

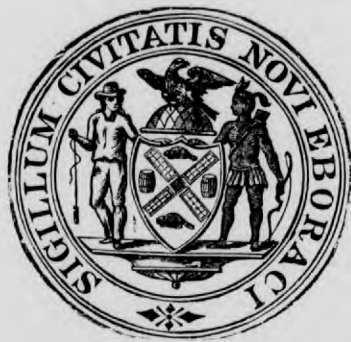

### BOARD OF STREET OPENING AND IMPROVEMENT.

The Board of Street Opening and Improvement met at the Mayor's office on Friday, November 15, 1889, at 2 o'clock P. M., pursuant to the following notice:

OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF STREET OPENING AND IMPROVEMENT,

SIR—You are respectfully requested to attend a regular meeting of the Board of Street Opening and Improvement of the City of New York, to be held in the Mayor's office, in the City Hall, on Friday, November 15, 1889, at 2 o'clock P. M., at which it is proposed to consider unfinished business with such other matters as may be brought before the Board.

The roll was called and all the members were present and answered to their names.  
The minutes of the meeting of November 8, 1889, were read and approved.

The Secretary presented and read the following report relative to the extension and widening of College place and Greenwich street:

OFFICE OF THE  
BOARD OF STREET OPENING AND IMPROVEMENT.

To the Board of Street Opening and Improvement of the City of New York:

SIRS—I have to report that on the 20th day of October, 1889, at the office of the Clerk of the Board of Aldermen, at the City Hall, in the City of New York, I have caused to be delivered to the Clerk of said Board, and left with him copies of resolutions adopted by this Board on the 18th day of October, 1889, copies of said resolution being hereto annexed. They provide for the altering of the map or plan of the City of New York, by laying out, widening and extending of College place and Greenwich street, from Chambers street to Dey street. I do also report that I caused to be published in the CITY RECORD the notice required by law, a copy of which, together with the proof of the publication thereof, is hereto annexed.

Whereas, At a meeting of the Board of Street Opening and Improvement of the City of New York, held on October 18, 1889, the following resolutions were adopted by said Board:

Resolved, That the Board of Street Opening and Improvement of the City of New York, deeming it for the public interest so to do, propose to alter the map or plan of the City of New York, by laying out, opening and extending College place and Greenwich street, from Chambers street to Dey street. The same is more particularly bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the southerly line of Chambers street, said point being 90 feet westerly from the southeasterly corner of Chambers street and College place; thence southerly and parallel to the easterly line of College place, distance 176 feet 3 inches, to the northerly line of Warren street; thence easterly along the northerly line of Warren street, distance 25 feet  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch, to the westerly line of College place; thence northerly along said line, distance 176 feet 3 inches, to the southerly line of Chambers street; thence westerly along said line, distance 25 feet, to the point or place of beginning.

Also, beginning at a point in the southerly line of Warren street, said point being 90 feet westerly from the southeasterly corner of Warren street and College place; thence southerly and parallel to the easterly line of College place, distance 175 feet  $11\frac{1}{4}$  inches, to the northerly line of Murray street; thence easterly along said line, distance 25 feet 7 inches, to the westerly line of College place; thence northerly along said line, distance 175 feet  $11\frac{1}{4}$  inches, to the southerly line of Warren street; thence westerly along said line, distance 25 feet  $7\frac{1}{2}$  inches, to the point or place of beginning.

Also, beginning at a point in the southerly line of Murray street, said point being 80 feet westerly from the southeasterly corner of Murray street and College place; thence southerly and parallel to the easterly line of College place, distance 165 feet  $4\frac{1}{4}$  inches, to the northerly line of Park place; thence easterly along said line, distance 25 feet  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch, to the westerly line of College place; thence northerly along said line, distance 165 feet  $4\frac{1}{4}$  inches, to the southerly line of Murray street; thence westerly along said line, distance 25 feet  $7\frac{1}{2}$  inches, to the point or place of beginning.

Also, beginning at a point in the southerly line of Park place, said point being 80 feet from the southeasterly corner of Park place and College place, thence southerly and parallel with the easterly line of College place, distance 158 feet 9 inches, to the northerly line of Barclay street; thence easterly along said line, distance 25 feet  $1\frac{1}{4}$  inches, to the westerly line of College place; thence northerly along said line, distance 158 feet 9 inches, to the southerly line of Park place; thence westerly along said line, distance 25 feet  $2\frac{1}{4}$  inches, to the point or place of beginning.

