

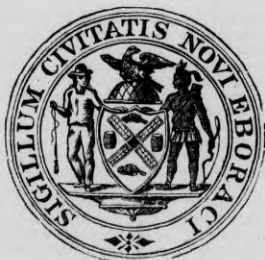

BOARD OF STREET OPENING AND IMPROVEMENT.

The Board of Street Opening and Improvement met at the Mayor's Office, on Friday, April 20, 1888, at 1 o'clock P. M., pursuant to the following notice:

The minutes of the meeting of April 6, 1888, were read and, on motion, approved.

The Secretary presented and read the following communications from the Council to the Corporation:

W. V. I. MERCER, Esq., Secretary, Board of Street Opening and Improvement:

SIR—Under date December 2, 1887, you wrote to my predecessor stating that a sub-committee of your Board had under consideration the matter of changing the limits of Highbridge Park in connection with the sale of certain portions of land under water along the Harlem river, fronting the park, and desired to be informed whether the title by which the City of New York holds the land occupied by the Croton Aqueduct, between One Hundred and Fifty-fifth street and Highbridge, is a fee or an easement.

Considerable difficulty has been encountered in determining the record title to the various parcels or strips of land acquired for the old Croton Aqueduct, because the descriptions of the parcels in such of the records as exist are not given by metes and bounds but reference is made to the number of the parcels on the map prepared by the original Commissioners of the Croton Aqueduct, the length of the parcel and its acreage only being given.

I am informed by Mr. George W. Birdsall, the Chief Engineer of the Croton Aqueduct in the Department of Public Works, that nothing has been known of the maps of the Commissioners since the organization of the Department in 1870, or indeed for many years before that date during the existence of the old Croton Aqueduct Board.

What purports to be and is believed to be a copy of a portion of the Commissioners' map is in existence in the Department of Public Works.

By the aid of this copy and from some papers (four in number, copies of which are enclosed) on file in the Finance Department, I am prepared to advise you that there is no doubt that the City is vested with the fee of the land occupied by the Croton Aqueduct, from High Bridge to One Hundred and Fifty-fifth street.

The first paper is a grant in fee from W. B. Lawrence of a strip, 145 feet long, known as Parcel No. 144 (recorded in Register's office, Liber 395, Conveyances, page 579).

The second paper is a grant in fee from Eliza B. Jumel of a strip, 3,745 feet long, known as Parcel No. 145 (recorded in Register's office, Liber 394, Conveyances, page 344).

The third is an order of the Court of Chancery, dated March 12, 1839, making an award for the fee of a strip, 214 feet long, known as Parcel No. 146, and receipt of the clerk of court for the payment of the award into court. I find the original order is on file in the office of the County Clerk.

The fourth is a grant in fee from Samuel Watkins of a strip, 1,228.25 feet long, known as Parcel No. 147 (recorded in the Register's office, in Liber 397 of Conveyances, page 238).

These parcels, beginning with the Lawrence parcel at a point on the south bank of the Harlem river, coincide with the line of the Croton Aqueduct as it descends from the bank of the river at One Hundred and Seventy-fourth street to One Hundred and Fifty-fifth street on the south.

For these reasons I have no doubt that the City is vested with the fee of the land occupied by the Croton Aqueduct between these points.

SIR—I am in receipt of your letter of November 15th, inclosing a copy of a letter from the Department of Public Parks, with a petition signed by William H. Morrell and others for the opening of Oostdorp avenue and for the closing of the "Old Post road," and inviting my attention to the second and third clauses of letter from the Park Department relating to the opening of Oostdorp avenue and closing of the "Old Post road," and asking my opinion concerning the questions propounded in those clauses.

The third clause of the letter from the Park Department states that the portion of the "Old Post road" referred to was discontinued and closed by the Department, as shown on the map of the West Farms district, and as also shown in gray color on the sketch inclosed in your letter to me and herewith returned to you.

The letter of the Park Department does not contain all the information necessary to enable me to determine whether or not proceedings must be taken to legally close that portion of the Old Boston road, referred to in the letter, as it is possible that the City may own it in fee, notwithstanding the fact that there is no record in the Park Department of its acquisition or cession. In view of the uncertainty as to the character of the City's interest in this road, I am of the opinion, and hereby advise you, that it would lead to undesirable complications to unite in one proceeding the opening of Oostdorp avenue and the closing of that part of the "Old Post road" rendered unnecessary in consequence of such opening.

