### Non-Conforming Advertising Signs

In all #Manufacturing Districts#, or in C1, C2, C4, C5-4, C6, C7 or C8 Districts, except as otherwise provided in Sections 32-66 (Additional Regulations for Signs Near Certain Parks and Designated Arterial Highways) or 42-55, any #nonconforming advertising sign# except a #flashing sign# may be structurally altered, reconstructed or replaced in the same location and position, provided that such structural alteration, reconstruction or replacement does not result in:

- the creation of a new #non-conformity# or an (a) increase in the degree of #non-conformity# of such #sign#;
- (b) an increase in the #surface area# of such #sign#; or
- (c) an increase in the degree of illumination of such #sign#.

However, in Community District 1 in the Borough of Brooklyn, a #non-conforming advertising sign# may be structurally altered, reconstructed or replaced in a different location, and may create a new #non-conformity# or #noncompliance#, or an increase in the degree of #nonconformity# or non-#compliance#, provided such #sign# is reconstructed pursuant to a Certificate of Appropriateness from the Landmarks Preservation Commission, is located on a landmark #building# that is part of a #general large scale development#, and there is no increase in the #surface area# or degree of illumination of such #sign#. Furthermore, the discontinuance provisions of Section 52-61 shall not apply to such #sign# provided such #sign# is reconstructed on the landmark #building# prior to the issuance of a temporary certificate of occupancy for any #use# within such #building#.

No #sign# that exceeds or is otherwise in violation of any illumination standard established by rule of the Department of Buildings shall be #non-conforming# as to such illumination standard one year after such rule becomes

To the extent that such structural alteration, reconstruction or replacement of #non-conforming advertising signs# is permitted under the provisions of this Section, the provisions of the following Sections are modified:

Section 52-22 (Structural Alterations)

Sections 52-51 to 52-55, inclusive, relating to Damage or Destruction.

SPECIAL HEIGHT AND SETBACK REGULATIONS
In Subdistricts A, B and C, and Subareas D1, D2 and D3 of the Hell's Kitchen Subdistrict D, and Subdistrict E, the height and setback regulations set forth in paragraphs (a) through (d) of Section 93-42 (Height and Setback in Subdistricts A, B, C, D, E and F) shall apply, except that such regulations are modified in certain locations as set forth in this Section. Such modifications include the establishment of #street wall# location regulations; and minimum and maximum base heights, as illustrated on Map 3 of Appendix A (Mandatory Street Wall Requirements). Such modifications also include depths of required setbacks, maximum length of building walls for towers, and tower #lot coverage#. Special provisions for recesses and sidewalk widenings are as follows:

### (a) Recesses

Where #street walls# are required to be located on #street lines# or sidewalk widening lines, ground floor recesses up to three feet deep shall be permitted for access to building entrances, and deeper recesses shall be permitted only where necessary to comply with the pedestrian circulation space provisions of Section 93-63. Above a height of 60 feet for #buildings# fronting upon 34th Street in Subdistrict C or above a height of 50 feet for #buildings# fronting upon Tenth Avenue in Subdistrict C and Subdistrict D, and up to any specified minimum base height, recesses are permitted provided that the aggregate length of such recesses does not exceed 30 percent of the length of the required #street wall# at any level, and the depth of such recesses does not exceed five feet. No limitations on recesses shall apply above any specified minimum base height or to any portion of a #zoning lot# where #street walls# are not required.

Where #street walls# are required to extend along the entire #street# frontage of a #zoning lot#, no recesses shall be permitted within 20 feet of an adjacent #building#, or within 30 feet of the intersection of two #street lines#, except where corner articulation rules apply.

Special Height and Setback Regulations in the  $34^{\mbox{th}}$  Street Corridor Subdistrict C

(a) 34th Street

For #zoning lots# with frontage on 34th Street, the #street wall# of any #development# or #enlargement# shall be located on and extend along the entire West 34th Street #street line#, except that to allow for corner articulation, the #street wall# may be located anywhere within an area bounded by intersecting #street lines# and lines 15 feet from and parallel to such #street lines#. Such #street walls# shall rise without setback to a minimum base height of 120 feet and a maximum base height of 150 feet. For #corner lots#, these provisions shall also apply along any intersecting #street line# for a minimum distance of 50 feet and a maximum distance of 100 feet from its intersection with West 34th Street. Above a height of 150 feet, the setback provisions of paragraph (b) of Section 93-42 shall apply.

- (b) Tenth Avenue
  For #zoning lots# with frontage on Tenth Avenue,
  the provisions of paragraph (a) of Section 93-541
  shall apply.
- Midblocks between Eighth Avenue and Ninth Avenue (c) For #zoning lots# with frontage on West 33rd Street or West 35th Street beyond 100 feet of Eighth Avenue and Ninth Avenue, the #street wall# of any #development# or #enlargement# shall be located on and extend along the entire West 33rd Street or West 35th Street frontage of the #zoning lot# not occupied by existing buildings to remain. Such #street wall# shall rise without setback to a minimum base height of 80 feet or the height of the #building#, whichever is less, and a maximum base height of 90 feet. However, if the height of an adiacent #street wall# fronting on the same #  $\underline{\text{line#}}$  is higher than 90 feet before setback, the #street wall# of the new or #enlarged building#  $\underline{may\ rise\ without\ setback\ to\ the\ height\ of\ such}$ adjacent #street wall#, up to a maximum height of 120 feet. Above a height of 90 feet or the height of the adjacent #street wall# if higher than 90 feet, the setback provisions of paragraph (b) of Section 93-42 shall apply.