Also, beginning at a point in the southerly line of Barclay street, said point being distant 193 feet 1 inch easterly from the southeasterly corner of Greenwich street and Barclay street; thence southwesterly, distance 208 feet 9 inches, to the northerly line of Vesey street; thence westerly along the northerly line of said street, distance 78 feet 3 inches, to the easterly line of Greenwich street; thence northerly along said line, distance 26 feet  $1\frac{3}{4}$  inches; thence easterly, distance 10 feet  $5\frac{1}{2}$  inches; thence northeasterly and parallel to the first course given above, and distant 80 feet westerly therefrom, distance 183 feet  $6\frac{1}{4}$  inches, to the southerly line of Barclay street; thence easterly along said line 81 feet 8 inches, to the point or place of beginning.

Also, beginning at a point in the southerly line of Vesey street, said point being distant 454 feet  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches westerly from the southwesterly corner of Church street and Vesey street; thence southerly, distance 166 feet 7 inches, to the northerly line of Fulton street; thence westerly along said line, distance 10 feet  $7\frac{1}{2}$  inches, to the easterly line of Greenwich street; thence northerly along said line, distance 175 feet  $2\frac{3}{4}$  inches, to the southerly line of Vesey street; thence easterly along said line 46 feet 1 inch to the point or place of beginning.

Also, beginning at a point in the southerly line of Fulton street, said point being distant 170 feet 6 inches easterly from the easterly line of Washington street; thence southerly, distance 133 feet  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches to the northerly line of Dey street; thence easterly along the northerly line of said street, distance 58 feet 1 inch to the westerly line of Greenwich street; thence northerly along said line, distance 140 feet 4 inches to the southerly line of Fulton street; thence westerly along said line 10 feet 7 inches, to the point or place of beginning.

Resolved, That such proposed action of this Board be laid before the Board of Aldermen of the City of New York, and that full notice of the same be published for ten days in the CITY RECORD.

Resolved, That the Secretary be and he is hereby directed to transmit to the Board of Aldermen a copy of the foregoing resolution, and to cause to be published the notice required by law.

And Whereas, Said proposed action of the said Board of Street Opening and Improvement has been duly laid before the Board of Aldermen of the City of New York and full notice of the same has been published for ten days in the CITY RECORD, as appears by the report of the Secretary of this Board and the papers thereto attached; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Board of Street Opening and Improvement of the City of New York, deeming it for the public interest to alter the map or plan of the City of New York by laying out, widening and extending College place and Greenwich street, from Chambers street to Dey street, as follows, viz.:

Beginning at a point in the southerly line of Chambers street, said point being 90 feet westerly from the southeasterly corner of Chambers street and College place; thence southerly and parallel to the easterly line of College place, distance 176 feet 3 inches, to the northerly line of Warren street; thence easterly along the northerly line of Warren street, distance 25 feet  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch, to the westerly line of College place; thence northerly along said line, distance 176 feet 3 inches, to the southerly line of Chambers street; thence westerly along said line, distance 25 feet, to the point or place of beginning.

Also, beginning at a point in the southerly line of Warren street, said point being 90 feet westerly from the southeasterly corner of Warren street and College place; thence southerly and parallel to the easterly line of College place, distance 175 feet  $11\frac{1}{4}$  inches, to the northerly line of Murray street; thence easterly along said line, distance 25 feet 7 inches, to the westerly line of College place; thence northerly along said line, distance 175 feet  $11\frac{1}{4}$  inches, to the southerly line of Warren street; thence westerly along said line, distance 25 feet  $7\frac{1}{2}$  inches, to the point or place of beginning.

Also, beginning at a point in the southerly line of Murray street, said point being 80 feet westerly from the southeasterly corner of Murray street and College place; thence southerly and parallel to the easterly line of College place, distance 165 feet  $4\frac{1}{4}$  inches, to the northerly line of Park place; thence easterly along said line, distance 25 feet  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch, to the westerly line of College place; thence northerly along said line, distance 165 feet  $4\frac{1}{4}$  inches, to the southerly line of Murray street; thence westerly along said line, distance 25 feet  $7\frac{1}{2}$  inches, to the point or place of beginning.