The Secretary presented the following petitions for opening and widening Railroad avenue, East, from One Hundred and Fifty-sixth street to One Hundred and Sixty-first street, and opening One Hundred and Fifty-sixth street, from Sheridan avenue to Mott avenue and One Hundred and Fifty-eighth street, from Sherman avenue to Sheridan avenue; which were ordered to be referred to the Department of Public Parks for report:

NEW YORK, April 12, 1888.

To the Honorable the Board of Street Opening and Improvement:

The undersigned respectfully call your attention to a petition heretofore filed with your Honorable Board on or about May 25, 1887. Said petition recites the fact that a strip of land about thirty feet in width on the north side of Railroad avenue, and extending from One Hundred and Fifty-sixth to One Hundred and Sixty-first street, which has heretofore, to wit: for the past thirty-seven years, been used as a public highway, is now about to be abandoned as such, for the reason that the westerly line of Railroad avenue has been changed that distance east. This strip of land is between the westerly line of Railroad avenue and the easterly line of the Harlem Railroad (fully explained and shown on maps accompanying). As explained in the petition above referred to, this strip of land cannot now be used or benefited by any person or persons other than for that of a public highway, and as your petitioners at the request of some of the members of your Honorable Board and of the Department of Public Parks at that time abandoned proceedings to retard and against the opening of said Railroad avenue, with the understanding that your Honorable Board and the Department of Public Parks would, after the proceedings then pending to open said Railroad avenue had been finally disposed of, take necessary action to acquire title to said strip of land, to wit: Commencing at a point about one hundred feet north of One Hundred and Fifty-sixth street, on the westerly line of Railroad avenue, running to the south side of One Hundred and Fifty-eighth street, and from the north side of One Hundred and Fifty-eighth street to the south side of One Hundred and Sixty-first street; thence to the easterly line of the New York and Harlem Railroad; thence south to a point about one hundred feet north of One Hundred and Fifty-sixth street; thence easterly to the place of beginning.

This strip of land to the best knowledge and belief of your petitioner is not owned by any person and as it has been in continual use as a public highway for the past thirty-seven years, and over, and as it has been worked and cared for as such during that time by the Commissioners of Highways of the late Town of Morrisania, your petitioners earnestly request your Honorable Board to take immediate proceedings to have the title vested in the City of New York and that the same be continued as a public highway.

To the Honorable the Board of Street Opening and Improvement:

At a meeting of the Property Owners' Association of the Twenty-third Ward, held at Haffen's Hall, April 5, 1888, the following preamble and resolution were unanimously adopted:

Whereas, Cedar Park is now legally a public park; and
Whereas, One Hundred and Sixty-first street (which is three blocks away from the park) on the north and One Hundred and Forty-fourth street (which is six blocks away) on the south, are the only streets communicating with the park, and the eastern portion of the district (which is thickly populated and which paid nearly the entire assessment for the improvement); and

Whereas, It is urgent for public accommodation and convenience, that more streets should lead to the park and the western portion of the ward; therefore be it

Resolved, That the Board of Street Opening and Improvement be respectfully requested to take immediate action to cause One Hundred and Fifty-sixth street, Twenty-third Ward, to be legally laid out, from Sheridan avenue to Mott avenue (one block), and One Hundred and Fifty-eighth street (one block), from Sherman avenue to Sheridan avenue.

Resolved, That the Department of Public Parks be respectfully requested to furnish this Board with a list of streets in the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards (being over a mile in length, for which reason this Board has heretofore declined to institute proceedings to acquire title), which it is deemed for the public interest to have speedily opened, and which, by reason of their uses as public thoroughfares or highways or other causes, a dedication has worked so that in proceedings for opening any of said streets the award for damages will only be nominal.

The President of the Department of Public Parks offered the following resolution:

Resolved, That the Department of Public Parks in the City of New York be and is hereby directed to take from file the maps or plans heretofore filed by said Department, locating and laying out East One Hundred and Seventy-third street, from the westerly side of Weeks street to the westerly boundary of the , in the Twenty-fourth Ward of said city, and amend said maps or plans, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 577 of the Laws of 1887.

Which was adopted by the following vote:

Affirmative—The Mayor, the Comptroller, the Commissioner of Public Works, the President of the Department of Public Parks, the President of the Board of Aldermen—5.

In the matter of the extension of East River Park, from Eighty-sixth to Eighty-ninth street, the President of the Board of Aldermen said he was in favor of it; it was then laid over to give an opportunity for further investigation.

