This report provides information related to adolescents and young adults located in a Department of Education facility that offers educational programming to incarcerated individuals. This is a required report pursuant to New York City Administrative Code §9-151. The reporting period pertains to the 2018-19 City school year (9/5/2018 – 6/26/2019).

- 1. The number of departmental infractions issued to adolescents at a department of education site, and the number of departmental infractions issued to young adults at a department of education school site, in total and disaggregated by the type of infraction, as defined by the department:
  - a. There were a total of 94 infractions given to young adults and adolescents during the 2018-19 school year. A breakdown of the type of infractions are attached.
- 2. The number of students prevented from attending educational programming by the Department of Correction because of a behavioral issue or an assault:
  - a. The Department of Correction prevented 53 students from attending educational programming during the 2018-19 school year due to behavioral issues or assaults.<sup>1</sup>
- **3.** The number of assaults on staff at a department of education site, in total and disaggregated by whether such assault was committed by an adolescent or young adult:
  - a. There were 6 instances of assaults on staff committed by adolescents on DOE school sites during the 2018-19 school year.
  - b. There were no reported assaults on staff committed by young adults on DOE sites for the 2018-19 school year.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The Department has witnessed an increase in fights in classrooms during the 2018-19 school year and therefore has prevented an increased number of students from attending educational programming. Increased fights are due to officers no longer being stationed in DOE classrooms. Officers are required to stay in the housing areas since young adults (18-21 year olds) can opt-out of attending educational programming (Directive 3503R). Historically, when the Department housed adolescents (16-17 year olds) on Rikers Island, officers were required to be present in the classrooms since school was mandatory for all adolescent students.
