

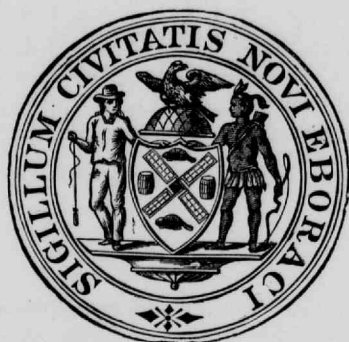

Action of the Board on Tenement House Plans.

The following plans for light and ventilation were approved by the Board upon the conditions specified in the several permits granted.

Plan No. 784 for five-story tenement house 25 feet by 63 feet, with an extension 20 feet 6 inches wide by 12 feet deep, on a lot 25 feet by 92 feet 6 inches, at No 215 West Sixteenth street, to be occupied by ten families.

Plan No. 786 for nine four-story tenement houses, each 25 feet by 60 feet, to be built on lots each 25 feet by 100 feet 11 inches, on the south side of One Hundred and Seventh street, beginning 75 feet west of Second avenue, each house to be occupied by eight families.

Plan No. 789 for one four-story tenement house 42 feet by 86 feet, on a lot 42 feet by 102 feet 2 inches, on the north side of Seventy-third street, commencing 138 feet east of Fourth avenue, to be occupied by eight families.

Plan No. 790 for light and ventilation of one four-story tenement house 21 feet by 86 feet, on a lot 21 feet by 102 feet 2 inches, on the north side of Seventy-third street, beginning 117 feet east of Fourth avenue, to be occupied by four families.

Plan No. 792 for one four-story tenement house, 25 feet by 83 feet, on a lot 25 feet by 103 feet 3 inches, at No. 213 West Fifteenth street, to be occupied by four families.

The following Plans were disapproved by the Board.

Plan No. 788 for a five-story tenement house proposed to be built at No. 586 Grand street.

Plan No. 791 for a four-story tenement house, proposed to be built on the north side of Seventy-third street, 96 feet east of Fourth avenue.

Plan No. 793 for three five-story tenement houses, proposed to be built on the south side of Forty-fifth street, beginning 250 feet east of Eleventh avenue.

On the application of William Jose the permit heretofore granted on Plan No. 781 was so modified that the space between the front and rear houses be twenty feet in the clear. The application to modify the plan by the addition of a piazza extension for water-closets was disapproved.

Sanitary Bureau.

The following is a record of the work performed in the Sanitary Bureau for the week ending January 1, 1881:

The total number of inspections made by the Sanitary and Assistant Sanitary Inspectors was 1,484, as follows, viz.: 3 public buildings, 591 tenement-houses, 101 private dwellings, 72 other dwellings, 8 manufactories and workshops, 7 stores and warehouses, 29 stables, 37 slaughter-houses, 1 lime kiln, 2 manure dumps, 1 garbage dump, 2 gas mains, 3 sunken and vacant lots, 65 yards, courts and areas, 107 cellars and basements, 208 waste-pipes and drains, 187 privies and water-closets, 3 streets, gutters, and sidewalks, 16 dangerous stairways, 4 cesspools, 3 smoky chimneys, 4 other nuisances, together with 30 visits of the Sanitary Inspectors to cases of contagious disease.

The number of reports thereon received from the Inspectors was 579.

During the past week 98 complaints were received from citizens, and referred to the Sanitary Inspectors for investigation and report.

Permits were issued to the consignees of 69 vessels to discharge cargoes, on vouchers from the Health Officer of the Port.

104 permits were granted scavengers to empty, clean, and disinfect privy-sinks.

The Disinfecting Corps have visited 170 premises where contagious diseases were found, and have disinfected and fumigated 146 houses, 146 privy-sinks, together with clothing, bedding, etc.

Eleven cases of contagious disease were removed to the hospital by the ambulance corps.

Bureau of Vital Statistics.

The certificates of 523 births, 55 still-births, 139 marriages, and 673 deaths, reported to have taken place in this city, were received by this Bureau during the week ending Saturday, January 1, 1881; this shows an increase of 100 births, 11 still-births, and 26 deaths, and a decrease of 61 marriages, when compared with the number received during the preceding week, but when compared with the corresponding week of the year 1879, there was a decrease of 10 births, and an increase of 12 still-births, 2 marriages and 165 deaths. Compared with the mortality reported during the preceding week, the deaths from diphtheria decreased 4; croup, 2; typhus fever, 1; cerebro-spinal fever, 2; puerperal diseases, 2; inanition, 6; rheumatism and gout, 1; cancer, 3; pneumonia, 9; meningitis and encephalitis, 6; convulsions, 3; all diseases of the brain and nervous system, 9; cyanosis and atelectasis, 2; premature and perinatal births, 2; drowning, 1; while the deaths from measles increased 1; scarlatina, 5; whooping cough, 2; erysipelas, 3; typhoid fever, 2; malarial fevers, 4; diarrhoeal diseases, 14; bronchitis, 7; heart diseases, 3; aneurism, 1; marasmus, tabes mesenterica, and scrofula, 3; hydrocephalus and tubercular meningitis, 6; apoplexy, 4; gastritis, enteritis, and peritonitis, 1; Bright's disease and nephritis, 1. The number of deaths from alcoholism, phthisis pulmonalis, cirrhosis and hepatitis, and suicide was the same in the two successive weeks.

Deaths from the principal Zymotic Diseases, Phthisis Pulmonalis, Pneumonia, Bronchitis, and Children under five years of age, reported during the week and compared with the three preceding weeks.

Of the total number of deaths reported for the week, 106 were in institutions, 439 in tenement houses, 114 in houses containing three families or less, 10 in hotels and boarding-houses, 4 in rivers, streets, boats, etc.; 8 were on the basement floor, 132 on the first, 195 on the second, 125 on the third, 78 on the fourth, 23 on the fifth, 1 on the sixth; 669 were stated to be residents of New York City, and 4 non-residents; 80 were stated to be single, 170 married, 79 widowed, and the condition of 344 was not stated; these were children who had not attained a marriageable age.

The total number of burial permits issued during the week are as follows, viz.: City deaths, 673; still-births, 55; bodies in transitu, 15; of the total burial permits issued for city deaths and still-births 77 were upon certificates received from the Coroners; 523 births, 139 marriages, 55 still-births, 673 deaths, 15 applications for transit permits were recorded, indexed and tabulated; 32 searches of the registers of births, marriages, and deaths were made, and 4 transcripts of the birth record, 2 of marriage, and 19 of death were issued during the week.

The mean temperature for the week ending January 1, 1881, was 13.9 degrees Fahr., the mean reading of the barometer was 29.897, the mean humidity was 98, saturation being 100, the number of miles traveled by the wind was 1,837, and the total amount of rain-fall was 0.48 inch depth of water, as reported by D. Draper, Director of the New York Meteorological Observatory, Central Park.

S. Census of 1880, being 1,206,577.
