

The work of cleaning the drives, bridle paths and walks in the various parks and parkways was prosecuted during the quarter, as well as the watering of the drives, the natering, weeding, cultivation and cutting of the grass in the lawns and grass borders. The flower bads received accessary attention and the trees and shrubs were pruned where necessary and otherwise prop-

necessary attention and the trees and shrubs were pruned where necessary and otherwise properly taken care of.

During the exceedingly hat weather of the summer it was necessary to give a great deal of attention to the exceedingly hat weather of the summer it was necessary to give a great deal of attention to the watering of the lawns and plantations, and the portion of the irrigation system already completed was of great assistance in this work. Notwithstanding the care taken to prevent damage to the lawns, however, in places where the soil is shallow because of the nearness of rock to the surface, the grass was considerably burned. During the latter pure of the quarter these places have been repaired, and now present their usual attractive appearance.

Base ball, lawn tenus, croquet and picuies were permitted as usual, when the condition of the turf allowed, and many thousands of young people took advantage of the opportunity afforded for healthful outdoor exercise and anuscinent.

The park cortages were kept open in some of the parks until 9 ° M, during the quarter, in which cases an extra attendant was required.

The Central Park ambulance service was kept up during the quarter, answering promptly the considerable number of calls received. This service demonstrates daily the necessity for its continued maintenance, and renders to the public excellent returns for the amount expended upon it yearly.

Considerable quantities of manure have been used during the quarter upon impoverished ground in the parks, and in this way many bare spots in the lawns have been reclaimed for seeding, and green sward now takes the place of unsightly areas. Sodding was also done to a considerable extent in this connection, particularly along the horders and along the newly-laid gatters

of the drives.

The staff in the Conservatory, Central Park, has been engaged, in addition to its regular maintenance work, in preparing for a flower show, which will be given the latter part of October.

Notwithstanding the bented term, the attendance at the Conservatory has been about five hundred

Notwithstanding the beated term, the attendance at the Conservatory has been about twe hundred a day.

The mechanical forces have been engaged in repairs to the various structures in the parks and to the fences, bridges, realling stock, etc. Repairs of considerable magnitude were under to the Bow bridge, to the Elephant house and to the stairway at One Hundred and Sixth street and Central Park West, Central Park as well as to the Winneu's Cortage, Battery Park. Park series to the number of 280 were repaired and 342 constructed, and 27 pieces of rolling stock were constructed and 33 pieces repaired.

Along the Harlem River Driveway trees in a dangerous condition have been removed and the steep slopes on the westerly side improved by grading, sodding and pruning. This work has been done with a view to prevent the serious washouts that have herefore occurred along the driveway and to add to the attractiveness of the landscape features.

On Riverside Park it has been necessary to suspend much of the work because of failure on the part of the Municipal Assembly to promptly take action on appropriations made by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for the purposes.

Work was continued under the contract for the removal of the Forty-second street reservoir. In this connection 15,055 cubic yards of material was taken down and removed. The work on excavation for cellars and renches for foundations and the building of foundations was presecuted, involving 7,460 cubic yards of excavation in trenches between grades 87 and 80, 1,987 cubic yards between grades 82 and 87 and 55 cubic yards between grades 87 and 82; 24,150 cubic feet of concrete footings; 100,865 cubic feet of rubble foundations and 505 cubic yards of back filling.

Work under contract for the sewer from the Swerlish School-house in Central Park to the main sewer in Manhattan square was done in the extent of 342 linear feet of sewer laid, 440 cubic yards of rock excavated, 4,000 feet, board measure, of lumber furnished and 2,000 square feet of sod furnished and laid.

A new system was laid out and a contract executed for the work of reconstructing the drainage of a portion of the East drive, Central Park. The work consisted of laying drain pipes, building road basins, manholes, etc., and was completed during the quarter. In this connection 4,113,17 linear feet of vitrified pipe was farmished and laid, 151,32 cubic yards of rock excavated, 4 road basins built complete, 4,187,75 square feet of sod furnished and laid and 2,552,16 square yards of gutters taken up and relaid.