Also, beginning at a point in the southerly line of Park place, said point being 80 feet from the southeasterly corner of Park place and College place, thence southerly and parallel with the easterly line of College place, distance 158 feet 9 inches, to the northerly line of Barclay street; thence easterly along said line, distance 25 feet  $1\frac{1}{4}$  inches to the westerly line of College place; thence northerly along said line, distance 158 feet 9 inches, to the southerly line of Park place; thence westerly along said line, distance 25 feet  $2\frac{1}{4}$  inches, to the point or place of beginning.

Also, beginning at a point in the southerly line of Barclay street, said point being distant 193 feet 1 inch easterly from the southeasterly corner of Greenwich street and Barclay street; thence southwesterly, distance 208 feet 9 inches, to the northerly line of Vesey street; thence westerly along the northerly line of said street, distance 78 feet 3 inches, to the easterly line of Greenwich street; thence northerly along said line, distance 26 feet  $1\frac{3}{4}$  inches; thence easterly, distance 10 feet  $5\frac{1}{2}$  inches; thence northeasterly and parallel to the first course given above, and distant 80 feet westerly therefrom, distance 183 feet  $6\frac{1}{4}$  inches, to the southerly line of Barclay street; thence easterly along said line 81 feet 8 inches to the point or place of beginning.

Also, beginning at a point in the southerly line of Vesey street, said point being distant 454 feet  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches westerly from the southwesterly corner of Church street and Vesey street; thence southerly, distance 166 feet 7 inches, to the northerly line of Fulton street; thence westerly along said line, distance 10 feet  $7\frac{1}{2}$  inches, to the easterly line of Greenwich street; thence northerly along said line, distance 175 feet  $2\frac{3}{4}$  inches, to the southerly line of Vesey street; thence easterly along said line 46 feet 1 inch to the point or place of beginning.

Also, beginning at a point in the southerly line of Fulton street, said point being distant 170 feet 6 inches easterly from the easterly line of Washington street; thence southerly, distance 133 feet  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches, to the northerly line of Dey street; thence easterly along the northerly line of said street, distance 58 feet 1 inch, to the westerly line of Greenwich street; thence northerly along said line, distance 140 feet 4 inches, to the southerly line of Fulton street; thence westerly along said line 10 feet 7 inches, to the point or place of beginning.

Does hereby alter the map or plan of the City of New York by laying out, widening and extending College place and Greenwich street, from Chambers street to Dey street, as aforesaid, and does hereby lay out, widen and extend the same and establish the grades thereof as aforesaid.

Resolved, That the Board of Street Opening and Improvement of the City of New York does now proceed to certify two similar maps showing College place and Greenwich street as laid out, widened and extended as aforesaid, and that the Secretary of this Board be and he is hereby directed to file one of said maps so certified in the office of the Department of Public Works of the City of New York, and one in the office of the Counsel to the Corporation.

Resolved, That this Board, deeming it for the public interest so to do, hereby respectfully requests the Counsel to the Corporation to take the necessary proceedings, in the name of the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of New York, to acquire title, wherever the same has not been heretofore acquired, for the use of the public, to the lands required for the opening, widening and extension of College place and Greenwich street, and hereby determines that one-third of the cost and expense of said proceeding be assessed upon the city at large and two-thirds upon the property deemed to be benefited thereby.

Resolved, That the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment be respectfully recommended to impose upon such railroad companies, whose lines extend through College place, a due and proper share of the assessment to be laid in consequence of said widening.

Which were adopted by the following vote:

Affirmative—The Mayor, the Comptroller, the Commissioner of Public Works, the President of the Department of Public Parks, the President of the Board of Aldermen—5.

In the matter of the area of High Bridge Park, the public hearing was declared closed. Several briefs and communications on the subject were presented, all of which were referred to the Committee of the Board appointed at the meeting of October 4 last, consisting of the Comptroller and the Commissioner of Public Works.

The following communication from the Counsel to the Corporation, transmitting petition to Supreme Court for the signatures of the members of the Board, in the matter of the opening of Railroad avenue, West.

