly opened and read. This address should be used for the purpose specified unless a different one is given in the individual notice. In that event, the directions in the individual notice should be followed.

The following is a SAMPLE notice and an explanation of the notice format used by the CR.