On the question of High Bridge Park the Secretary presented the following statement from the Department of Taxes and Assessments, giving the assessed valuation, by parcels or sections; which was directed to be printed in the minutes and the Secretary was directed to make a computation of the assessed valuation of a parcel of land between the approach to the bridge at One Hundred and Eighty-first street, One Hundred and Eighty-sixth street, Tenth avenue and Exterior street. The further consideration of the High Bridge question was then postponed until the question of the power of the Board in apportioning the assessment was determined by the opinion of the Counsel to the Corporation or necessary legislation.

SIR—in answer to your communication of the 22d instant, I herewith send you the assessed valuation of the property proposed to be taken for Highbridge Park, and have given the information in several sections as requested, as follows, viz.:

AQUEDUCT COMMISSION.

Minutes of Stated Meeting of the Aqueduct Commissioners, held at their Office, No. 209 Stewart Building, on Wednesday, April 18, 1888, at 3 o'clock P. M.

Present—Commissioners Dowd, Baldwin, Barnes, Ridgway and Fish; also Chief Engineer Church, Deputy Chief Engineer Rice, and Consulting Engineer Freley; and Chief Engineer Birdsall of the Department of Public Works.

Vice-President Dowd in the Chair.

The minutes of the stated meeting of April 4 were read and approved.

The minutes of the stated meeting of April 11 were read, corrected and approved.

The Committee on Finance and Audit reported their examination and audit of bills contained in Vouchers Nos. 3547 to 3560, inclusive; and on motion of Commissioner Baldwin the same were approved and ordered certified to the Comptroller for payment.

The Committee also submitted a report relative to the agreement executed by Messrs. Coldwell, Wilcox & Co. and the Aqueduct Commissioners, on the 25th day of October, 1887, for furnishing cast and wrought-iron ladders for shafts on Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, B and A of the New Aqueduct, and recommended the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That the Aqueduct Commissioners do accept the work done and materials furnished by Coldwell, Wilcox & Company, under their agreement made with this Commission on the 25th day of October, 1887, for furnishing cast and wrought-iron ladders for shafts delivered on Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and B and A; and that a proper voucher for final payment for work done and materials furnished under said agreement be approved by the Commissioners, and certified to the Comptroller for payment. Adopted.

The Committee on Construction reported in favor of the adoption of the following resolution, and, on motion of Commissioner Barnes the resolution was adopted, Commissioner Fish voting in the negative:

Resolved, That the forms of contract, specification and bonds submitted on the 4th day of February, 1888, by the Commissioner of Public Works, for furnishing, delivering and laying 48-inch cast-iron pipes and their appurtenances from One Hundred and Thirty-fifth street and Convent avenue to the proposed gate-house near the Central Park Reservoir, and doing all other work necessary to complete Section 16 of the New Aqueduct, and which were approved, adopted and certified and filed in accordance with section 25 of chapter 490 of the Laws of 1883, be and the same are hereby again approved and adopted, and the Secretary is hereby directed to endorse on the triplicate copies of said form of contract, heretofore certified and filed as aforesaid, over his signature as Secretary, these words, "Re-adopted and approved by the Aqueduct Commissioners, April 18, 1888."

Also in favor of the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That the President and Secretary be and they are hereby authorized and directed to publish in the CITY RECORD, and the "New York Tribune," and the "New York Star," daily, for fifteen consecutive days, exclusive of Sundays, and in the "Engineering News and Contract Journal," and in the "Sanitary Engineer," each in two weekly issues of said journals, in brief, the notice and advertisement inviting sealed bids or proposals for furnishing and delivering and laying 48-inch cast-iron pipes and their appurtenances from One Hundred and Thirty-fifth street and Convent avenue to the proposed gate-house in the Central Park Reservoir, and doing all other work in connection therewith, as provided for in the specifications necessary to complete Section 16 of the New Croton Aqueduct, as called for in the forms of contract approved by the Aqueduct Commissioners on the 6th day of February, 1888, and again approved on the 18th day of April, 1888.

On motion of Commissioner Barnes, the same was adopted. Commissioner Fish voting in the negative.