Sheet asphalt mastic gutters, on concrete base, were laid in the East drive, Central Park, from the Marble arch to Eighty-fifth street, and from Ningty-seventh to One Hundred and Sixth street. Concrete to the amount of 343,59 cubic yards was furnished and laid, and 28,086,68 square feet of asphalt wearing surface. Four crosswalks were laid in the East drive, to comform to the grade of the new gutters. This work involved 12,83 cubic yards of binder furnished and laid and 303,50 square yards of asphalt wearing surface. Asphalt walks were taken up and relaid to bring the same to proper grade, requiring 26.00 cubic yards of concrete base, 2,804,13 square feet of asphalt wearing surface, it walk basin and 56 linear feet of 6-inch vitrified pipe.

Top soil or earth top-dressing was delivered upon the Harlem River Driveway to the amount of 3,999,97 cubic yards, under contract, the work being completed during the quarter.

A contract for regulating, grading, remaying walls, etc., in Thomas Jefferson Park, was executed, and under it 4,000 cubic yards of excavating done and 2,201 cubic yards of filling

placed.

Under the contract for laying water-mains in the Central Park 173½ librar feet of % inch lead pape was laid, 54½ librar feet of 1½ inch lead pape, 3 r-inch taps made, and 5 stop-cocks and three const-tron boxes furnished and set.

In addition to supervising works of construction, the Engineering Corps has prepared specifications for repaving with asphalt certain of the walks around the Arsenal Building, for regulating and grading in Thomas Jefferson Park, specifications, estimate of cost, survey, etc., for proposed repaving of walk antibiology the Harlem Mocr. STATEMENT OF WORK PREFORMED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS OF THE BOROUGHS OF BROOKLYN AND QUEENS DURING THE THREE MONTHS KNOW JULY 1 TO SECTEMBER 30.

PROSPECT PASK.

All the regular work or keeping Prospect Park clean and in good condition, including the drays, bride-paths, gutters, walks and shelters, has received the usual attention.

The Leans, meadows, etc., in the park and the mounds around the place have been regularly mown and the borders kept trainmed, as have also the borders along the Eastern and Ocean

The old-fashioned flower garden on Breeze Hill has been a constant source or delight to the many visitors, as has the cartin garden. The water-lify point have been heated, as usual, and a fine display of tropical water plants has been in exhibition.

A large number of old and discussed trees have been taken out, preparatory to planting new

ones in the fall.

All the drives in the park have been regularly sprinkled. Repairs to the various drives have been carried on and they are all now in excellent condition.

The catch basins and shores of the lakes have been partly cleaned, and the banks of the lakes

The Each make an appear regularly every Saturday and Sanday attenuous in Prospect Band concerts have been given regularly every Saturday and Sanday attenuous in Prospect Bark, and bensionally throughout the season in Tompkins, City, Fort Greene and Winthrop Parks. Special concerts were given in Kings Fark, Jamaica, and the public park at Finshing on Parks. The season ended with the usual Amteriam Day concert in Prospect Park, on Sanday,

September 15.

No displays of the electric fountain were given this season, owing to lack of water.

More than the usual number of people lavie availed themselves of the privileges of the pienic, croquet and lawn tennis grounds, which have been kept clean and in good condition.

Thousands of games of baseball, cracket and houball have been played on the Parade Council.

Over a seriously yards of top-soil have been received during the three months for use in the work of forming the mounds, and new propagating looses have been built by park employees, as the old houses in Prospect Park are no longer large enough for the number of plants required for use in the various parks.

TOMPKINS PARK.

The general work of cleaning and keeping the park in order has been regularly strainled in The known lignor been kept out and watered, and the flower bed , trees and shrubbery have been trimmed and taken care of

A new tile walk was laid around the Library Building in the centre of the purk-

PURT GREEN PARK.

The regular work at keeping the park in good condition has been kept up, the lawns, flower-beds, trees and shrubbery having been triumed and kept in order.

DINSET PARK.

