

3. Recommending that the Assistant Corporation Counsel, Bureau for the Recovery of Penalties, be authorized and requested to discontinue the legal proceedings instituted against the premises No. 310 West Eighty-fourth street, Borough of Manhattan, for violation of the law relating to equipment for fire protection, for the reason that the original notice was not served upon the owner. Recommendation approved.

4. Respecting the application of the Manhattan Fire-alarm Company for permission to connect the following premises with the street fire-alarm boxes specified, and recommending that the same be granted:

Recommendation approved.

5. Respecting the application of J. P. Hall, Electrical Contractor, for permission to connect certain premises in the Borough of Manhattan with the nearest fire-alarm box, and recommending that, in the absence of definite information as to his system of establishing such connection, the application be denied. Recommendation approved.

6. Respecting communication from the Deputy Commissioner, reporting that in appreciation of the services of Engine Company No. 101, Borough of Brooklyn, at a recent fire, John Beer of said borough desires to present said company with an American flag, and recommending that said permission be denied. Recommendation approved.

7. Respecting request of M. J. Carey & Co. for removal of telegraph wires from the roof of premises No. 5 East Forty-fifth street, Borough of Manhattan, and reporting that the wires in question are not the property of the Department. Said firm notified.

8. Retaining communication from the Pneumatic Fire-alarm Company in regard to system of communicating alarms of fire to these Headquarters, and reporting that no further explanation is necessary. Company notified.

9. Recommending that Foreman James McCutcheon, Engine 47, Borough of Manhattan, be directed to appear before the Medical Officers with a view to determine his fitness to continue longer in the service of the Department. Recommendation approved.

10.