The Committee next presented forms of contract, specifications and bonds, this day submitted by the Commissioner of Public Works, for deepening and finishing Shaft No. 24 on Section A of the New Aqueduct, and constructing the head-house connected therewith; and reported in favor of the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That the forms of contract, specifications and bonds this day submitted by the Commissioner of Public Works, for deepening and finishing Shaft No. 24 on Section A of the New Aqueduct, and constructing the head-house connected therewith, be and the same are hereby approved and adopted; and the Secretary is hereby directed to have triplicate copies of each of said forms of contract, etc., prepared for certification of the Aqueduct Commissioners, and by the Counsel to the Corporation "as to form," and filed in accordance with section 25 of chapter 490 of the Laws of 1883. Adopted.

Also reported in favor of the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That the President and Secretary be and they are hereby authorized and directed to publish in the CITY RECORD and in the "New York Tribune," and in the "New York Star," the notice and advertisement inviting sealed bids or proposals for deepening and finishing Shaft No. 24 on Section A of the New Aqueduct, and constructing the head-house connected therewith, as called for in the forms of contract approved by the Aqueduct Commissioners on the 18th day of April, 1888. Adopted.

Also submitted the following report:

The Committee on Construction recommend that the resolution adopted by you on March 7th last, having reference to the appointment of a Board of Experts to consider and report upon the plans of the Quaker Bridge Dam and Reservoir, be amended by striking out all of said resolution after the word "subject" in the eighth line; and by inserting the name of William F. Shunk for that of Hermann Schussler, so that the resolution as amended will read as follows:

Resolved, That Mr. Joseph P. Davis, C. E., Mr. J. J. R. Croes, C. E., and Mr. William F. Shunk, C. E., are hereby appointed a Board of Experts, to take into consideration the plans of the Quaker Bridge Dam as projected by the Engineers of this Commission, and modifications which may have been or may hereafter be suggested by others, either in plan or cross-section, and said experts are requested to advise the Commissioners fully on the subject.

The resolution was adopted, Commissioner Ridgway voting in the negative.

On motion of Commissioner Barnes, the report of the Committee on Construction presented on April 4, authorizing Rodgers, Shanly & Co. to substitute iron pipe and pumping in place of ditch and drain pipe, was taken from the table.

Commissioner Barnes, from the Committee on Construction, then presented the following resolution, and moved its adoption, and the same was adopted:

Resolved, That the Chief Engineer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to allow Messrs. Rodgers, Shanly & Co., for John Brunton & Co., to substitute iron pipes and pumping in place of ditch and drain pipe, and that a separate order for said iron pipe and pumping be given for the headings of each shaft, to be paid for as extra work and in accordance with the prices and plans proposed by said Rodgers, Shanly & Co., and the Secretary is hereby directed to prepare the certificate to be signed by the Commissioners, as required by section 33 of chapter 490 of the Laws of 1883.

In connection therewith, a report was received from the Chief Engineer and read, showing that if Rodgers, Shanly & Co. were permitted to do the work as provided for in the foregoing resolution, that it would result in a saving to the City of \$7,867.82, and the same was ordered filed.

The Committee on Real Estate presented the following report:

Pursuant to the instructions and authority given by you to the Committee on Real Estate in relation to premises occupied by the Engineers upon the line of the New Aqueduct, we have now to report that in consultation with the Chief Engineer and his assistants, the following arrangements have been made:

1st. The premises occupied by the Engineers of the First Division will be continued for the current year, under the option given by the existing lease, at the rate of \$400 per annum.

2d. The premises occupied by the Division Engineers at One Hundred and Twenty-fifth street, at Morris Dock, at Shaft 17, in the village of Tarrytown, and at Shaft 6, will all be vacated on or before May 1st; and notice thereof has been given to the respective lessees.

3d. In lieu of the office in One Hundred and Twenty-fifth street, a house has been found on St. Nicholas avenue, near One Hundred and Twenty-sixth street, belonging to Mrs. Fanny M. Robinson, which is larger and better than the dwelling on One Hundred and Twenty-third street, referred to in your resolution of March 7th last, and at the same rent, viz., \$1,000 per annum; and we recommend that the former be rented for the Division Engineers of the Fifth Division, for the term of two years from May 1st next.

4th. In lieu of the premises at Morris Dock, rooms have been obtained in the building of the People's Savings Bank in Yonkers, on Getty Square, very accessible, and convenient for the use of the Engineers of Division No. 4, at the rate of \$500 per annum; and we recommend that said rooms be rented for one year, with option of renewal, if the Commissioners so elect.

The premises of Mr. Stone at Ardsley, now occupied by the Engineers of Division No. 3, can be rented for another year at the same rental, viz., \$450 per annum; and we recommend that they be leased at that rate for one year.