At Sunset Park the golf links have been repaired, and the following work toward the completion of the park has been performed: 9,875 square feet of sods has been cut and laid, expressions have been made for 200 cubic yards of bowlders, which have been set in place; 1,200 cubic yards of earth have been catted from the street to the mounds; 150 trees have been planted on the banks and 250 cubic yards of top-soil for sodding and tree-holes were carted to the park.

These parks have received only the necessary amount of attention to keep them clean and in good condition.

POREST PARK.

In addition to the work of counting Forest Park from depredations and fires the men have been employed in repairing the roads and triaiming the trees and shrubbery.

THE SMALLER PARKS.

Carroll, Bedford, City, Winthrop, Bushwick, Bensonhurst, Highland, Municipal, Long Island City, Flushing, Corona, Kings (Jamaica), Cooper, Zinde), Stu vesant, Underhill, Woodpoint, Cuoper Gore, Lincoln Terrace, Cuyler, College Point and Saratoga and Irving Squares have all been kept in order. The walks, gutters, fountains and shelters have been attended to regularly, the lawns have been mown and their borders trimmed, and grass seed has been sown in bare places. The trees, shrubbery and hedges have also received careful attention, and have been kept free from insects by spraying and brushing.

BROOKLYN HEIGHTS PARKS.

The two small gore parks on Columbia Heights have been turned over to this Department and have all been carefully alreaded to. The grass has been cut and the borders trimmed, the flower-beds have received attention and the walks and gutters have been kept clean and in good order.

RED HOOK PARK.

The work of construction in this park is being carried rapidly to completion. Walks have been graded, two fountain basins have been built, and the grass has been cut and its borders trimmed. Trees and shrubbery have been planted and taken care of.

FORT HAMILTON PARK.

The weeds have been cut down and the park cleaned up, preparatory to beginning the work of grading.

OCEAN PARKWAY.

In addition to the regular work of keeping the roadway clean and regularly sprinkled, the main drive was resurfaced with Marcellus shale and trap-rock screenings, the area covered being 21,700 square yards. Repairs were made to the westerly traffic road at various points between Twenty-second avenue and Kings Highway, 21,000 square yards being resurfaced with trap-rock and screenings.

The speedbury received proper attention, 500 cubic yards of loam having been distributed on it where required.

A large number of old and diseased trees were taken up below Coney Island creek, and the holes filled with top-soft, preparatory to planting new trees in the fall.

EASTERN PARKWAY.

The regular work of maintaining the Fastern parkway has been carried on as usual. The roadway was repaired from Prospect Park plaza to Albany avenue.

This avenue was cleaned throughout its come length and all refuse carted away. It was then resurfaced with Hudson River gravel and trap-rock screenings, covering an area of 17,500 square yards.

GLENMORE AVENUE.

This section of Glemmore avenue between Stone and Alahama avenues was picked up and all large stones and masufinide material removed. It was then resurfaced with trap-rock and screenings, the improvement covering an area of 6,800 square yards.

BAY PARKWAY (TWENTY-SECOND AVENUE).

Bay parkway has been kept in good condition, a number of minor repairs being made. Three new large catch-bases, with gravito heads, were built at Seventy-third street and Bay parkway.

FORT HAMILTON AVENUE;

The section of Fort Hamilton avenue between Concy Island avenue and Ocean parkway is now being repayed. The madbed between the railroad tracks and the southerly earb-line was excavated to a depth of ten inches below finished grain and the surplus material caried away. A gutter of granite blacks, two feat in width, is now being laid. The bottom course of map-mak is being spread as last as the stone can be delivered, and it is expected that the improvement will be completed before the frost sets in.

BAY EIDGE PARKWAY (SHORE DRIVE).

The work on the extension of the Bay Ridge parkway was commenced about July 1st, and the amount of work done during the three months is as follows: Excavation, 25,086 tuble yards: carbing taken up and reset, 1,404 linear feet; belgian-block payement taken up and relaid, 735

The insurement of the Bay Ridge parkway estension embraces two contracts one with Thomas Monahan, for building a roadway from Fourti-avenue to the present Shore road, and the other with the Eastern Stone Company in construct two stone and brick archways, one under Second avenue and one under Third atomic.