Zoning lots with Eighth Avenue frontage In the South of Port Authority Subdistrict E, for any #development# or #enlargement# on a #zoning lot# fronting on Eighth Avenue, the #street wall# of such #development# or #enlargement# shall be located on the Eighth Avenue sidewalk widening line and extend along the entire #street# frontage of the #zoning lot#. Such #street wall# shall rise without setback to a minimum height of 90 feet or the height of the #building#, whichever is less, and a maximum height of 120 feet. Above a height of 90 feet, no portion of the #development# or #enlargement# shall penetrate a #sky exposure plane# that begins at a height of 120 feet above the Eighth Avenue sidewalk widening line and #street lines# of West 39th Street and West 40th Street, as

applicable, and rises over the #zoning lot# at a slope of four feet of vertical distance, for each foot of horizontal distance, excent as provided below:

For #zoning lots# with frontage on Eighth Avenue, the #street wall# of a #development# or #enlargement# shall be located on the Eighth Avenue sidewalk widening line and, where applicable, on the West 39<sup>th</sup> Street and West 40<sup>th</sup> Street #street lines#, and extend along the entire #street# frontage of the #zoning lot#. Such #street walls# shall rise without setback to a minimum height of 90 feet and a maximum height of 120 feet. Above a height of 120 feet, no portion of the #development# or #enlargement# shall penetrate a #sky exposure plane# that begins at a height of 120 feet above the Eighth Avenue sidewalk widening line and #street lines# of West 39th Street and West 40th Street, as applicable, and rises over the #zoning lot# at a slope of four feet of vertical distance, for each foot of horizontal distance, except as provided below:

- (a)(1) any portion of the #building or other structure developed# or #enlarged# pursuant to the tower regulations of Sections 33-45 or 35-63, as applicable, may penetrate the #sky exposure plane#;
- (b)(2) permitted obstructions, as listed in paragraph (a) of Section 93-41, may penetrate the #sky exposure plane#. In addition, a dormer, as listed in paragraph (c) of Section 23-62, may penetrate the #sky exposure plane#.
- Zoning lots without Eighth Avenue frontage (b) For #zoning lots# without frontage on Eighth Avenue, the #street wall# of a #development# or #enlargement# shall be located on the #street line# and extend along the entire #street# frontage of the #zoning lot# not occupied by existing #buildings# to remain. Such #street walls# shall rise without setback to a minimum base height of 80 feet or the height of the #building#, whichever is less, and a maximum base height of 90 feet. However, if the height of an adjacent #street wall# fronting on the same #street line# is higher than 90 feet before setback, the #street wall# of the new or #enlarged building# may rise without setback to the height of such adjacent #street wall#, up to a maximum height of 120 feet. Height of Street Walls and Maximum Building Height

The #street wall# of any #development# or #enlargement# shall be located on the #street line# and extend along the entire #street# frontage of the #zoning lot# not occupied by existing #buildings# to remain. On a #zoning lot# with frontage of at least 200 feet, up to 20 percent of the #aggregate width of the street wall#, for a maximum width of 50 feet, may be recessed to a maximum depth of 15 feet from the #street line#, provided the recessed area is located a minimum of 20 feet from an adjacent #building# and that a minimum of 60 percent of such area be planted with any combination of grass, ground cover, shrubs, trees or other living plant material. Such #street wall# shall rise without setback to a maximum height of 90 feet or the height of the #building#, whichever is less. However, if the height of an adjacent #street wall# fronting on the same #street line# is higher than 90 feet before setback, the #street wall# of the or #enlarged building# may rise without setback to the height of such adjacent #street wall#, up to a maximum height of 120 feet. Above a height of 90 feet or the height of the adjacent #street wall# if higher than 90 feet, no portion of the #development# or #enlargement# shall penetrate a #sky exposure plane# that begins at a height of 90 feet above the #street line# or the height of the adjacent #street wall# if higher than 90 feet and rises over the #zoning lot# at a slope of four feet of vertical distance for each foot of horizontal distance to a maximum height limit of 250 feet, ex provided below:

- (a) any portion of the #building or other structure developed# or #enlarged# pursuant to the tower regulations of Sections 33 45 or 35 63, as applicable, may penetrate the #sky exposure plane#, provided no portion of such #building or other structure# exceeds the height limit of 250 feet; and
- (b) permitted obstructions, as listed in paragraph (a) of Section 93-41, may penetrate the #sky exposure plane# and the height limit of 250 feet. In addition, a dormer, as listed in paragraph (c) of Section 23-62, may penetrate the #sky exposure plane#.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN the Commissioner of the Department of Consumer Affairs by Section 20-623 of Chapter 4, Title 20 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York and in accordance with the requirements of Section 1043 of the New York City Charter that the Department promulgates and adopts a rule regarding language assistance notices to be posted at pharmacies.