5th. The premises of Mr. Wilson at Tarrytown, now occupied by Principal Assistant Engineer Miller (at the rental of \$1,500 per annum) will also accommodate the Division Engineer of the Second Division. The house is not in as good repair as it should be, but Mr. Wilson having lately done considerable repairing, is unwilling to do more. We therefore recommend that the premises be leased for one year, at the rate of \$1,200 per annum, and that such repairs as may be essential for the comfort of the Engineers and employees of the Commission occupying the dwelling-house, be done by the Commissioners at a cost not exceeding \$150. This rental will be accepted by Mr. Wilson.

If the above recommendations are approved, we request that the President and Secretary be authorized to execute leases for each of the aforesaid premises in St. Nicholas avenue, in Yonkers, at Ardsley, and at Tarrytown, for the terms and at the rates above named.

And in connection therewith, the following resolution:

Resolved, That the recommendations of the Committee on Real Estate, in relation to the premises to be rented for the use of the Engineers on the line of the New Aqueduct, contained in their report of this date, be and the same are hereby approved; and the President and Secretary of this Commission are hereby authorized on behalf of this Commission to execute leases for the premises of Mrs. Robinson, on St. Nicholas avenue; of the People's Savings Bank, in Yonkers; of Mr. Stone, at Ardsley; and of Mr. Wilson, at Tarrytown, for the terms and at the rates named in said report.

The report and resolution were unanimously adopted.

The Comptroller, under date of April 14, gave notice of the issue of warrants for the payment of vouchers not certified to by the Aqueduct Commissioners for—

Westchester County Section 157 00
Sodom Dam and Reservoir 151 20
—which was ordered entered upon the books of the Commission, and filed.

The Secretary gave notice of the filing of a copy of a lien by David R. Paige and others against John O'Brien and Heman Clark for work done for said O'Brien & Clark on the New Aqueduct, and the same was ordered filed.

The Commissioners then adjourned.

SEC. 18. That no owner or lessee of any building,

or any part thereof, shall lease, or let, or hire out the

same or any portion thereof, to be occupied by any person,

or allow the same to be occupied, as a place in which,

or for any one, to dwell or lodge, except when said build-

ings or such parts thereof are sufficiently lighted, ven-

tilated, provided and accommodated, and are in all

respects in that condition of cleanliness and wholesomeness,

for which this Code or any law of this State pro-

vides, or in which they or either of them require any

improvement, and shall be kept. Nor shall any such per-

mit, let, hire out, or allow, having power to prevent the

same to be used as or for a place of sleeping or residence,

any portion or apartment of any building, which apart-

ment or portion has at least one foot of its height

No bid or estimate will be accepted from, or contract awarded to, any person who is in arrears to the Corporation upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to the Corporation.

BUILDING PURPOSES.—For each one thousand bricks laid, or for stone-work to be measured as brick-tens cents per thousand. For plastering, forty cents per hundred yards.

COWS.—For each and every cow, one dollar per annum.

DINING SALOONS shall be charged an annual rate of from five to twenty dollars, in the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Works.

FISH STANDS (retail) shall be charged five dollars per annum each.

For all stables not metered, the rates shall be as follows:

HORSES, PRIVATE.—For two horses there shall be charged six dollars per annum; and for each additional horse, two dollars.

HORSES, LIVERY.—For each horse up to and not exceeding thirty in number, one dollar and fifty cents each per annum; and for each additional horse, one dollar.

HORSES, OMNIBUS AND CART.—For each horse, one dollar per annum.

HORSE TROUGHS.—For each trough, and for each half barrel or tub on sidewalk or street, twenty dollars per annum; each trough is to be fitted with a proper ball-cock to prevent waste.

HOTELS AND BOARDING HOUSES shall, in addition to the regular rates for families, be charged for each lodging room, at the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Works.

LAUNDRIES shall be charged from eight to twenty dollars per annum, in the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Works.

LIQUOR AND LAGER BEER SALOONS shall be charged an annual rate of ten dollars each. An additional charge of five dollars per annum shall be made for each tap or wash-box.

PHOTOGRAPH GALLERIES shall be charged an annual rate of from five to twenty dollars, in the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Works.

PRINTING OFFICES, when not metered, shall be charged at such rates as may be determined by the Commissioner of Public Works.

SODA, MINERAL WATER AND ROOT BEER FOUNTAINS shall be charged five dollars per annum each.

