Hospital technician performed wrong test on wrong patient.

An ultrasound technologist was charged with failing to properly identify a patient and performing the wrong examination on the patient. ALJ Kevin F. Casey sustained the charges. Health & Hospitals Corp. (Kings Co. Hospital Ctr.) v. Kahn, OATH Index No. 1051/15 (July 15, 2015).

Real Property

Denial of watershed variance was rational.

Watershed regulations require any new subsurface sewage treatment system (SSTS) be at least 100 feet from a wetland. A Putnam County property owner wanted to build a four-bedroom residence with a new SSTS which was only 46 feet from a wetland. Solof v. Police Department may retain seized car.

The Police Department sought to retain a car seized in connection with the driver's arrest for criminal possession of a controlled substance, criminal possession of a forged instrument, driving while intoxicated, resisting arrest, and related lesser charges. Richard found that a public works contractor and its president failed to pay prevailing wages and supplemental benefits to 21 employees on eight contracts to perform work on public schools.