CITY OF NEW YORK—DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC PARKS,

To the Honorable the Board of Street Opening and Improvement:

GENTLEMEN—The undersigned, to whom was referred the petition of P. V. Murray and others for the opening of Wales avenue, from Kelly to St. Joseph street, would state that he has fully investigated the matter and reports, as follows:

The avenue is designated as a street of the first class and is about 4,100 feet in length, and is so located and improvements in the vicinity are of such a character that for the benefit of the public it should undoubtedly be opened. The present application, however, is to open but a portion of the street, namely, from Kelly to St. Joseph street, a distance of some 2,300 feet. The street as laid down on the map extends beyond St. Joseph street to the Southern Boulevard, a distance of about 1,000 feet, which portion of the street is now enclosed and occupied by the owners, and a large house is standing on the premises immediately facing Wales avenue as at present used. The portion of the street which it is proposed to open has, I am informed, been used by the public as a highway for more than twenty years and the owners thereon (who are the petitioners in this matter) are of the opinion that in justice to themselves only that portion of the street should now be opened which has been so used by the public, as the award to them as owners would be a merely nominal one. That portion of the proposed avenue from St. Joseph street to the Southern Boulevard would be very difficult and expensive to construct, which work is apt to closely follow upon the legal opening. Considerable rock cutting would have to be done and heavy grades filled which would impose undoubtedly a large assessment upon the property on the whole line should it be opened at one time. It is therefore a question whether this burden under the circumstances should be at this time imposed upon the owners whose property has been thus used as a public highway for years past.

SIR—I have the honor to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 10th instant, inclosing petition of the estate of John McConville for the opening of Beach avenue, from East One Hundred and Forty-ninth street to Kelly street.

Beach avenue is a street of the first class, extending from the Southern Boulevard to Westchester avenue, a distance of 3,000 feet. It is legally opened from Kelly street to Westchester avenue, a distance of 880 feet, leaving 2,120 feet to be opened from the Southern Boulevard to Kelly street. The petitioner appears to be the owner of about one-third of the frontage, and, as the avenue should be opened for drainage and sewerage purposes, it is recommended that the prayer of the petitioner be granted, and the necessary resolution for the opening from the Southern Boulevard to Kelly street is forwarded herewith.

SIR—I have the honor to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 10th instant, inclosing petition of Philip Dater, Jr., executor, for the opening of Union avenue, from East One Hundred and Fifty-sixth street to Westchester avenue.

Union avenue is a street of the first class, and extends from the Southern Boulevard to the Boston road, a distance of 7,800 feet, or nearly a mile and a half. It is legally opened from the Southern Boulevard to East One Hundred and Fifty-sixth street, a distance of 2,450 feet, leaving 5,350 feet, or over one mile still to be opened, from East One Hundred and Fifty-sixth street to the Boston road, which should be opened in one proceeding. The portion asked to be opened between One Hundred and Fifty-sixth street and Westchester avenue is 320 feet in length. In case the Board should favor the opening of the avenue, notwithstanding that it is over a mile in length, the petition would have to be returned to get the signatures of as many owners of frontage as the Board may deem proper.

SIR—I have the honor to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 10th instant, inclosing petition of Bryan Duffy and others, for the opening of East One Hundred and Sixty-third street, between Brook avenue and Courtland avenue.

One Hundred and Sixty-third street is now a street of the first class, extending from Sheridan avenue to Prospect avenue, a distance of 5,450 feet, or over one mile. It is legally opened between Brook avenue and Third avenue, a distance of 607 feet, leaving 4,843 feet to be opened. On August 3, 1888, proceedings were ordered to be taken to open this street between Courtland avenue and Third avenue. As all the unopened portion should be included in one proceeding, I forward a resolution to amend the resolution adopted August 3, 1888, so as to open the street from Sheridan avenue to Railroad avenue, West; from Courtland to Brook avenue, and from Third avenue to Prospect avenue.

SIR—I have the honor to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 10th instant, inclosing extract from the minutes of the Board of Education, copy of a resolution of that Board requesting the opening of Ogden avenue, from Orchard street to Wolf street, and also to further the proceedings already begun to open East One Hundred and Fifty-seventh street, in order that school-houses, about to be erected, may have sewer connections as required by the Board of Health.