The Finances.

The action taken by your Homorable Board on the rith instant, in view of the experience I have lad, warrants me in approxing your action.

On December 5, 1900, I adopted that policy in advertiong for proposals for supplying 10 or of feet of fire-hose for use in the boroughs of Brooklyn and Queens, and 2,000 feet for one in the boroughs of Manhattan and The Brook, and awarded the contract therefore to the lowest blobber, subject to the approval of the surfaces by the Comptroller.

Six—I have the honor to submit a revised plan of the William H. Seward Park, embodying plans of playgrounds, as required by law.

Owing to a misinterpretation of the laws relating thereto it was understood that the Park Commissioner was authorized to construct a playground in the park, but it was not understood at the time when the first plans were drawn that this provision was manufatory, and as playgrounds in other parks had proved to be failures it was considered neither wise not necessary to provide for a playground at the time; consequently, the plans were drawn without a playground and with a view to provide sufficient lawns, shrubberies, promonades and shade trees to make the park really useful and attractive for the hard-working people of the neighborhood.

GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS.

In preparing the present revised plan, the conficting interests of the many needing quiet, rest and recreation, and the few interested in plays and gymnastics, had to be considered impartially, with a view to reader full justice to both classes. Unfortunately the site, awkward lo itself, was rendered still more so by the streets passing through the park, dividing the small area into three separate and wholly independent parcels. Had these streets been closed a larger area would have been available both for lawns and playgrounds and the problem of constructing an attractive park would have been greatly simplified. As the street remained, the problem of unting the three separate parts into one satisfactory work had to be solved before any plans could be drawn. This problem has been solved in the manner shown on the plans, the areest being spanned by archways and buildings which will serve as shelters and will contain such accommodations as

are generally needed in a crowded park. In this manner more or very little land intended for park purposes will be encumbered by buildings, the buildings being constructed wholly over the sidewalks and streets.

It now remained to be considered how much of the park area should be set aside for playgrounds and how much for general park purposes. It was found upon investigation that the neighborhood for miles around the park is crowded with hard-working people, who dirring their day's work have no tack of healthful exercise; and who during their few leisner hours would be more inclined to quiet rest, such as a park under ordinary conditions would afford. The tenements are generally small and crowded, and the women and children of the neighborhood would derive great benefit from the indusence of a peaceful park, with green lawns, ample shade and attractive shrubberies; whereas the playground and gymnasium would be chiefly used by log boys to the exclusion of all the gentle population of the neighborhood. It was therefore clear that if a playground was to be constructed, the claims of children of tender age should first be considered. Thus complying in the treat instance with the spirit of the law, and that the claims of the larger children should be considered only in the second plaze. Experience has shown that where consume playgrounds for the use of children of both sexes are in use, as in Horlson Park, and also at East River Park on a smaller scale, the girls and weaker boys are generally striven away for good and the playgrounds are soon taken possession of by the worst and roughest boys of the neighboring tenements, until the idea becomes old, when the playgrounds under existing conditions are used no more for the purposes for which they were originally intended. Hence, it was deemed necessary, first, to provide a separate playground for small children, and second, to provide separate playgrounds are too a provide of planning the playground so as to make it a harmonious part of the park lasten solved as shown

Waths and Promonades

Walks and Premender.

The park is surraunded by a sidewalk consisting of an asphalt payement with a sarrow border for shade trees. The total area of the adewalk is 20,000 square feet, all of which will be shader by trees and will form a pleasant promenade around the park. The area of the inside walks, not including the places in front of the pavillon and gateways, which are also to be asphalted and will serve as additions to the playground, is 27,000 square feet. The total area of all playgrounds, including asphalted places as mentioned above, is 13,000 feet, so that the promenades, walks and playgrounds occupy nearly one-half of the total area of the park. The setting aside of so large an area for these purposes is necessary in order to accommodate the highest possible number of visitors. To set aside a larger area for these uses would necessarily make the park less attractive and therefore lessen its value as a park. It is estimated that at least ten thousand (10,000) visitors can be easily accommodated at one time, which means that several times that number of visitors can enjoy the use of the park in the course of a day. The walks, sidewalks and smaller playground should be asphalted, while the larger playgrounds should be laid out in the manner of gravel walks.

