Plan No. 1407, for one five-story tenement, 29 feet 6½ inches by 103 feet 2 inches, on a lot of the same width and 113 feet 2 inches deep, on the southwest corner of St. Nicholas avenue and One Hundred and Twenty-fourth street, to be occupied by ten families.

Plan No. 1408, for one five-story tenement, 32 feet by 60 feet, with an extension 10 feet by 22 feet 4 inches, on a lot 32 feet by 100 feet, on the north side of One Hundred and Thirty-second street, 232 feet west of Fifth avenue, to be occupied by ten families.

Plan No. 1409, for one five-story tenement, 25 feet by 65 feet, on a lot 25 feet by 100 feet, on the south side of One Hundred and Thirty-third street, 237 feet west of Fifth avenue, to be occupied by five families.

Plan No. 1410, for two four-story tenements, each 25 feet by 60 feet, the corner house to have an extension 10 feet deep, on lots each 25 feet wide by 70 and 100 feet respectively, on the northeast corner of Second avenue and Seventy-third street, each to be occupied by six families.

Plan No. 1411, for one four-story tenement, 25 feet by 83 feet, including extension, on a lot 25 feet by 95 feet, at No. 85 East Tenth street, to be occupied by six families.

Plan No. 1413, for one four-story tenement, 25 feet by 60 feet, on a lot 25 feet by 100 feet, on the north side of One Hundred and Fourth street, 225 feet east of Lexington avenue, to be occupied by eight families.

The weekly reports of Assistant Sanitary Engineers on the plumbing and drainage of new houses examined during the week were received and ordered on file.

#### Sanitary Bureau.

The following is a record of the work performed in the Sanitary Bureau for the week ending March 18, 1882:

The total number of inspections made by the Sanitary and Assistant Sanitary Inspectors was 1,538, as follows, viz.: 4 public buildings, 588 tenement-houses, 81 private dwellings, 52 other dwellings, 12 manufactories and workshops, 15 stores and warehouses, 38 stables, 44 slaughter-houses, 1 roadway, 1 stock yard, 2 lodging-houses, 2 public sewers, 18 sunken and vacant lots, 75 yards, courts, and areas, 109 cellars and basements, 187 waste-pipes and drains, 251 privies and water-closets, 45 streets, gutters, and sidewalks, 2 dangerous stairways, 3 smoky chimneys, 3 cesspools, 4 other nuisances.

The number of reports thereon received from the Inspectors was 371.

During the past week 154 complaints were received from citizens and referred to the Sanitary and Assistant Sanitary Inspectors for investigation and report.

Permits were issued to the consignees of 35 vessels to discharge cargoes, on vouchers from the Health Officer of the Port.

The Disinfecting Corps have visited 1273 premises where contagious diseases were found and have disinfected and fumigated 242 houses, 242 privy sinks, together with clothing, bedding, etc.

30 cases of contagious disease were removed to the hospital by the Ambulance Corps, and 1 dead body to the Morgue.

#### Bureau of Vital Statistics.

The certificates of 569 births, 45 still-births, 141 marriages, and 751 deaths, reported to have taken place in this city, were received by this Bureau during the week ending Saturday, March 18, 1882; this shows a decrease of 11 births, 3 still-births, 25 marriages, and 49 deaths, when compared with the number received during the preceding week, but when compared with the corresponding week of the year 1881, there was an increase of 85 births, 8 still-births, and 76 deaths, and a decrease of 59 marriages. Compared with the mortality reported during the preceding week, the deaths from measles decreased 16; diphtheria, 5; croup, 7; whooping cough, 2; typhus fever, 1; cerebro-spinal fever, 2; alcoholism, 3; cancer, 8; phthisis pulmonalis, 5; bronchitis, 15; pneumonia, 14; hydrocephalus and tubercular meningitis, 1; convulsions, 10; Bright's disease and nephritis, 3; drowning, 3; while the deaths from small-pox increased 1; scarlatina, 2; erysipelas, 1; typhoid fever, 3; malarial fevers, 2; puerperal diseases, 1; diarrhoeal diseases, 5; inanition, 2; rheumatism and gout, 1; heart diseases, 5; aneurism, 1; marasmus, tabes-mesenterica, and scrofula, meningitis and encephalitis, 4; apoplexy, 9; all diseases of the brain and nervous system, 5; cirrhosis and hepatitis, 2; enteritis, gastritis, and peritonitis, 2; premature and preterm births, 2; suicides, 4. The number of deaths from cyanosis and atelectasis was the same in the two successive weeks.