First—As to Ogden avenue. This avenue is designated as a street of the first class from Jerome avenue to "Orchard street," a distance of 4,150 feet; and of the third class from "Orchard street" to Aqueduct avenue, a distance of 1,500 feet. The entire length, including both classes, is 5,650 feet. No petition has been presented for opening any portion of the avenue. I forward a resolution to open the first-class portion from Jerome avenue to "Orchard street," which includes the portion referred to in the resolution of the Board of Education and which is required to be opened for the very urgent reasons stated in the preamble. As to whether any portion of the damages and expenses of opening any section of a street which has been divided into different classes must be borne by the City, I enclose an opinion of the Counsel to the Corporation on that subject, dated April 24, 1886.

Second—With regard to furthering the proceedings already begun in the matter of opening East One Hundred and Fifty-seventh street, I have to state that the last map requested in the proceeding to open that street from Railroad avenue, East, to Third avenue—the draft damage map—was forwarded May 29, 1888. The matter of urging forward the proceedings should be referred to the Corporation Counsel.

#### TO OWNERS OF LANDS ORIGINALLY ACQUIRED BY WATER GRANTS.

The act further provides that the owner of any such lot may notify the Commissioner of Public Works, in writing, specifying the ward number and street number of the lot, that he desires, for himself, his heirs and assigns, to be released from the obligation of such covenants, and elects and agrees that said lot shall be thereafter liable to be assessed as above provided, and thereupon the owner of such lot, his heirs and assigns shall thereupon be relieved from any obligation to pave, repair, uphold or maintain said street, and the lot in respect of which such notice was given shall be liable to assessment accordingly.

The Commissioner of Public Works desires to give the following explanation of the operation of this act: When notice, as above described, is given to the Commissioner of Public Works, the owner of the lot or lots therein described, and his heirs and assigns, are forever released from all obligation under the grant in respect to paving, repaving or repairing the street in front of or adjacent to said lot or lots, except one assessment for such paving, repaving or repairs, as the Common Council may, by ordinance, direct to be made thereafter.

No street or avenue within the limits of such grants can be paved, repaved or repaired until said work is authorized by ordinance of the Common Council, and when the owners of such lots desire their streets to be paved, repaved or repaired, they should state their desire and make their application to the Board of Aldermen and not to the Commissioner of Public Works, who has no authority in the matter until directed by ordinance of the Common Council to proceed with the pavement, repavement or repairs.

#### PUBLIC NOTICE AS TO WATER RATES.

**PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT** in compliance with the provisions of chapter 350 Laws of 1887, amending sections 350 and 921 of the New York City Consolidated Act of 1882, passed June 9, 1887, the following changes are made in charging and collecting water rents:

1st. All extra charges for water incurred from and after June 9, 1887, shall be treated, collected and returned in arrears in the same manner as regular rents have heretofore been treated.

2d. In every building where a water meter or meter are now, or shall hereafter be in use, the charge for water by meter measurement shall be the only charge against such building, or such part thereof as is supplied through meter.

3d. The returns of arrears of water rents, including the year 1887, shall be made as heretofore on the confirmation of the tax levy by the Board of Aldermen, and shall include all charges and penalties of every nature.

4th. A penalty of five dollars (\$5) is hereby established, and will be imposed in each and every case where the rules and regulations of the Department prohibiting the use of water through hose, or in any other wasteful manner, are violated, and such penalties will be entered on the books of the Bureau against the respective buildings or property, and, if not collected, be returned in arrears in like manner as other charges for water.

5th. Charges for so-called extra water rents of every nature, imposed or incurred prior to June 9, 1887, will be canceled of record on the books of the Department.