STEAM ENGINES, where not metered, shall be charged by the horse-power, as follows: For each horse-power up to and not exceeding ten, the sum of ten dollars per annum; for each exceeding ten, and not over fifteen, the sum of seven dollars and fifty cents each; and for each horse-power over fifteen, the sum of five dollars.

WATER-CLOSETS AND URINALS.—To each building on a lot one water-closet having sewer connection is allowed without charge; each additional water-closet or urinal will be charged as hereinafter stated. All closets connected in any manner with sewer shall be charged two dollars for each seat per annum, whether in a building or on any other portion of the premises.

Urinals shall be charged two dollars per annum each. **WATER-CLOSET RATES.**—For hoppers of any form, when water is supplied direct from the Croton supply, through any form of the so-called single or double valves, hopper-cocks, stop-cocks, self-closing cocks, or any valve or cock of any description attached to the closet, each, per year, twenty dollars.

For any pan closet, or any of the forms of valve, plunger, or other water-closet not before mentioned, supplied with water as above described, per year, ten dollars.

For any form of hopper or water-closet, supplied from the ordinary style of cistern filled with ball-cock, and overflow pipe that communicates with the pipe to the water-closet, or hopper, or from any other hopper or water-closet, when ball-cock is defective, or from which an unlimited amount of water can be drawn by holding up the handle, per year, each, five dollars.

For any form of hopper or water-closet, supplied from any of the forms of waste-preventing cisterns, that are approved by the Engineer of the Croton Aqueduct, which are so constructed that no run into the three gallons of water can be drawn at each lift of the handle, or depression of the seat, if such cisterns are provided with an overflow pipe, such overflow pipe must not connect with the water-closet, but be carried like a safe-waste, as provided by the Board of Health regulations, per year, two dollars.

Cistern answering this description can be seen at this Department.

METERS.

Under the provisions of section 352, Consolidated Act 1882, water-meters, of approved pattern, shall be hereafter placed on the pipes supplying all stores, workshops, hotels, manufactories, public edifices, at wharves, ferry-houses, stables, and in all places where water is furnished for business consumption, except private dwellings.

It is provided by section 352, Laws of 1882, that "all expenses of meters, their connections and setting, water rates, and other lawful charges for the supply of Croton water, shall be a lien upon the premises where such water is supplied, as now provided by law."

All manufacturing and other business requiring a large supply of water will be fitted with a meter.

Water measured by meter, ten cents per one hundred cubic feet.

The rate charged for steam-vessels taking water daily or belonging to daily lines, is one-half cent per ton (Custom House measurement) for each time they take water.

Steamers taking water other than daily, one cent per ton (Custom House measurement).

Water supplied to sailing vessels and put on board, twenty-five cents per hundred gallons.

All matters not hereinbefore embraced are reserved for special contract by and with the Commissioner of Public Works.

HYDRANTS, HOSE, TROUGHS, FOUNTAINS, ETC., ETC.

No owner or tenant will be allowed to supply water to another person or persons.

All persons taking water from the City must keep their own service-pipes, street tap, and all fixtures connected therewith, in good repair, protected from frost, at their own risk and expense, and shall prevent all waste of water.

The use of hose to wash coaches, omnibuses, wagons, railway cars or other vehicles or horses, cannot be permitted.

No horse-troughs or horse-watering fixtures will be permitted in the street or on the sidewalk, except upon a license or permit taken out for that purpose. All licenses or permits must be annually renewed on the first of May. Such fixtures must be kept in good order and the water not allowed to drip or waste by overrunning the sidewalk or street, or to become dangerous in winter by freezing in and about such troughs or fixtures.

No hydrant will be permitted on the sidewalk or in the front area, and any hydrant standing in a yard or alley, attached to any dwelling or building, must not be left running when not in actual use, and if the drip or waste from such hydrant freezes and becomes dangerous in winter, the supply will be shut off in addition to the penalty of five dollars imposed.

Taps at wash-basins, water-closets, baths and urinals must not be left running, under the penalty of five dollars for each offense, which will be strictly enforced.

Fountains or jets in hotels, porter-houses, eating-salons, confectioneries or other buildings are strictly prohibited.

The use of hose for washing sidewalks, stoops, areas, house-fronts, yards, court-yards, gardens, and about stables, is prohibited. Where premises are provided with wells, special permits will be issued for the use of hose, in order that the police or inspectors of this department may understand that the permission is not for the use of Croton water.

Opening fire-hydrants to fill hand sprinklers or other vessels will not be allowed.

