Women's History Month!



Since 1987, the United States has observed Women's History Month annually in March to honor women's contributions to history, culture, and society. Ladies' Set of experiences Month outgrew a weeklong festival coordinated by the school locale of Sonoma, California, in 1978. A "Real Woman" essay contest attracted hundreds of students, dozens of schools hosted presentations, and Santa Rosa's downtown hosted a parade.

The concept spread throughout communities, school districts, and organizations all over the country after a few years. The first presidential proclamation recognizing March 8 as Women's History Week was issued by Jimmy Carter in 1980. The following year, a resolution establishing a weekly national celebration was approved by Congress. The National Women's History Project successfully petitioned Congress in 1987 to include the entire month of March in the celebration, and since then presidents have designated March as "Women's History Month" in a series of annual proclamations since 1995. These proclamations recognize women's specific accomplishments in a variety of fields throughout American history and the contributions they have made to the nation.

The National Women's History Alliance states that the theme for this year is "Celebrating Women Who Tell Our Stories." It encourages the recognition of women, past and present, who have been active in print, radio, television, stage, and screen storytelling, as well as blogs and podcasts. Women who have devoted their lives and talents to creating art, pursuing truth, and illuminating the human condition are honored by the theme. Women's experiences have been depicted by a wide range of artists and educators since the earliest storytellers. Scholars, playwrights, performers, and grandmothers from various eras are among these. Our comprehension is enhanced and our bonds with one another are strengthened by women's stories and the larger human story.

Manhattan Borough 2023 (In-Person) Meet and Greet Event