**REGULATIONS ESTABLISHING A SCALE OF WATER RENTS AND RULES GOVERNING THE USE OF WATER, FOR THE CITY OF NEW YORK, BY ORDER OF THOMAS F. GILROY, COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS.**

**UNDER CHAPTER 410, LAWS 1882, SECTIONS** 350, 351, 352 and 353, and as amended by chapter 559, Laws 1887, as follows:

"The commissioner of public works shall, from time to time, establish scales of rents for the supplying of water, which rents shall be collected in the manner now provided by law, and which shall be apportioned to different classes of buildings in said city in reference to their dimensions, values, exposure to fires, ordinary uses for dwellings, stores, shops, private stables and other common purposes, number of families or occupants, or consumption of water, as near as may be practicable, and modify, alter, amend and increase such scale from time to

time, and extend it to other descriptions of buildings and establishments. All extra charges for water shall be deemed to be included in the regular rents, and shall become a charge and lien upon the buildings upon which they are respectively imposed, and, if not paid, shall be returned as arrears to the clerk of arrears. Such regular rents, including the extra charges above mentioned, shall be collected from the owners or occupants of all such buildings respectively, which shall be situated upon lots adjoining any street or avenue in said city in which the distributing water-pipes are or may be laid, and from which they can be supplied with water. Said rents, including the extra charges aforesaid, shall become a charge and lien upon such houses and lots, respectively, as herein provided, but no charge whatever shall be made against any building in which a water-meter may have been, or shall be placed as provided in this act. In all such cases the charge for water shall be determined only by the quantity of water actually used as shown by said meters. \* \* \* \* \*

\* \* \* \* \* The said commissioner of public works is hereby authorized to prescribe a penalty not exceeding the sum of five dollars for each offense, for permitting water to be wasted, and for any violation of such reasonable rules as he may, from time to time, prescribe for the prevention of the waste of water; such fines shall be added to the regular water rents."

The regular annual rents to be collected by the Department of Public Works shall be as follows, to wit:

The rent of all tenements which shall exceed in width fifty feet shall be the subject of special contract with the Commissioner of Public Works.

The apportionment of the regular rents upon dwelling-houses are on the basis that but one family is to occupy the same, and for each additional family, one dollar per year shall be charged.

**METERS** will be placed on all houses where waste of water is found, and they will be charged at rates fixed by the Department for all the water passing through them.

The extra and miscellaneous rates shall be as follows, to wit:

**BAKES.**—For the average daily use of flour, for each barrel, three dollars per annum.

**BARBER SHOPS** shall be charged from five to twenty dollars per annum each in the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Works; an additional charge of five dollars per annum shall be made for each bathtub therein.

**BATHING TUBS** in private houses, beyond one, shall be charged at three dollars per annum each, and five dollars per annum each in public houses, boarding-houses, and bathing establishments. Combination stationary wash-tubs, having a movable division in the centre and capable of use for bathing, shall be charged the same as bathing tubs.

**BUILDING PURPOSES.**—For each one thousand bricks laid, or for stone-work—to be measured as brick—ten cents per thousand. For plastering, forty cents per hundred yards.

**COWS.**—For each and every cow, one dollar per annum.

**DINING SALOONS** shall be charged an annual rate of from five to twenty dollars, in the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Works.

**FISH STANDS** (retail) shall be charged five dollars per annum each.

For all stables not metered, the rates shall be as follows: **HORSES, PRIVATE.**—For two horses there shall be charged six dollars per annum; and for each additional horse, two dollars.

**HORSES, LIVERY.**—For each horse up to and not exceeding thirty in number, one dollar and fifty cents each per annum; and for each additional horse, one dollar.

**HORSES, OMNIBUS AND CART.**—For each horse, one dollar per annum.

**HORSE TROUGHS.**—For each trough, and for each half barrel or tub on sidewalk or street, twenty dollars per annum; each trough is to be fitted with a proper ball-cock to prevent waste.

**HOTELS AND BOARDING HOUSES** shall, in addition to the regular rate for private families, be charged for each lodging room, at the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Works.

**LAUNDRIES** shall be charged from eight to twenty dollars per annum, in the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Works.

**LIQUOR AND LAGER BEER SALOONS** shall be charged an annual rate of ten dollars each. An additional charge of five dollars per annum shall be made for each tap or wash-box.

**PHOTOGRAPH GALLERIES** shall be charged an annual rate of from five to twenty dollars, in the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Works.

**PRINTING OFFICES**, when not metered, shall be charged at such rates as may be determined by the Commissioner of Public Works.

**SODA, MINERAL WATER AND ROOT BEER FOUNTAINS** shall be charged five dollars per annum each.

**STEAM ENGINES**, where not metered, shall be charged by the horse-power, as follows: For each horse-power up to and not exceeding ten, the sum of ten dollars per annum; for each exceeding ten, and not over fifteen, the sum of seven dollars and fifty cents each; and for each horse-power over fifteen, the sum of five dollars.