The penalty for a violation of any of the preceding rules and regulations will be five dollars for each offense, and if not paid when imposed will become a lien on the premises in like manner as all other charges for unpaid water rates.

PUBLIC NOTICE AS TO WATER RATES

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT in compliance with the provisions of chapter 559, Laws of 1887, amending sections 305 and 321 of the New York City Consolidation Act of 1882, passed June 9, 1887, the following changes are made in charging and collecting water rates:

1st. All extra charges for water incurred from and after June 9, 1887, shall be treated, collected and returned in arrears in the same manner as regular rents have heretofore been treated.

2d. In every building where a water meter or meters are now, or shall hereafter be in use, the charge for water by meter measurement shall be the only charge against such building, or such part thereof as is supplied through meter.

3d. The returns of arrears of water rents, including the year 1887, shall be made as heretofore on the confirmation of the tax levy by the Board of Aldermen, and shall include all charges and penalties of every nature.

4th. A penalty of five dollars (\$5) is hereby established, and will be imposed in each and every case where the rules and regulations of the Department prohibiting the use of water through hose, or in any other wasteful manner, are violated, and such penalties will be entered on the books of the Bureau against the respective buildings or property, and, if not collected, be returned in arrears in like manner as other charges for water.

5th. Charges for so-called extra water rents of every nature, imposed or incurred prior to June 9, 1887, will be canceled of record on the books of the Department.

NOTICE TO CROTON WATER CONSUMERS.

NUMEROUS APPLICATIONS HAVE BEEN made to this Department by citizens claiming deduction or rebate on bills for water supplied through meters, on the alleged ground of leakage caused by defective plumbing and worn-out service pipes, or by willful waste of water by tenants allowing the faucets to be turned on in full force in water-closets, sinks, etc., without the knowledge or consent of the owners of the premises.

The main object of the use of water-meters is to enable this Department to detect and check the useless and unprofitable waste of an element so valuable and essential to the health and comfort of all the citizens, and this object can only be accomplished by enforcing payment for the water wasted.

Under the law all charges for water supplied through meters are a lien against the respective premises, and the law therefore holds the owner of the premises responsible for the amount of water used or wasted.

Notice is therefore given to all householders that, in all further applications for reduction of water rents, no allowance will be made on account of waste of water occurring through leaks, from defective service pipes or plumbing, or wasteful use of water by tenants or occupants of buildings, though such leakage or waste may have occurred without the knowledge or consent of the owners of the buildings.

House-owners are further notified that whenever their premises become vacant, and are likely to remain vacant, they must notify this Department in writing, and that unless this requirement is complied with no deductions in extra water rents will be allowed for any portion of one year.

ESTIMATES FOR THE ABOVE WILL BE RECEIVED at the office of the Commissioner of Public Works, No. 31 Chambers street, in the City of New York, until 12 o'clock M. of WEDNESDAY, MAY 9, 1888, at which place and time they will be publicly opened by said Commissioner and read.

Any person making an estimate for the above shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed "Estimate for Furnishing, Operating and Maintaining Electric Lamps"; and also with the name of the person making the same, and the date of its presentation.

Bidders are required to state in their estimates their names and places of residence, the names of all persons interested with them therein, and if no other person be so interested, they shall distinctly state the fact; also, that it is

made without any connection with any other person making any estimate for the same supplies and work, and that it is in all respects fair, and without collusion or fraud; and also, that no member of the Common Council, head of a Department, Chief of a Bureau, Deputy thereof, or Clerk therein, or other officer of the Corporation, is directly or indirectly interested therein, or in the supplies or work to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof; which estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party making the same, that the several matters stated therein are in all respects true. Where more than one person is interested, it is required that the verification be made and subscribed by all the parties interested.

Each estimate shall be accompanied by the consent, in writing, of two householders or freeholders of the City of New York, with their respective places of business or residence, to the effect that if the contract be awarded to the person or persons making the bid or estimate, they will, on its being so awarded, become bound as his or their sureties for its faithful performance; and that if he or they shall omit or refuse to execute the same, they will pay to the Corporation any difference between the sum to which he or they would be entitled upon its completion, and that which the Corporation may be obliged to pay to the person to whom the contract may be awarded at any subsequent letting; the amount in each case to be calculated upon the estimated amount of the work by which the bids are tested. The consent above mentioned shall be accompanied by the oath or affirmation, in writing, of each of the persons signing the same, that he is a householder or freeholder in the City of New York, and is worth the amount of security required for the completion of the contract, and stated in the proposals, over and above all his debts of every nature, and over and above his liabilities as bail, surety, and otherwise; that he has offered himself as a surety in good faith, and with an intention to execute the bond required by law.