Buildings.

Buildings.

The shelter pavilion, including separate toilet rooms for men and women at apposite ends of the building, is placed across. Norfolk street, just west of Hester street. The granud floor is designed to contain toilet rooms, while the story above is intended for shelter. The centre of the building above Norfolk street is intended to accommodate the band that might be required to play in the park during the summer mouths. The basement will contain offices and tool-rooms for administration purposes. The building is designed to be created of brick and ornamental terra-catta with tile roof. The archways will contain stairways, seats, etc., and will be used for shelters. The gateways across Division street which serve to under the separate sections of the park, will be constructed of the same materials and will also be used as shelters. The park is to be surrounded by a picket fence from feet high, made of urnamental wrought-iron and placed on a granite or trap-tock coping. It will serve to protect the park and to render visitors more secure. The Lawns,

The lawns occupy a space of sixty-eight thousand five hundred square first, or a little more than half of the total area of the park. They are intended to be slightly rolling so as to give a larger view of the grass area. None of the lawns will be sufficiently large to accommodate games or lawn parties and they will be laid out chiefly for ornamental purposes. The need of grass and vegetation is general in this neighborhood where there is hardly to be knowl a tree or a speck of grass for miles around is very great. Hence every effort has been made to preserve as large an area as possible for lawns and shrubberies. The pavillon is placed so as nor to take up a square foot of what would ordinarily be used for grass or shrubberies and the playground, while sufficiently liberal, has been placed where it will take the least from the grass area and where it will at the same time add to the attraction of the park.

Planting.

Planting.

The plantations are nucessarily confined to shade trees and smaller shrubberies. The shrubberies are so disposed as to make the appearance of the grounds somewhat larger than they are m reality. They would consist of the strongest and hardiest varieties, such as privet, bush honeyswelde, weigelias, golden bells, thorns, after hells, willows, and here and there a few Lombordy poplars, to give character and variety. The shade trees around the park should consist of one species, either California poplar or Oriental plane, of a sufficient size to give shade within a year or two after planting. The shade trees under the park should be of various species, including English clim, Norway maple, lindens, lectures and sliver poplars, most of which can be had of good size and quality. In planting, trees and shrubs of duller and grayer tolinge should be disposed around the park and the brighten and shower cureties towards the centre. The planting plan shows the exact disposition of the several species in the finished park.

The Working Plans.

The buildings, walks, playgrounds, lawns and shrubberies are shown more or less correctly on the general plan. The working plan shows the exact outlines and locations of the several kinds of work buildings and other objects, as well as the grade of the walks and strince of the lawns. The necessary drams and water-pipes are also located on this plan. The general idea is to preserve as much of the ram water as possible and to facilitate its absorption by the ground, as it has been found that most of the city parks are too dry to maintain a thoroughly healthy and vigorous vegetation. Hence, as little as possible of the rain water will be led into the walk-basins, the idea-being to lead the greater part upon the lawns, where it will be readily absorbed. Walk-drains will therefore only be constructed where they are necessary to keep the walks dry for the comfort of the public, and where the walks will keep dry without these means they are wholly avoided. The engineer should bear this fully in mind in carrying out the design, the idea being to preserve as much as possible the natural irrigation for the grass area and for the vegetable in general. The sections show more fully the variety of the surface of the ground and the grade of the walks and promenades.

I believe that if the designs are carried out carefully the best possible results will be obtained. On so small an area much cannot be done, and the designer of a public park is necessarily compelled to take cognizance of many claims that would not be considered if the park was designed purely for ornament. To reconcile the somewhat opposing ideas of utility and beauty and to make the best possible use of the small area set aside for park purposes, in this instance, has been the aim in completing the plans herewith submitted.