**WATER-CLOSETS AND URINALS.**—To each building on a lot one water-closet having sewer connection is allowed without charge; each additional water-closet or urinal will be charged as hereinafter stated. All closets connected in any manner with sewer shall be charged two dollars for each seat per annum, whether in a building or on any other portion of the premises. Urinals shall be charged two dollars per annum each.

**WATER-CLOSET RATES.**—For hoppers of any form, when water is supplied direct from the Croton supply, through any form of the so-called single or double valves, hopper-cocks, stop-cocks, self-closing cocks, or any valve or cock of any description attached to the closet, each, per year, twenty dollars.

For any pan closet, or any of the forms of valve, plunger, or other water-closet not before mentioned, supplied with water as above described, per year, ten dollars.

For any form of hopper or water-closet, supplied from the ordinary style of cistern filled with ball-cock, and overflow pipe that communicates with the pipe to the water-closet, so that overflow will run into the hopper or water-closet, when ball-cock is defective, or from which an unlimited amount of water can be drawn by holding up the handle, per year, each, five dollars.

For any form of hopper or water-closet, supplied from any of the forms of waste-preventing cisterns, that are approved by the Engineer of the Croton Aqueduct, which are so constructed that not more than three gallons of water can be drawn at each lift of the handle, or depression of the seat, if such cisterns are provided with an overflow pipe, such overflow pipe must not connect with the water-closet, but be carried like a safe-waste, as provided by the Board of Health regulations, per year, two dollars.

Cistern answering this description can be seen at this Department.

#### METERS.

Under the provisions of section 352, Consolidated Act 1882, water-meters, of approved pattern, shall be hereafter placed on the pipes supplying all stores, workshops

hotels, manufactories, public edifices, at wharves, ferry-houses, stables, and in all places where water is furnished for business consumption, except private dwellings.

It is provided by section 352, Laws of 1882, that "all expenses of meters, their connections and setting, water rates, and other lawful charges for the supply of Croton water, shall be a lien upon the premises where such water is supplied, as now provided by law." \* \* \*

All manufacturing and other business requiring a large supply of water will be fitted with a meter.

Water measured by meter, ten cents per one hundred cubic feet.

The rate charged for steam-vessels taking water daily or belonging to daily lines, is one-half cent. per ton (Custom House measurement) for each time they take water.

Steamers taking water other than daily, one cent per ton (Custom House measurement).

Water supplied to sailing vessels and put on board, twenty-five cents per hundred gallons.

All matters not hereinbefore embraced are reserved for special contract by and with the Commissioner of Public Works.

HYDRANTS, HOSE, TROUGHS, FOUNTAINS, ETC., ETC.

No owner or tenant will be allowed to supply water to another person or persons.

All persons taking water from the City must keep their own service-pipes, street tap, and all fixtures connected therewith, in good repair, protected from frost, at their own risk and expense, and shall prevent all waste of water.

The use of hose to wash coaches, omnibuses, wagons, railway cars or other vehicles or horses, cannot be permitted.

No horse-troughs or horse-watering fixtures will be permitted in the street or on the sidewalk, except upon a license or permit taken out for that purpose. All licenses or permits must be annually renewed on the first of May. Such fixtures must be kept in good order and the water not allowed to drip or waste by overrunning the sidewalk or street, or to become dangerous in winter by freezing in and about such troughs or fixtures.

No hydrant will be permitted on the sidewalk or in the front area, and any hydrant standing in a yard or alley, attached to any dwelling or building, must not be left running when not in actual use, and if the drip or waste from such hydrant freezes and becomes dangerous in winter, the supply will be shut off in addition to the penalty of five dollars imposed.

Taps at wash-basins, water-closets, baths and urinals must not be left running, under the penalty of five dollars for each offense, which will be strictly enforced.

Fountains or jets in hotels, porter-houses, eating-saloons, confectioneries or other buildings are strictly prohibited.

The use of hose for washing sidewalks, stoops, areas, house-fronts, yards, court-yards, gardens, and about stables, is prohibited. Where premises are provided with wells, special permits will be issued for the use of hose, in order that the police or inspectors of this department may understand that the permission is not for the use of Croton water.