Bidders are required to state in their estimates the district or several districts, avenues, piers, parks and public places, or parts of streets, avenues, piers, parks and public places in which they propose to perform the requirements herein contained, giving in detail the number of lamps which it is proposed to furnish for lighting each street, etc., and in case the district or any portion of the district which is contemplated in the bid, not lighted by the bidder with electric arc lamps at the time of the making of the bid, then a map or sketch showing clearly the proposed location of lamps, poles and connecting wires in such district must be submitted with the bid.

Bidders must state the kind or system of light they propose to furnish.

Bidders are required to state the price per night for each lamp at which they propose to furnish, operate and maintain a light in accordance with the requirements of the specifications and for the period mentioned in the agreement.

The bidders are required to write out the amount of their bids in their estimates, in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are required to state the number and locations of the central stations at which the electric current is to be generated, and what provision, if any, will be made against the accidental extinction of the lights on account of damage to the central station by fire.

The amount of security required is Twenty-five Thousand Dollars.

No estimate will be received or considered unless accompanied by either a certified check upon one of the State or National Banks, or a cashier's check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money to the amount of five per centum of the amount of the security required for the faithful performance of the contract. Such check or money must not be cashed or closed in the sealed envelope containing the estimate, but must be handed to the officer or clerk of the Department who has charge of the Estimate-book, and no estimate can be deposited in said box until such check or money has been examined by said officer or clerk and found to be correct. All such deposits, except that of the successful bidder, will be returned to the persons making the same within three days after the contract is awarded.

If the successful bidder neglects to execute the contract within five days after notice that the contract has been awarded to him, to execute the same, the amount of the deposit made by him shall be forfeited to the City of New York, and he shall be liable for damages for such neglect or refusal; but if he shall execute the contract within the time aforesaid, the amount of his deposit will be returned to him.

The award of any contract, if made, will be made as soon as practicable after the opening of the bids.

Should the person or persons to whom any contract is so awarded neglect or refuse to accept the contract within five days after written notice that the same has been awarded to his bid or estimate, or if he accept, but does not execute the contract and give the proper security, it may be reawarded and relet as provided by law and ordinance.

Bidders are informed that no deviation from the specifications will be allowed, unless a written permission shall have been previously obtained from the Mayor, Comptroller, and Commissioner of Public Works.

The right is also reserved, where an estimate is made containing bids for lamps in one or more streets, avenues, piers, parks or places, to accept from such estimate or bid so much thereof as may be the lowest as aforesaid. The contract for lamps in any particular street, avenue, pier, park or place, will be awarded, if awarded, to the lowest bidder per lamp in such particular street, avenue, pier, park or place.

The right is also reserved to regulate the number of lamps which may be erected at their location and disposition, in order to best illuminate the streets, parks or other public places for the lighting of which bids may be received. The right is also reserved to decline all estimates if deemed for the best interests of the City.

No estimate will be accepted from, or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to the Corporation upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as security or otherwise, upon any obligation to the Corporation.

If the estimate of any bidder shall include any streets or parts of streets, parks or public places not lighted by electric arc lamps, or not so lighted by the bidder at the time of the making of the bid, and a contract for furnishing, operating and maintaining lamps in such streets, or parts of streets, parks or public places shall be awarded to such bidder, in that case, thirty days from the date of the execution of such contract, and such further time as may be deemed reasonable by the Mayor, Comptroller and Commissioner of Public Works, shall be allowed to such bidder in which to erect poles and lamps and establish conducting wires, all of which shall be done at the expense of the party of the second part without expense to the City.

But no payment to such bidder, on account of any such lamps, will be made for the time so allowed, nor until the same shall have been established in complete working order, nor except for the time during which all the requirements herein mentioned shall have been fully performed.

The attention of bidders is called to the provisions of Specification 3 and paragraph F in the annexed form of agreement.

Bishop & Blakely to place and keep a stand for the sale of fruit on the sidewalk inside the stoop-line on the Seventh avenue front of building northeast corner of Seventh avenue and One Hundred and Twenty-fifth street, provided such stand shall not be an obstruction to the free use of the street by the public, nor exceed six feet long by four feet wide; such permission to continue only during the pleasure of the Common Council.