Deaths from the principal Zymotic Diseases, Phthisis Pulmonalis, Pneumonia, Bronchitis, and Children under five years of age, reported during the week and compared with the three preceding weeks.

The ages of 163 of the persons who died during the week were reported to be under one year, 238 under two years, 351 under five years, and 33 seventy years and over, which shows that the deaths of children under five years of age was 33 less than the number reported during last week, and represent 46.74 per cent. of the total weekly mortality.

Of the total number of deaths reported for the week 153 were in institutions, 416 in tenement-houses, 167 in houses containing three families or less, 11 in hotels and boarding-houses, 4 in rivers, streets, boats, etc.; 13 were on the basement floor, 122 on the first, 203 on the second, 132 on the third, 93 on the fourth, 27 on the fifth, 3 on the sixth. 749 were stated to be residents of New York City, and 2 non-residents; 101 were stated to be single, 170 married, 72 widowed, and the condition of 408 was not stated; these were children who had not attained a marriageable age.

The total number of burial permits issued during the week are as follows, viz.: City deaths, 751; still-births, 45; bodies in transit, 25; of the total burial permits issued for city and still-births 63 were upon certificates received from the Coroners; 569 births; 141 marriages; 45 still-births; 751 deaths; 25 applications for transit permits were recorded, indexed, and tabulated. 96 searches of the registers of births, marriages, and deaths were made, and 4 transcripts of the birth record, 76 of marriage, and 53 of death were issued during the week.

The mean temperature for the week ending Mar. 18, 1882, was 35 degrees Fahr., the mean reading of the barometer was 29.953, the mean humidity was 73, saturation being 100, the number of miles traveled by the wind was 1,663, and the total amount of rain-fall was 0.16 inches depth of water, as reported by D. Draper, Ph. D., Director of the New York Meteorological Observatory, Central Park.

The disposition of 679 deaths and still-births, or 85.31 per cent. of the total number reported, was in the following 14 cemeteries: Bayside (Jewish), 16; Calvary (Roman Catholic), 282; City, pauper burial ground (undenominational), 90; Greenwood (undenominational), 52; Lutheran (undenominational), 101; Cypress Hills (undenominational), 33; Evergreen (undenominational), 44; Woodlawn (undenominational), 17; St. Michael's (Protestant Episcopal), 12; Union (Methodist Protestant), 1; Holy Cross (Roman Catholic), 8; Machpelah, L. I. (Jewish), 4; St. Raymond's (Roman Catholic), 6; Washington (undenominational), 13.

The distribution of deaths (actual mortality) for the week ending Mar. 11, 1882, was in the following wards, viz.: First, 7; Second, 0; Third, 3; Fourth, 21; Fifth, 11; Sixth, 17; Seventh, 10; Eighth, 12; Ninth, 6; Tenth, 8; Eleventh, 13; Twelfth, 28; Thirteenth, 2; Fourteenth, 8; Fifteenth, 6; Sixteenth, 13; Seventeenth, 16; Eighteenth, 7; Nineteenth, 50; Twentieth, 19; Twenty-first, 10; Twenty-second, 23; Twenty-third, 8; Twenty-fourth, 2.

The actual mortality for the week ending Mar. 11, 1882, was 775; this is 50 more than the number that occurred during the corresponding week of the year 1881, and 208.4 more than the average of the corresponding weeks of the past five years, and represents an annual death-rate of 31.78 per 1,000 persons living, the population estimated at 1,268,194.

SIR—There were 751 deaths reported to have occurred in this city during the week ending Saturday, March 18, 1882, which is a decrease of 49, as compared with the number reported the preceding week, and 77 more than were reported during the corresponding week of the year 1881. The actual mortality for the week ending March 11, 1882, was 775, which is 28.4 above the average for the corresponding week for the past five years, and represents an annual death-rate of 31.73 per 1,000 persons living, the population estimated at 1,268,194.

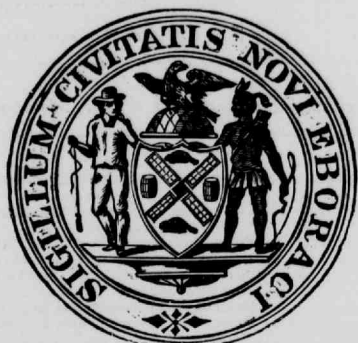