Opening fire-hydrants to fill hand sprinklers or other vessels will not be allowed.

The penalty for a violation of any of the preceding rules and regulations will be five dollars for each offense, and if not paid when imposed will become a lien on the premises in like manner as all other charges for unpaid water rates.

#### NOTICE TO CROTON WATER CONSUMERS.

**NUMEROUS APPLICATIONS HAVE BEEN** made to this Department by citizens claiming reductions or rebates on bills for water supplied through meters, on the alleged ground of leakage caused by defective plumbing and worn-out service pipes, or by willful waste of water by tenants allowing the faucets to be turned on in full force in water-closets, sinks, etc., without the knowledge or consent of the owners of the premises.

The main object of the use of water-meters is to enable this Department to detect and check the useless and unwarrantable waste of an element so valuable and essential to the health and comfort of all the citizens, and this object can only be accomplished by enforcing payment for the water wasted.

Under the law all charges for water supplied through meters are a lien against the respective premises, and the law therefore holds the owner of the premises responsible for the amount of water used or wasted.

Notice is therefore given to all householders that, in all further applications for reduction of water rents, no allowance will be made on account of waste of water occurring through leaks, from defective service pipes or plumbing, or wasteful use of water by tenants or occupants of buildings, though such leakage or waste may have occurred without the knowledge or consent of the owners of the buildings.

House-owners are further notified that whenever their premises become vacant, and are likely to remain vacant, they must notify this Department in writing, and that unless this requirement is complied with no deductions in extra water rents will be allowed for any portion of one year.

BOARD OF ARMORY COMMISSIONERS.

MAYOR'S OFFICE, CITY HALL,  
NEW YORK, November 12, 1889. }

A meeting of the Armory Board was held this day at 11 A. M. at the office of his Honor the Mayor.

Present—The Mayor, the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, and the Commissioner of the Public Works Department.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Secretary reported the receipt of a notice of a claim of Charles and Donato Romano, of No. 208 Sullivan street, against James D. Murphy, masonry contractor for the Twenty-second Regiment Armory, which was duly forwarded to the Comptroller.

An application was received from Isaac Hopper, the contractor for the Eighth Regiment Armory, for an extension of time in which to complete his contract. It was laid over.

A committee was appointed, consisting of Commissioner Coleman, Commissioner Gilroy and Brigadier-General Louis Fitzgerald, to examine the Eighth Regiment Armory, prior to accepting the Armory and making the last payment.

An application and affidavit were presented for the payment to P. K. Lantry of \$7,914.35, on account of his contract for carpenter work in the erection of an armory building for the Twenty-second Regiment.

A certificate from the architect, John P. Leo, was received, stating that materials and work have been received, entitling the contractor to that amount.

Commissioner Coleman offered the following:

Resolved, That the Comptroller be directed to pay to P. K. Lantry seven thousand nine hundred and fourteen dollars and thirty-five cents (\$7,914.35), the amount due him on this date, in accordance with the architect's certificate, and that a voucher for that amount be forwarded.

This resolution was adopted by the following vote, namely:

The Mayor, aye; the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, aye; the Commissioner of the Public Works Department, aye.

An application and affidavit were presented for the payment to James D. Murphy of \$10,200, on account of his contract for masonry work in the erection of an armory building for the Twenty-second Regiment.

A certificate from the architect, John P. Leo, was received, stating that materials and work have been furnished, entitling the contractor to that amount.

Commissioner Coleman offered the following:

Resolved, That the Comptroller be directed to pay to James D. Murphy ten thousand two hundred (10,200) dollars, the amount due him on this date, in accordance with the architect's certificate, and that a voucher for that amount be forwarded.

This resolution was adopted by the following vote, namely:

The Mayor, aye; the President of the Department of Taxes and Assessments, aye; the Commissioner of the Public Works Department, aye.

The application of Troop "A," Captain Charles F. Roe, for quarters, was considered. It was laid over until the next meeting.

The meeting then adjourned.

Resolved, That One Hundred and Seventh street, from Ninth to Tenth avenue, be regulated and graded, the curb-stones set and sidewalks flagged a space four feet wide through the centre thereof, under the direction of the Commissioner of Public Works; and that the accompanying ordinance therefor be adopted.