The rule was proposed and published on March 11, 2010. The required public hearing was held on April 12, 2010.

Section 1. Chapter 4 of Title 6 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding new subchapter B to read as

### SUBCHAPTER B

### LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE NOTICES AT **PHARMACIES**

### §4-11 Content and form of language assistance sign.

- (a) The sign required to be posted at chain pharmacies pursuant to \$20-623 of the administrative code of the City of New York to inform limited English- proficient individuals of their rights to language assistance in the seven languages identified biennially by the Department of City Planning shall include the following statement in English and in each of the languages listed: "Point to your language. Language assistance will be provided at no cost to you."
- (b) The statement in each of the required languages shall be in 20 point bold faced, Arial type in a color that sharply contrasts with the background color of the sign. Each such statement shall be enclosed in a box, and there shall be at least a 1/4 inch clear space between adjacent boxes.
- (c) The statements in all of the required languages shall be printed on one sign that shall be conspicuously displayed on or at each counter where prescription drug orders are dropped off, where they are picked up, and near every cash register where prescription drugs are paid for. Such signs shall be positioned so that a consumer can easily point to the statement identifying the language in which such person is requesting assistance.

**Statement of Basis and Purpose:** Section 20-623 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, enacted by Local Law Number 55 for the Year 2009, requires that the Commissioner specify by rule the size, style and placement of the sign which must be conspicuously posted by chain

pharmacies at or adjacent to each counter where prescription drugs are sold, informing limited English- proficient individuals of their right to obtain language assistance in any of the seven primary languages identified biennially by the Department of City Planning.

The rule specifies the text, format and style of the required sign. The rule also specifies where such signs are to be located to ensure that they will be easily seen at each point where a prescription drug transaction occurs in chain pharmacies.

§24-09 Department Review and Approval Fee and Procedure

a. An applicant who seeks Department approval of a minor alteration(s) and/or other action on a tax lot subject to an (E) designation or a restrictive declaration that does not require a full technical review by the Department shall pay a fee of

An applicant for a new development or for alterations on a</u> tax lot subject to an (E) designation or a restrictive declaration that requires a detailed review by the Department involving a phased approval and sign-off procedure (e.g., monitoring, modeling, testing, remediation) shall pay a fee of \$750.

- [f.] j. If at any point in its review of a submission by the applicant, the Department requires more than the specified time period for the review, the Department will notify the applicant in writing of the necessity of such additional time.
- [g.]  $\underline{k}$ . If at any time the Department fails to provide written comments within a time period specified under this section, or such time as agreed upon by the Department and the applicant, and fails to provide written notice of the necessity additional time, the applicant may submit a written notification to the Department requesting that any comments be provided within thirty (30) days.

### STATEMENT OF BASIS AND PURPOSE

Local Law No. 27 of 2009 amended the New York City Charter to create an Office of Environmental Remediation, led by a director. The office oversees all aspects of the city's brownfield policies and, pursuant to paragraphs 15 and 16 of subdivision e of section 15 of the New York City Charter and section 1404 of the Charter, administers the E-designation program, as defined in the zoning resolution, and ensures compliance with hazardous waste restrictive declarations arising from the environmental review of land use actions.

Paragraph 17 of subdivision e of section 15 of the Charter, authorizes the office to establish fees for programs it administers, and paragraph 18 authorizes the office to promulgate rules.

The office now promulgates the following rule to implement paragraph 17 of subdivision e of section 15 of the Charter. This rule imposes a fee for the office's review and approval of building projects proposed for tax lots subject to an Edesignation or a hazardous materials restrictive declaration. Applicants who seek office approval of minor alterations on E-designation sites or sites subject to hazardous materials restrictive declarations will pay a fee of \$250. Applicants who seek office approval of developments on E-designation sites or sites subject to hazardous materials restrictive declaration sites that require a phased approval and sign-off procedure will pay a fee of \$750.

### NOTICE TO ALL NEW YORK CITY CONTRACTORS

The New York State Constitution ensures that all laborers. workers or mechanics employed by a contractor or subcontractor doing public work are to be paid the same wage rate that prevails in the trade where the public work is being done. ### HOW TO READ CR PROCUREMENT NOTICES

Procurement Notices in the CR are arranged by alphabetically listed Agencies, and within Agency, by Division if any. The notices for each Agency (or Division) are further divided into three subsections: Solicitations, Awards; and Lists & Miscellaneous notices. At the end of each Agency (or Division) listing is a paragraph giving the specific address to contact to secure, examine and/or to submit bid or proposal documents, forms, plans, specifications, and other information, as well as where bids will be publicly opened and read. This address should be used for the purpose specified UNLESS a different one is given in the individual notice. In that event, the directions in the individual notice should be followed. The following is a SAMPLE notice and an explanation of the notice format used by the CR.
